TENDER NOTICE

Gwalior, the 7th January 2011

Tender notice for the supply of country spirit in sealed bottles in 50 districts of Madhya Pradesh.

No. 5 (1) 2011-50.—Sealed tenders (separate for each districts, to be mentioned in the tender) are invited from distillers of Madhya Pradesh for the grant of licence(s) under the provisions of the Madhya Pradesh Country Spirit Rules, 1995 to supply country spirit through bonded warehouses to the retail sale contractors in sealed bottles for a period commencing 1st April 2011 and ending 31st March 2012.

2.(i) The tenderer should be a distiller holding appropriate licence of Madhya Pradesh for distillery.

(ii) Every intending distiller is free to tender for any one or more supply districts. The supply area now shall be a district.

3. Tender(s) for supply district / districts will be considered on the basis of the following factors:—

- (i) **The rate quoted for supply.**—The rate quoted by a tenderer as compared to the rates quoted by other tenderers. In case of equality of lowest rates quoted by more than one tenderer, decision to consider one tender out of such tenders will be taken by draw of lots.
- (ii) **Performance or conduct if the tenderer held a similar licence in the past.**—While assessing past performance and conduct, regularity of liquor supplies to the area/areas earlier allocated would be taken into consideration.
- (iii) **Production capacity.**—Whether the tenderer is capable of supplying the required quantity of country spirit in the district / districts [for which tender(s) have been submitted] taking into account the production capacity of the distillery.

The decision to accept or reject a tender shall be taken on the basis of tender/tenders received in the light of the above and any other relevant factors. No negotiations will be held. It is also notified for the information of intending tenderers that tenders of a distiller in respect of only such number of districts may be considered of which the total estimated quantity of issues of country spirit for the year 2011-12 [arrived at by increasing the estimated issues during 2010-11 (estimated issues will be based upon actual updated average issues) by 5%] does not exceed two crore proof litre or 80 % of the production capacity of the distillery, whichever is less. The production capacity of the distillery will be the quantity mentioned in the D-1 licence. The successful tenderer shall be allowed to export rectified spirit or country spirit outside the state only after getting permission in this regard from the Excise Commissioner. The said permission shall be given only after ensuring that the export shall not affect the continuity of supply of country spirit to the state and that minimum stock of rectified spirit and bottled liquor as provided in Madhya Pradesh Country Spirit Rules, 1995, shall be maintained.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE TENDER

4. Every tenderer shall have to observe the following conditions amongst others:—

- (i) It is essential for the tenderer to purchase the tender document from this office and submit the rate in the format enclosed therein.
- (ii) The tenderer shall deposit along with the tender, earnest money amounting to Rs. Three lakhs only by crediting it in Government Treasury in Madhya Pradesh under the Major Head "8443-Civil Deposits", Minor head 'Revenue Deposits, Security deposits' for each supply district and attach the treasury challan with the tender. A bank draft issued by any branch of nationalized / scheduled bank in favour of the Excise Commissioner, Madhya Pradesh payable at Gwalior for an equal amount shall also be acceptable. A tender, which is not accompanied by a treasury challan or bank draft for Rs. Five lakhs for an area shall be summarily rejected. The earnest money deposit shall be forfeited if the tenderer, in the event of acceptance of his tender, fails to deposit security, when required to do so, or fails to accept the offer if made to him or if he is unable to carry out his contractual obligations, or fails to abide by condition no.10 of this notice. In case a tender is not accepted, the earnest money, if not liable to be forfeited, shall be refunded.
- (iii) The tender shall be accompanied by complete address of the tenderer and if the tenderer is a firm, copy of registration of the firm, latest partnership deed, abstract of Register of Firms issued by the Registrar of Firms and Societies and a list of all partners and their complete addresses; and if the tenderer is a company, copy of certificate of incorporation, memorandum and articles of association, a list of promoters with their shareholdings, a certified list of board of directors alongwith their complete addresses and the resolution passed by the board of directors to submit the tender and enter into an agreement, in case of finalization of tender with the Excise Commissioner of Madhya Pradesh.
- (iv) The licensee shall not hypothecate, sell, mortgage, transfer or sub-lease his licence in C.S.1 and/ or CS 1-B, or enter into partnership for the working of the said licences, without the previous permission in writing of the Excise Commissioner, which shall be endorsed on the licences.

