ORDINANCE NO 82 FOR M.D. (Hom.) Course

PART-I

GENERAL

1 Short title and commencement

- (i) This ordinance may be called the (Post Graduate Degree Course) M.D. (Hom.) Ordinance of Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan University, Bhopal.
- (ii) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the official Gazette.

2 Definitions: In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires:

- (a) "Course" means a course of study in the subjects referred to in subregulations (3) of regulation 3.
- (b) "M.D. (Hom)" means a post-graduate degree in (Doctor of Medicine in) as prescribed in (these regulations)
- (c) "Homeopathy College "means Homeopathic Medical College & Hospital "Post Graduation in " means Post Graduate qualifications in recognized as per the provisions of the Act
- (d) "Syllabus" and "curriculum" means the syllabus and curriculum for study as prescribed by the Centre Council under these regulations.
- (e) "Teaching experience" means teaching experience in the subject concerned in a College and includes teaching experience in the subjects of medicine Surgery, Obstetrics and Gynecology gained in a Medical College, recognized by the Medical council of India.

3 Subjects of Specialization for Post Graduation in:

- 1. The Specialties of Post Graduate Degree course in Homeopathy shall be in the subjects as mentioned in clause (a) of sub-regulation (3)
- 2. The Course shall be of three years' duration, including one year of house-job, during which the candidate shall be a resident in the campus and shall be given training as per the provisions of sub regulation (2) of regulation 10.

Provided that a candidate shall complete the course of M.D. (Hom) in a specialty subject within the duration of six years from the date of his admission.

- (3) Every candidates seeking admission to the Part –II of the examination shall submit a dissertation. The dissertation shall from the basis of viva-voce examination.

Provided that each candidate shall submit a synopsis of his dissertation within 12 months of his admission to the course to the university concerned through his guide (supervisor). In case of its rejection the candidates has to resubmit the synopsis to university concerned through his guide (supervisor) in any case three months clear of Part –I M.D. (Hom) examination.

- (b) The dissertation shall be submitted to the guide/supervisor at least three months before the time fixed for submitting it to the university and guide/ supervisor shall certify that the work has not previously formed the basis for award of any post graduate degree and that the work is the record of the candidate's personal efforts and submitted to the university duly countersigned by the guide/supervisor.

- 2. The student shall be declared pass if he /she gets minimum 50% marks each in theory and in practical/ clinical including viva-voce examination.
 - (ii) One practical / clinical examination including viva-voce, in the subject of specialty, to test the candidate's acumen and his ability and working knowledge in practice of specialty and there shall be four examiners together, including one supervisor (guide) in the subject, for examining the candidate.

Provided that all the four examiners shall jointly assess the knowledge of the candidate for recommending the result to the university as 'passed' or 'Failed'.

Provided that all the four examiners don't arrive at consensus in assessing a candidate than a decision taken by three of them shall be final.

(IV) The University shall give another chance to a failed student to reappear in examination within six months.

9 Requirements of Post Graduate Teaching Centre:-

- (i)A recognized homeopathic college shall be treated as P.G. centre which meets all the prescribed minimum requirements norms and standard for conducting B.H.M.S. degree course and has been B.H.M.S. degree course successfully for five consecutive five years at least.
- (ii)every such college or teaching hospital shall have a Department of the concerned specialty and shall also have the following additional facilities, with two teachers having at least one higher faculty namely;
- (a)One full time Professor or Reader in the department of specialty;
- (b)one full time Lecturer in the department of specialty;
- (c)Staff such as two assistants or attendants, in the Department of psychiatry and Pediatrics;
- (d)Outpatient Department (OPD) with minimum of 250 patients on an average per day during last calendar year in the hospital of a college whether running as a standalone M.D. (Hom) course or running along with BHMS Degree course.
- N.B. Calendar year for OPD purpose shall be taken as 300 working days out of 365/366 days of normal or leap year as the case may be.
- (e)One bed shall be earmarked per student for each clinical subject of specialty, in addition in addition to the beds required for BHMS course in its teaching (collegiate). Homeopathic hospital with 30% bed occupancy per day on an average in a calendar year.

