No. F 4-1-2010-1-LV.—The State Government, hereby, makes the following rules relating to entrance to Post Graduate Medical (MD & MS) Course, Post Graduate Medical Diploma and Post Graduate Dental (MDS) Course in Private Unaided Medical and Dental Colleges in the State of Madhya Pradesh. These rules are subject to the final order to be passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in SLP (Civil) 13111/09 and other similar petitions which are under adjudication.

#### RULES

1. **Short title and Commencement.**—(1) These rules may be called the “Madhya Pradesh Private Medical and Dental Post Graduate Course Entrance Examination Rules, 2010”.

(2) They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the Madhya Pradesh Gazette and shall remain in force for the academic year, 2010.

2. **Definitions.**—In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires,—

- “Act” means Madhya Pradesh Niji Vyavsayik Shikshan Sanstha (Pravesh Ka Viniyaman Avam Shulk Ka Nirdharan) Adhiniyam, 2007 (No. 21 of 2007),
- “Board” means the Madhya Pradesh Professional Examination Board;
- “College” means **Private** Medical or a Dental College in the State of Madhya Pradesh;
- “Examination” means the Entrance Examination conducted by the Madhya Pradesh Professional Examination Board .
- “Other Backward Classes” means Other Backward Classes as specified and laid down by the Government of Madhya Pradesh;

- (f) "Scheduled Castes" means Scheduled castes as specified and laid down by the Government of Madhya Pradesh;
- (g) "Scheduled Tribes" means Scheduled Tribes as specified and laid down by the Government of Madhya Pradesh;
- (h) "Government" means Government of Madhya Pradesh;
- (i) "MCI" means Medical Council of India;
- (j) "DCI" means Dental Council of India;
- (k) "Admission and Fee Regulatory Committee" means the Committee constituted by the State Government under the Act for the supervision and guidance of admission process and for the fixation of fee to be charged from candidates seeking admission in a professional educational institution;
- (l) "Competent Authority" means any Authority as authorized by the State Government in this behalf;
- (m) "NRI" means Non-resident Indian shall have the same meaning as assigned to it in clause (e) or Section 115 C of the Income Tax Act, 1961 (43 of 1961)

3. **General.**—(1) PG Degree and Diploma courses will be governed and regulated by MCI / DCI / University / State Government / Government of India / College under the rules and regulations in force as amended from time to time at the time of entrance examination, allotment, admission, as the case may be;

(2) PG courses are full time courses for a period of three years in case of Degree and two years in case of Diploma from the date of admission. Students shall not be allowed to do private practice, part time job or any other job during the entire period of study.

(3) Correct information must be furnished and produced by the candidate whenever required. Before filling up the application form, candidates are advised to read and understand the rules thoroughly and fill up complete and correct required information and enclose required documents, failing which the applicants shall not be entitled to entrance examination, allotment and admission etc.

(4) If it is found that a candidate has hidden any relevant facts and / or provided incorrect information while filling up the application form at the time of allotment of a seat, at the time of scrutiny of the documents or at the time of his / her admission, then the admission shall be cancelled by the Dean / Principal of the College at any time during the course of his/her studies.

(5) Every candidate must abide by the admission rules of VYAPAM and he shall have to deposit the prescribed fee.

(6) All dispute related to admission to PG Courses shall be decided by the Director, Medical Education

4. (1) The Students shall be entitled to :—

- (a) One weekly off (non cumulative);
- (b) Casual leave for 19 days as per academic year.
- (c) Entitlement of Maternity leave without stipend during the entire tenure shall be 90 days with prior permission of the Dean/Principal. Medical certificate must be produced within ten days of proceeding on leave.

(2) As per Madhya Pradesh Government order No.147-4572-03-55-M.E.-1, Dated 14 January 04. Medical leave shall be 15 days per year without stipend with prior permission. Sickness Certificate has to be produced within 10 days after proceeding on leave.

5. Students found guilty of misconduct, indiscipline and unauthorized absence shall be liable to disciplinary action including expulsion from College by the Dean / Principal and cancellation of registration by the University.

6. The examination will be held at the centre fixed by the Board. A center once allotted will not be changed. The candidate shall abide by the rules and regulations of the Board failing which his/her candidature will be cancelled.

**7. Reservation.**—Institution shall be allowed to fill up to 15% of the Sanction Seats by NRI candidates only, in the manner prescribed by the admission and Fee Regulatory Committee before the Counselling. NRI Seats remaining vacant shall be merged into the Counselling .