5. The tender shall be accompanied by the following documents:—

- (i) Certified copy of distillery licences for the year 2010-11.
- (ii) No dues and credibility certificate regarding past performance with respect to production and supply of country spirit by the Excise Commissioner Madhya Pradesh.
- (iii) Certificate regarding actual annual production of spirit during the last five years (i.e. from 2005-06 to 2009-10) from the officer-in-charge of the distillery.

- (iv) An undertaking by the tenderer on an affidavit that the distiller has already installed or taken sufficient measures to install effluent treatment plant in the distillery and the distillery is not likely to be closed on the ground of absence or inadequacy of effluent treatment measures during the period of contract.

Note:—The prescribed formats are attached with the tender document.

6.(i) The successful tenderer shall transport rectified spirit from his distillery to its bottling unit and supply country spirit in the supply district / districts allotted to him through the storage warehouses listed in **Annexure-I**. The manufacturing and bottling of country spirit will be carried out at the bottling unit/units of the tenderer, which shall be located preferably in the distillery premises and/or anywhere else in Madhya Pradesh.

(ii) The successful tenderer shall make all such arrangements of manufacturing and bottling of country spirit as would be necessary to ensure that he is capable of supplying up to 1.5 times the estimated supply of the country spirit in that district / districts.

(iii) It will be the responsibility of the successful tenderer to arrange supplies of country spirit (manufactured using standard rectified spirit manufactured in his distillery) to the district / districts from the storage warehouses of the supply district / districts during the entire period of the contract.

(iv) The country spirit, bottles, labels and bottling caps should be of such good quality, standard pattern and specifications, as prescribed by the Excise Commissioner from time to time.

The country spirit shall be manufactured using rectified spirit by reducing, blending, essencing, colouring, flavouring, maturing, bottling, labeling, sealing etc. The successful tenderer shall dispatch rectified spirit from his distillery to his bottling unit. The rectified spirit shall be converted into the country spirit using the above procedure. He will sell only hygienic potable country spirit to the retailers and will ensure that it is fit for human consumption.

(v) The country spirit shall be bottled in glass and PET bottles of 750, 375 and 180 ml. capacity. The 750, 375 and 180 ml glass bottles shall be round in shape as earlier specified by the Excise Commissioner. The flat shape glass bottle of 180 ml introduced in the year 2009-10 shall also be allowed for bottling. The successful tenderer may use both, round as well as flat, type of 180ml glass bottle. The successful tenderer may use both round as well as flat PET bottles of 750, 375 and 180 ml capacity. The PET bottles should be odorless, clean and colourless and be made of 100% virgin material of food grade quality. The 750, 375 and 180 ml. capacity PET bottles shall have moulded on it the capacity of bottle. The bottles should be of good quality and automatically manufactured. The specification of the bottles shall be as prescribed by the Excise Commissioner.

The issue of country spirit shall be only in 3 ply strong corrugated boxes. 12 bottles of 750 ml., 24 bottles of 375 ml and 50 bottles of 180 ml. shall be packed in one corrugated box. The country spirit shall not be stored or issued in plastic crates.

(vi) The ratio of supply of country spirit in different sizes of glass bottles to the retail contractors in the area / areas is fixed as under :—

750 ml.	10
375 ml.	20
180 ml.	70

The above ratio means that every 100 proof liters of supply of country spirit to the retail contractor shall consist of 10 proof liters in glass bottles of 750 ml. size, 20 proof liters in glass bottles of 375 ml. size and 70 proof liters in glass bottles of 180 ml. sizes.

Provided that if the retailer demands, he will be supplied with country spirit of 25 degree under proof and 50 degree under proof in 180 ml in lieu of 750 ml. and/ or 375 ml. Bottles.

(vii) The ratio shown in clause number (vi) above may be changed at any time during the currency of the contract at the discretion of the Excise Commissioner.

(viii) The tenderer has to quote for one box of Masala 25 U.P. and one box of Plain 50 U.P. country spirit separately for glass and PET bottles. He will quote a single rate for a box containing 750,375 and 180 ml bottles. This entire price shall be paid by the retailer to the successful tenderer. The tenders will be evaluated on the basis of average rate quoted per box for Masala and Plain country spirit of glass and PET bottles. The successful tenderer will supply country spirit on his quoted rates.

(ix) Supply of country spirit for sale through the shops run departmentally by the Excise Department shall also be made on the above terms and conditions by the successful tenderer.

(x) Minimum and maximum selling prices are to be printed on each kind and size of labels as directed by the Excise Commissioner.

(xi) The successful tenderer will have to affix holograms on all sizes of the bottles of country spirit as prescribed by the Excise Commissioner on his own cost. No extra cost will be payable for this purpose.