FIVE YEAR INTEGRATED DUEL DEGREE PROGRAMME

- (i) After successfully completing 4 years the candidate will be eligible for a B.Tech. degree. After successful completion of five years (ten semesters) the candidate will be eligible for B.Tech.+MBA dual degree programme.
- (ii) Only those successful students will get B.Tech. degree who leave the programme after four years respectively.

3. MODE OF INSTRUCTIONS

Mode of instructions for the programme will be in English/Hindi in accordance with subject concerned.

4. ADMISSION AND ELIGIBILITY

The minimum qualifications for admissions to Integrated Degree programme shall be Higher Secondary Certificate or an equivalent examination with Physics, Mathematics, Chemistry, Biology or Computer Science from a recognized School Board like CBSE, ICSE, IB or State Boards with not less than 50% marks in the aggregate and for SC/ST/OBC and other categories candidates the minimum percentage for admission will be 45%.

To determine the merit for admission of such candidates who have secured equal marks in the qualifying examination, the percentage of marks secured by the candidate at the intermediate/UG or equivalent examination will be determining factor of merit for admission.

Candidates appearing for their final examination or equivalent are also eligible to apply for provisional admission; however their admission is subjected to their qualifying the examination with the required marks.

The prospective students will have to appear for a personal interview (PI) and a suitable weightage shall be given for (PI) along with their academic merit.

PART-IV

(PROCEDURE, RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR CONDUCTING **EXAMINATIONS, EVALUATION POLICY ETC.)**

Procedure, rules and regulations for conducting Examinations and its related activities for all programmes will be same as under:-

A. **CONDUCT OF EXAMINATIONS**

- 1. Question Paper (Setting and Moderation)
- 1.1 The Question Paper shall be set only in English language and normally by the faculty teaching the course except unless otherwise decided by the University. However in case of Journalism students the case may be as approved in the Board of Studies of the School concerned.
- The paper-setter shall be guided as to the scope of the subject of Examination 1.2 by the syllabus prescribed. The paper shall be so set that a student, fairly well prepared in the subject, can reasonably be expected to answer it within the time allotted. Questions in each subject shall be fairly distributed over the syllabus.
- 1.3 In case of a course taught by multiple faculties the following guidelines will be followed:

Wherever there are 2 faculty members involved each of the faculty will be responsible for 50% weightage of the evaluation in each of the components viz. Mid-Semester / Internal Assessment and End Semester and the question paper may be set in two sections viz. A and B.

In case where one of the faculty members is internal and the other is external the setting of the question paper and the evaluation will be coordinated by the internal faculty in charge and the weightage of their sections would be guided by the inputs given by each faculty member.

In case of a multi faculty taught course where more than 2 faculty members are involved to teach the course then either the Dean/Director/Head Of The School of the concerned program or faculty member nominated by Dean/Director/Head Of The School would act as the anchor of the course who would be responsible for all components of evaluation before handing it over to Student Record Section.

- 1.4 In order to effectively and fairly carry out the process of assessment and examinations at least 50% of core courses offered in different programmes across the disciplines, the assessment of the theoretical component towards the end of the semester may be undertaken by external examiners from outside the university conducting examination, who may be appointed by the competent authority. In such courses, the question papers will be set and may be assessed by external examiners.
- 1.5 The panel of External Examiners comprising of their personal and academic details (course-wise) shall be submitted in strict confidence to Controller of Examinations at least three months before the release of the Examination Time-Table.
- 1.6 The Paper-Setter shall, as far as practicable, avoid any marked change in standard of question paper from Examination to Student Record Section.
- 1.7 While the paper setter should have freedom and flexibility in setting the question paper, to ensure maintenance of the standard, quality and secrecy of the question paper all paper setters should get their question papers approved moderated by the Dean / Director / Head of the concerned School / Deptt. before sending the question paper to the Exam branch. Model answers should be deposited with Dean / Director / Head or should remain with the faculty.