20% Seats are reserved for candidates belonging to Scheduled tribes, 16% seats are reserved for candidates belonging to Scheduled castes and 14% seats are reserved for candidates belonging to other backward classes other than creamy layer of OBC of Madhya Pradesh or as amended from time to time.

- (1) Reservation for woman candidates shall be 30% according to merit cum option in each category.
- (2) The minimum percentage of marks in Pre P.G. entrance examination for eligibility for admission to Post Graduate Medical and Dental courses shall be 40% for SC / ST / OBC candidates and 50% for unreserved category candidates.
- (3) The candidate claiming to be a candidate belonging to SC / ST / OBC (Non Creamy) category of Madhya Pradesh shall have to attach a valid certified copy of certificate issued by the Competent Authority with the application form and the original certificate has to be produced at the time of counselling.
- (4) For Physically Handicapped persons who are bonafide residents of Madhya Pradesh and who belongs to ST, SC, OBC and Unreserved category, three percent (3%) seats are reserved for admission to P.G. courses.

The candidate claiming admission against these seats will have to produce a valid certificate, in the prescribed form from District Medical Board and eligibility certificate from superintendent vocational Rehabilitation Centre for Physically Handicapped, Government of India, Ministry of Labour, Napier Town, Jabalpur. However it will be governed by guideline framed by MCI.

Following disabilities are not eligible -

1. Upper limb Handicapped
2. Visual Handicapped
3. Hearing Handicapped
4. Lower limb more than 70% Handicapped

Candidates with locomotory disability of lower limbs between 50% to 70% on account of unavailability of candidates with locomotory disability of lower limbs between 50% to 70% then any such unfilled seats shall be filled up by persons with locomotory disability of lower limbs between 40% to 50%.

Certificate of eligibility should not be more than 3 months old at the time of counselling.

**8. Fee Structure .—(a) For MDS Courses**  
As will be decided by Fee regulatory Committee

(b) For MD/MS/ Courses  
As will be decided by Fee regulatory Committee

**9. SECURITY DEPOSIT :**  
As will be decided by Fee regulatory Committee

**10. Eligibility.—(1) The Candidate must be citizen of India**

AND

The candidate must have passed all MBBS/BDS Examinations from any recognized Medical / Dental College of India.

(2) (i) Eligible Candidate must have undertaken studies in an institution recognized by MCI / DCI.

(ii) Eligible Candidate must have completed compulsory internship from a MCI/ DCI recognized institution on or before 31.03.2010.



(3) The examination shall be of the standard of BDS examination and shall cover all subjects of BDS Course.

(4) The tentative number of question in each group of subject are as shown below :—

**SEATS AVAILABLE FOR MD/MS/MDS**

The distribution of seats for MDS/MD/MS Courses to be filled through Pre-PG 2010 as given in table enclosed subject to permission by DCI/MCI/Government of India.

13. **Declaration of Result.**—The Board will conduct the examination, evaluate the answer sheets, prepare the merit list and declare the result. The allotment of a seat to eligible candidate in subject / course / college will be done by counselling on merit cum option basis. Counselling will be done by counselling committee.

14. (1) **Merit List.**— (a) A merit list will be declared which will consist of all successful candidates, who have scored not less than 50% marks in Un reserved category and 40% marks in reserved category.

- (b) The Vyapam will prepare a separate merit list inclusive of all category (UR/ST/SC/OBC) candidates including physically handicapped. In all the category wise lists physically handicapped, will also be included according to their merit
- (c) Merit lists of physically handicapped candidates will also be prepared categorywise.
- (d) There will be no Waiting List.

(2) **Inter-Se-Merit.**—In case two or more candidates obtaining equal marks in the entrance examination, the merit will be decided as per procedure indicated below,—

- (a) A Candidate, who scores more marks in Part “B” of the question paper will be kept higher in merit.

- (b) Candidates scoring equal marks even in part "B" of the question paper, then candidate older in age will be placed higher in inter se merit of such candidates.

15. **Counselling :** (1) The allotment of seats shall be made to the candidates through counselling on personal appearance.

The State Government shall constitute the counselling committee consist of the following , namely :-

(2) **The programme for counselling will be advertised in the leading newspapers of the State. Separate call letters will not be issued to the candidates.**

(3) In case of a candidate's inability to appear in person for the counselling, he / she can send his / her authorised representative with an undertaking and authority letter.