(xii) The successful tenderer shall take care of fire safety and will arrange for sufficient fire fighting equipments in each of the bottling unit and warehouses. He will take care of hygiene and up keeping too of the bottling units and warehouses.

(xiii) The glass bottles which are used for bottling of country spirit should be compulsorily double washed and no dirty bottles will be permitted to be used. In any case, the old and pre used PET bottles shall not be used in bottling.

(xiv) The successful tenderer will not be under obligation to purchase old glass bottle from the retailers.

(xv) Workers engaged by the successful tenderer in the bottling units and storage warehouses should be engaged only after Police verification and no person with any criminal background will be employed in the bottling units and storage warehouses.

(xvi) Workers engaged in the bottling units and warehouses should be provided with uniforms in order to indentify them distinctly.

(xvii) Workers should also be provided with Identity Cards issued by the successful tenderer.

(xviii) Every successful tenderer should employ a Quality Control manager in each bottling unit who will be squarely responsible for the quality of the country spirit.

(xix) The water being used to manufacture country spirit should be used only after getting it tested and certified to be safe for human consumption by the Public Health Engineering Department at least once in a month. Besides the water should be used only after softening it.

(xx) The colour and essence used should be of food grade quality. The successful tenderer will have to produce certificate of the manufacturer of these items for every lot purchased and brought to the bottling unit by him.

(xxi) Three samples of every reduction will be collected and preserved for one month so that they can be tested in case of any complaint regarding the quality of the country spirit.

(xxii) Every bottling line should be washed regularly each time after completion as well as before start of a bottling session.

(xxiii) The labels of every size of masala and plain country spirit bottle shall be compulsorily got registered under rule 3-F of Madhya Pradesh Country Spirit Rules 1995.

(xxiv) Labels should be affixed on the liquor bottles in such a way that they will not come off while handling.

(xxv) Norms prescribed by the Food and Drug Administration and Bureau of Indian Standard should be adhered to while manufacturing country spirit.

(xxvi) Country spirit manufacturing bottling unit and warehouses should be properly lit as per prescribed standards.

(xxvii) Workers handling bottling of country spirit should invariably use hand gloves so that quality of country spirit is not adversely affected.

(xxviii) To measure the country spirit and rectified spirit, a flow meter, whose least count should not be more than one litre should be installed in each vat of manufacturing bottling unit.

(xxix) Proper GI pipelines should be used for transfer of spirit and water in manufacturing bottling unit. No rubber hoses will be permitted for transfer of spirit and the spirit shall not be manually transferred.

(xxx) The strength of rectified spirit meant for production of country spirit shall not be less than 66 degree over proof.

7. The actual issue of country spirit may exceed the estimated issue of country spirit for 2011-12. The tenderer shall bind himself to meet the full requirement of supply of plain and masala country spirit from the storage liquor warehouses(s) and also to establish and service manufacturing bottling unit as and when directed by the Excise Commissioner in accordance with Madhya Pradesh Country Spirit Rules, 1995 in respective district / districts.

The details about actual issues of spirit from warehouses attached to each district during the period from April 2010 to November 2010 are shown below for general information:—

8. (i) The successful tenderer will have to supply 50 degree under proof plain and 25 degree under proof spiced masala country spirit on the rate accepted/sanctioned by the Government and shall have no right to ask for revision of rates due to change in any levy, cost of raw material, export, import fee or any other taxation during the currency of the contract period.

(ii) The State Government shall have the right to extend the period of contract for such period not exceeding 6 months as may appear appropriate in the circumstances prevailing at the time of conclusion of the contract period on the same terms and conditions and the successful tenderer shall be bound to continue supply during the extended period.

(iii) The conditions of the licence for supply and rules applicable to such supply are subject to revision from time to time at the discretion of the State Government.

9. Successful tenderer shall have to pay the rent of the departmental / Government warehouse at such rate as may be fixed by the P.W.D. or State Government. In case of default, the rent shall be recoverable from the licensee. If a government building is not available, the successful tenderer will have to make his own arrangements for warehouse building.

10. If directed by the Excise Commissioner, the successful tenderer shall have to purchase the balance of country spirit at the rates applicable to the outgoing licensee.

11. (i) The successful tenderer, will have to deposit a security amount as mentioned in **Annexure II** in respect of each area (district). This amount shall be deposited in cash, or by means of a bank draft or bank guarantee valid up to 30.6.2012 issued by a branch of any nationalized or scheduled bank in favour of the Excise Commissioner, Madhya Pradesh payable at Gwalior.