2. Evaluation

2.1 The answer-scripts of a subject shall normally be evaluated by the Instructor – in charge or by an Evaluator to be appointed by the Dean / Director / Head of the School who could be a person other than the paper setter.

- 2.2 The evaluator so appointed shall evaluate the answer scripts and award marks for every question attempted in the answer script. After evaluation, the evaluator shall total all the marks in an answer script. If the total so arrived is not a whole number it shall be rounded off to the next higher whole number. The evaluator concerned would arrive at a scale for awarding various letter grades in that course. The grades awarded by the faculty would be discussed and finalized in consultation with the Examination Committee. The Examination Committee will have the authority to moderate the results submitted by the faculty members and also call for an explanation from the faculty, if desired.
- 2.3 The evaluator shall prepare the grade sheet providing following information:
 - The title and code of the paper and credits assigned;
 - The programme (s) whose students are being evaluated and the semester number;
 - Against each students' enrollment number/name
 - Internal Assessment (IA) marks obtained to 20%
 - o Internal Assessment 1 = 10% to be conducted before Mid-semester Test
 - o Internal Assessment 1 = 10% to be conducted after Mid-semester Test
 - Mid-semester Test (MST) marks obtained to 20% (School concerned will have to conduct the MST)
 - End-semester Examination (ESE) marks obtained to 60%
 - Composite score obtained out of 100 % (20% IA + 20% MST + 60% ESE)

B. END SEMESTER EXAMINATIONS (ESE)

1. No student will be allowed to appear in the End-Semester Examination or Make Up Examination unless the student has attended 75% of the classes in each subject, including practical's. A student on medical or valid ground like immediate family exigencies, etc., and who fails to secure 75% attendance in one or more subjects, but secures not less than 65% attendance, may, on recommendation of the Course Coordinators and Dean / Director / Head of School, may be permitted to appear in the Examination solely at the discretion of the Dean/Director of the concerned School. The student who has shortage of attendance less than 75% will have to attend remedial classes with a prescribed fee along with an undertaking from the parents in presence of the Course Coordinator/Director of the School concerned.

Application for condonation of attendance on medical ground shall be made to Dean /Director/ Head of the School immediately on joining back the programme after absence and in any case within 7 days of availing leave along with medical certificates in original from a registered medical practitioner. The medical certificate(s) /representation submitted after 7 days

will not be accepted. Outstation medical certificate will be entertained for this purpose only from students who have proceeded to their hometown/place of residence of their parents/guardians for the purpose of obtaining medical treatment duly authenticated by the travel records and hospitalization records.

However, University reserves the right to have such applicants examined by medical practitioner empanelled by the University to ascertain the authenticity of the applicant's medical ailment.

- 2. An approved list of students who are not eligible to appear in the End-Semester Examination because of shortfall in attendance shall be prepared & notified by respective Dean / Director / Head of the School with a copy to Controller of Examination office at least seven days before the commencement of Examinations.
- 3. A separate examination admit card will be given to each student after obtaining No dues from various departments in the University. Similarly a separate admit card for Make Up examination will be given to each student after clearing his/her dues. A student who fails to produce the Identity Card, on demand, may not be allowed to appear for the examination.
- 4. In case there are any dues/outstanding against a student from any School he/she may not be allowed to appear in the End Semester Examinations / Make Up Examinations.

5. Absence from Examination

A student, who does not appear in the End-Semester Examination, in one or more subjects without obtaining prior permission of the Director / Head, shall normally be denied permission to appear in the Make Up Examination. However, the Director / HoD, on his being satisfied that a student could not appear in an End-Semester Examination due to some valid medical or other specific reasons and on receiving specific approval from the concerned Dean/Director / Head of the School may permit the student to appear in the Make Up Examination.