(4) The candidates or their representatives will travel for the counselling place at their own cost.

(5) Candidate or his/her representative will not be allowed to enter the area specified for the counselling without showing the PG 2010 EXAMINATION MARKSHEET.

(6) The candidate or his / her authorised representative without original documents, (as mentioned in proforma 6) along with a set of two attested photocopies of original documents, will not be eligible to participate in the counselling.

(7) The candidates or their authorised representatives will wait for their turn in order of merit. They will be called in small groups of 10-20 for scrutiny i.e. verification of original documents and if found eligible, shall further be permitted for the counselling, where they shall exercise their option for allotment of any one of the available seats, which will be final and the same will be allotted to them and the allotment letter will be issued on payment of Fee prescribed by Admission and Fee Regulatory Committee .

(8) If a Candidate or his/her representatives due to any unavoidable circumstances does not remain present on the date and time fixed for them for scrutiny of the documents and counselling, then such candidates, if they come afterwards, they will be considered only at the stage, where the counselling is progressing irrespective of their merit. They will be considered only if the counselling of their category is going on and allotment done before to other candidates on the basis of their merit will remain unchanged . This rule will be applicable to candidates of all categories.

(9) Counselling of candidates will be done according to following sequence category wise :-

- A. ST Category
- B. SC Category
- C. OBC Category
- D. Unreserved Category

In case the eligible candidates to the extent of reservations in any category not available, the vacant seats of that category will be filled up by making available to other categories as given below :—

- (a) The vacant seats of ST category shall be filled up by the eligible SC category candidates.
- (b) The vacant seats of SC category shall be filled up by eligible ST category candidates.
- (c) In case the eligible candidates to the extent of reservation in ST and SC categories are not available, the vacant seats shall be filled up by eligible OBC category candidates.
- (d) In case the eligible candidates are not available in these three reserved categories in the above manner, the vacant seats shall then be filled up by the eligible unreserved category candidates.

(10) (a) The candidate of reserve category has to produce permanent caste certificate issued by Competent Authority in prescribed Performa . In case of failure to do so the candidate will not be eligible for reservation. The candidate will be responsible for this lapse. Temporary cast certificate and cast certificate with expiry date will not be accepted.

(b) The candidate of reserve category shall have to produce income certificate of the current year compulsorily at the time of counselling.

(11) A candidate belonging to ST/SC/OBC category, whose name also appear in the merit list of unreserved category besides the merit list of his/her own reserved category will have an option during counselling to select the seat from reserved category or un-reserved category.

(12) If any candidate who does not wish to be admitted to any of the subjects/courses available at the time of her/his counselling, he/she may give "opt for waiting" option in writing, then his/her name will be placed in waiting list in order of merit. If any seat fall vacant on or before 31st May, 2010 in any Medical/Dental Colleges in any subject, the name of such candidate shall be considered on the basis of merit at the time of allotment of vacancies arising due to any reason for admission of the said category.

(13) Candidates who have been allotted a seat & College, will not be allowed to participate in any subsequent counselling and such candidates will not be called to participate in such subsequent counselling.

(14) Candidate who has been allotted a State seat in a private Dental of Medical Colleges of the State & if they have also opted for Government Autonomous Medical/Dental Colleges, their names will be struck off from the merit list of admission to Government Medical/Dental Colleges.

16. **Admission.**—Consequent upon a candidate's allotment for a subject, course and a college by counselling, he/she shall report his presence on the notified date and time to the Dean / Principal of the College concerned.

- (1) A candidate so admitted to a particular subject, course/category and college will not be entitled for any change on any ground.
- (2) No admission in P.G. course/subject/college will be made after 31 May, 2010 as per guidelines issued by MCI in pursuance of direction laid down by Hon'ble Supreme Court Judgment dated 11.09.02 MCI Vs. Madhu Singh & Others.
- (3) The academic session shall commence from 02.05.2010. Last date up to which students can be admitted against vacancies arising due to any reason shall be 31.05.2010.
- (4) **Fee refund** - As will be decided by the admission and Fee regulatory Committee.

18. **Interpretation of Rules.**— The State Government reserves the right to amend any rule and procedure for admission. In case of any dispute related to the interpretation of these rules and amendments relating to them, the decision of the State Government shall be final and binding on all concerned.