(ii) The successful tenderer will have to submit 6 post dated cheques of nationalized / scheduled bank issued in favour of Excise Commissioner, Madhya Pradesh Gwalior, each for the amount equivalent to security amount mentioned in **Annexure II** as an additional security. The post dated cheques shall bear the first date of month starting from May 2011 to October 2011.

12. The successful tenderer shall have to submit an undertaking to pay the losses and compensation for damages to the State Government and retail contractors in case of failure or delay of supply of country spirit in his area (district). In such cases, the supply of country spirit would be ensured from an alternative source at his risk and cost. If there is pendency of challans for issue of country spirit due to inadequate supply of country spirit in a particular fortnight, the successful tenderer shall be treated as a defaulter. In case of more than one such continuous default it will be treated as continuous failure of supply. In such case of continuous failure of supply or other exigencies, the supply area of the successful tenderer may be detached and allotted to adjoining country spirit supplier (CS-1 licensee) whose rate is the lowest and whose capacity is not exhausted as per condition 3 of this tender. In exceptional cases where, at any point of time, the Excise Commissioner feels that the contract rate has become unviable due to unusual increase in the prices of raw material, coal etc. and it is not possible for any one of the supply contractor to supply country spirit at the existing rate, then fresh tenders may be invited for that area at the risk and cost of the defaulting supplier. The difference in price would have to be borne by the defaulting tenderer. The said losses, compensation and difference would be recoverable from the earnest money referred to in Para 4(ii), and security deposit referred in Para 11 of this tender. Any left over recovery would be recoverable as arrears of land revenue from the tenderer.

13. The tender shall be submitted in two separate sealed covers. The first sealed cover, said to be "Part One", shall contain documents / instruments detailed below and have superscribed part - one / documents/instruments for the eligibility for tender for the supply of country spirit in sealed glass bottles for (Name the district)." If a tenderer applies for more than one area (district) he is required to submit the documents mentioned in conditions 4 (iii) and 5, once only. The certificate / document / instrument to be enclosed are as follows:—

- (i) Earnest money deposit as per condition No.4 (ii)
- (ii) Details as per condition No. 4(iii)
- (iii) Certificates / documents as per condition No. 5

The second sealed cover said to be "Part Two," will be given only in prescribed form **Annexure- III** and submitted in double sealed cover and have superscribed "Part – Two : Rate Offer for the supply of country spirit in sealed glass bottle for (Name the district)". The word "sealed" means the envelope should be properly closed and pasted so that the papers inside the envelope are not readable without opening it.

Both the envelopes should be kept in one main sealed envelope and should reach the undersigned not later than 3.00 pm on 20.01.2011. The sealed envelope will be opened at 4.00 pm on the same day by the Excise Commissioner or an officer nominated by him. After opening the main sealed cover, the envelope "Part One" containing documents / instruments necessary for eligibility, shall be opened. On scrutinizing, if the Excise Commissioner is satisfied that the tenderer is eligible for submitting tender under this notice, only then the rate offer submitted in prescribed form in "Part Two" shall be opened.

14. The prescribed tender form can be obtained from the office of the undersigned on payment of Rs. 5000/- (Rs.five thousand only) for each form in cash or bank draft in favour of the Excise Commissioner, Madhya Pradesh, payable at Gwalior.

The tender forms can also be sent by post to the tenderer if so desired by him. The document will be dispatched through post office of the Department of Post, Government of India only after receipt of Rs. 5100/- (Rs.five thousand one hundred only) for each area, to be paid in the form of bank draft of any nationalized or scheduled bank drawn in favour of Excise Commissioner, Madhya Pradesh, payable at Gwalior. The department takes no responsibility for delay in receipt by the tenderer.

15. Submission of tender by a tenderer shall imply that he has read and understood the provisions of the Madhya Pradesh Excise Act, rules made there under specially Madhya Pradesh Country Spirit Rules, 1995, the detailed terms and conditions of the tender, The specifications of glass and PET bottles and the contents of the form of tender which shall be a legal binding on the tenderer.

16. These terms and conditions will be applicable in case of re-tendering too during the tender period 2011-2012.

17. Minor omissions in the tender form can be got corrected on the spot by the Excise Commissioner.

18. The State Government reserves the right to reject any or all tenders, without assigning any reason.

19. In case of disputes regarding interpretation of any terms and conditions of the tender, the view of the Excise Commissioner shall be final.

20. All legal disputes arising out of this tender shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the courts situated in Madhya Pradesh only.