6. In case of any dispute / ambiguity in Semester System of Examinations, the Vice Chancellor decision shall be final.

C. AWARD OF CREDITS AND GRADES

1.1 Each course, along with its weightage in terms of units and equivalent credits, shall be recommended by the concerned Board of Studies and shall be approved by the standing committee of Academic Council and the Board of Management. Only approved courses can be offered during any semester.

- 1.2 A student shall be continuously evaluated for his/her academic performance in a subject through tutorial work, practical, home assignment, mid-semester test, field work, seminars, quizzes, end semester examinations and regularity, as proposed by respective Board of Studies and approved by standing committee of Academic Council and Board of Management of the University.
- 1.3 The distribution of weightage / marks for each component shall be decided by the respective of Board of Studies and approved by standing committee of Academic Council and Board of Management of the University subject to such stipulation as given under:

1.4 GRADING SYSTEM

(a) The medium of instruction is English. The Performance in most Courses is spelt out in terms of letter grades O, A+, A, B+, B, C, P, F, Ab. Each letter grade has a qualitative meaning and a grade point value as given below

(b) A student obtaining Grade F shall be considered failed and will be required to reappear in the examination as per rules.

- (c) For non credit courses, descriptive non-letter grades (Very Good, Good, Average, Poor, Incomplete) are awarded which carry no grade points and will not be counted for the computation of SGPA / CGPA.
- (d) Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA)

The Letter Grades other then 'F', 'Ab' awarded to a student in all the Courses in a Semester shall be converted into a Semester performance index called the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA). The SGPA will be weighted average of Grade Points of all letter grades other than F, Ab received by a student for all the Courses registered in the Semester. The formula for Computing SGPA is:

- (e) Where U_1 , U_2 , U_3 denote credits associated with Courses taken by the Student and G_1 , G_2 , G_3 are the Grade Point of the letter grades awarded in the respective Course in that particular semester.
- (f) Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)

The calculation of CGPA is similar to that of calculating SGPA but will take into account all the Courses done in all the semesters up to that point of time. For the first semester, SGPA and CGPA will be the same.

Here NCj is the number of total credits offered in the jth semester, SGj is SGPA earned in the jth semester, where j = 1,2,...m, are the number of semesters in that course.

- (g) Whenever a student repeats a Course and gets a new letter grade the new grade replaces the earlier grade in the calculation of SGPA/CGPA.
- (h) If for any purpose, the SGPA/CGPA is required to be converted into percentage of marks, then SGPA/CGPA is to be multiplied by 10.

Formula for calculation of SGPA/CGPA equivalent to percentage is as under:-

D. <u>MAKE-UP EXAMINATION FOR UG, PG AND DIPLOMA PROGRAMMES</u>

Make-up Examination shall be conducted after declaration of End Semester Examination result in each semester for the courses studied by the students in the respective semester of study, on the following terms and conditions:-

- (i) Students who fail in End Semester Examination will only be allowed to appear in Make-up Examination.
- (ii) Students who were absent from appearing in End Semester Examination due to medical ground or any other genuine reason, may be allowed on discretion of the Vice Chancellor, if they produce the proofs of the absenteeism of End Semester Examination.
- (iii) Students who found indulge in unfair means activity in the respective semester examination, may also be allowed on discretion of the Vice Chancellor.
- (iv) Students who have debarred due to any un-disciplinary act, shall not be allowed to appear in Make-up Examination.
- (v) Students may appear in Make-up Examination for any number of courses as studied by them in the respective semester only.
- (vi) Make-up Examination shall be conducted in lines of End Semester Examination.

- (vii) Make-up Examination may be conducted after declaration of End Semester Examination results on the dates as announced by the University.
- (viii) For appearing in Make-up Examination, Students are required to fill the Make-up Examination form and submit it in the Examination Cell duly forwarded through the respective Heads/Departments by depositing the fee in the account section as prescribed by the University.
- (ix) Make-up classes may be conducted for the weak students on discretion of the Vice Chancellor, if it has been proposed and recommended by the respective Schools/Heads.
 - Conduction of such classes will be subject to fulfillment of all academic needs i.e. minimum required attendance criteria, regularity in all subjects concerned and payment of fee for such classes etc. as prescribed by the University.
- (x) Any other requirement for appearing in Make-up Examination as prescribed by the University from time to time.

E. IMPROVEMENT EXAMINATION

University may conduct improvement examination for any UG, PG and Diploma/Certificate Programmes after declaration of End Semester Examination result of the last semester of the respective programmes.

Students can be allowed to appear in improvement examination once in whole academic years of study for the respective programmes, for maximum 3 (three) courses of the preceding two semesters. Theory and Practical courses will be considered as separate courses.

F. SUMMER TRAINING/INTERNSHIP

- 1.1 Students of such programmes will be required to undergo summer training / internship of about 6-8 weeks as part of their academic programme as stipulated in the Board of Studies of the School.
- 1.2 ° Students will have to keep a Record/Work Book detailing out the activities that are carried out during their summer/winter training/internship.
- 1.3 Students will be required to submit a Detailed Report at the start of the next semester after completion of their summer training/internship.

- 1.4 The Course Coordinator will notify the date of presentation of the project/activities undertaken during summer training/internship.
- 1.5 The Report and the presentation will be evaluated by a duly constituted committee. The committee will ordinarily consist of:
 - (a) Dean / Director / Head of the Concerned Department or his nominee;
 - (b) Professor of the Constituent School / Deptt.;
 - (c) Course Coordinator.

The Deans of the respective School shall have the authority to change the Constitution of the Committee if deemed necessary.

- 1.6 The Committee will submit its evaluation grade in a sealed envelope to the Controller of Examination / Head.
- 1.7 It is mandatory for all students of all programme to undergo Summer Internship. However, if on account of some exigencies, if a student is unable to pursue internship, the Dean / Director / Head on approval can assign him / her a project whose grade will then be assigned towards Summer Internship.

G. DISSERTATION/PROJECT WORK

- 1.1 Every student shall, carryout dissertation/project work under the overall supervision of the supervisor(s). Normally, only a faculty of the Constituent School / Deptt. concerned shall be allowed to supervise a dissertation/project work. If the topic of a dissertation/project work warrants, at the most two faculty members of the Constituent School / Deptt. concerned may be allowed to supervise a dissertation/project work. Considering the interdisciplinary nature of the work involved a faculty from other Constituent School / Deptt. and /or from industry/corporate organization active in the area in which the work is being carried may be allowed, to be associated as a co-supervisor.
- 1.2 Under exceptional circumstances, an expert in the area from other academic institutions may also be appointed as a co-supervisor in addition to a faculty from the Constituent School / Deptt. of JLU.
- 1.3 The Coordinators shall, in consultation with the Dean / Director / Head concerned, finalize the topic for dissertation/project work along with the name(s) of the supervisor(s).
- 1.4 For this purpose, the Coordinator shall take into account the relevance of the topic on which the candidate proposes to work. However, the Coordinator may, if he considers it necessary or expedient, ask a student to carry out dissertation / project work on a topic other than the topic proposed by the

student and/or under a supervisor other than the one under whom the student proposed to carryout his/her dissertation/project work. Mid course alteration/ modification in the scope of dissertation would need explicit approval from the Dean / Director / Head of the respective School / Deptt..

- 1.5 The Coordinator shall prepare a list comprising the names of the students, topic allotted to each of them along with the name of the supervisor(s). The list duly approved by the Dean/Director / Head of the concerned School / Deptt. shall be sent to the Examination Section.
- 1.6 The dissertation/project work shall

(a) Be focused on the problem

(b) Include current status of knowledge in the subject (literature review);

(c) Embody the result of studies carried out by him/her;

(d) Show evidence of the student's capacity for critical examination and judgment; and

(e) Be satisfactory in presentation so far as language, style and form are

concerned.

1.7 The student shall indicate clearly and extensively in his/her dissertation/project, the following:

(a) The source from which referred information is taken;

(b) The extent to which he/she has availed himself/herself of the work of others and the portion of the dissertation/project work he/she claims to be his/her original work; and

(c) Whether his/her dissertation/project work has been conducted

independently or in collaboration with others.

- 1.8 A certificate to the effect that the dissertation/project work carried out by the student independently or in collaboration with other student(s) issued by the Supervisor(s) concerned and endorsed by the Coordinator concerned, shall form the part of the submission for evaluation.
- 1.9 Every student who spends a specified period of time in an industry/organization/institute for reasons of work related to his/her dissertation/project work, with prior permission from the Coordinator concerned will explicitly acknowledge working in the relevant industry/organization/institute.

H. SUBMISSION OF DISSERTATION/PROJECT WORK

1.1 Every student shall, on completion of his/her dissertation/project work, submit to the Examination Section (through the Coordinator concerned) two typed (or printed) hard bound copies of his/her dissertation/project work embodying the results of his/her dissertation/project work.

The dissertation/project work shall be submitted not later than the date specified for the purpose in the academic calendar or as notified by the Coordinator with the approval of the Dean.

Provided that, in exceptional cases, the Dean / Director / Head may permit a student (on the recommendation of supervisor concerned) to submit his/her dissertation/project work in the following semester for which tuition fee/hostel and other fees (as may be applicable) shall be charged.

1.2 No such dissertation/project work shall be processed for examination unless it is accompanied by a certificate from the supervisor to the effect that the dissertation/project is a record of work carried out by the student himself/herself or in collaboration with other student(s).

I. EVALUATION OF DISSERTATION/PROJECT WORK

1.1 Seminar and Viva-voce of Dissertation/Project Work

Every registered and eligible student shall be required to deliver a seminar lecture related to his/her dissertation work/project work before submitting the dissertation work/ project work before a committee constituted for the purpose by the Dean / Director / Head . The Coordinator shall, in consultation with the Dean / Director / Head concerned, notify the date of the seminar. The committee will ascertain the status of preparedness of the candidate for submission of dissertation project

1.2 Examination of the Dissertation/Project Work

Two Examiners, one internal and one external, who could be a faculty member of the School / Deptt., shall examine the dissertation/project work. The Examiners shall be appointed by the Board on the recommendation of the Coordinator and the Dean/Director/Head of the School concerned. The internal examiner shall ordinarily be the teacher under whose supervision the student carried out his/her project work.

- 1.3 The student shall be required to defend his/her dissertation/project work by making a presentation followed by Viva-voce.
- 1.4 The viva-voce (oral defence) on the dissertation will be conducted by a committee constituted for the purpose. The names of the Committee Members will be suggested by the Coordinator and approved by the Dean. The committee will opine about acceptability or otherwise of the dissertation and decide on the final grade, which will be submitted to the SRE by the Course Coordinator.

1.5 All Summer Internship Report and Dissertation Thesis submitted by the students will go through the process of plagiarism check through the antiplagiarism software. The report produced by the software will necessarily be submitted to the Dean/Director/Head of the School Dean/Director/Head of the School along with the evaluation of the Summer Internship Report/Dissertation Report. The Deans of the Constituent School / Departments will frame the rules of anti-plagiarism and display them on students Notice Board.

J. RE-EXAMINATION OF DISSERTATION / PROJECT WORK

If a student does not appear or fails in the 'Seminar and Viva-voce of Dissertation/Project or in the examination of the Dissertation/Project work he/she may be allowed to resubmit the Dissertation/Project work and appear at the Seminar and Viva voce within a period of six months from the date of declaration of the result which can be further extended on special grounds by the Vice Chancellor. Evaluation shall be done in the same manner as specified If he/she again fails to clear the seminar, his/her name shall be struck off the JLU rolls.

K. APPROVAL OF GRADES BY EXAMINATION & RESULT COMMITTEE

- 1.1 The tabulation sheet prepared by the Faculty's shall be placed for consideration before Examination Committee of the School. The Examination Committee of the School will be constituted as per provisions of Statutes of the University to consider the matters referred by the Examination Board. The Examination Committee will have the concerned Dean/ Director as its Chairman and 2 senior faculty members of the School.

 The Examination & Result Committee will have the authority to moderate the
 - The Examination & Result Committee will have the authority to moderate the results submitted by the faculty members and also seeking an explanation from the faculty, if considered necessary.
- 1.2 The Examination & Result Committee may moderate the result of a particular subject/student and advice on any action to be taken in this regard, in writing for incorporation in tabulation of the results and preparation of Grade Cards; to the Controller of Examination/Head of the School.
- 1.3 Every Examination shall be conducted in accordance with the administrative orders framed by the Academic Council and in force from time to time. The responsibility of executing the administrative order of the Academic Council rests with Deans/Director of respective School / Deptt..

L. TABULATION OF GRADES AND PREPARATION OF RESULT SHEET

- 1.1 The marks sheet in each subject shall be prepared in duplicate by the evaluator concerned and will be scrutinized by the Examination Committee of the School.
- 1.2 Tabulation of Grades and Preparation of Result Sheet shall be done by the Result Committee of the School concerned.
- 1.3 All the results will be published by the Controller of Examination and in case CoE is not available the Registrar.
- 1.4 Appropriate Grade Cards shall be prepared by the Controller of Examination.

M. <u>REQUIREMENTS FOR PASSING</u>

Students shall score a minimum passing grade "P" in order to be declared successful in individual subjects. For qualifying for a degree the student must secure a minimum CGPA of 5 for the Postgraduate and 4.5 for Undergraduate.

N. MODERATION OF RESULTS

A Moderation Board constituted as per University Rules shall have the power to moderate the results.

O. <u>DECLARATION AND RECTIFICATION OF RESULTS</u>

- 1.1 The results tabulated and moderated, as above, shall be put up to the Vice-Chancellor. The result shall be published only after approval by the Vice Chancellor / Registrar.
- 1.2 The Examination Board shall have the power to:-
 - (i) Quash or rectify the result of a student (even after it has been published) if
 - (a) It is found that he/she was ineligible to appear in the Examination; or
 - (b) He/she used unfair means in the Examination or was found guilty of misconduct; or
 - (c) A mistake is found in his/her result.
 - (ii) Any other issue pertaining to examination and promotion

The Examination Board will consist of:-

- 1. Vice Chancellor Chairman (may include, VC or his nominee)
- 2. Dean Member
- 3. Registrar Member
- 4. Directors/Heads of the concerned Schools Member
- 5. Controller of Examinations

There shall be a moderation committee at School level also with Directors/HODs as the Chairman and all full time faculty members as the members.

Duties of this Moderation Committee shall be as under:-

- 1. Moderation of Question Papers.
- 2. Moderation of Marks before finally submitting it to the Examination Cell.
- 3. Any other matter with permission of the Chair.

P. RECHECKING/REVALUATION

A student shall be entitled to have his/her answer books re-checked on payment of prescribed fee for each paper subject to the following condition:

- (a) The application for rechecking is received by the Controller of Examinations or his/her nominee within 10 (ten) days of the date of publication of result.
- (b) The Controller of Examinations shall get rechecking/re-evaluation (i.e. posting of marks, totaling of marks and if any questions is un-evaluated, to be evaluated) done to ascertain whether the marks awarded to various answers have been correctly added and whether the Examiner has evaluated answers to all the questions written by the Examinee.

If any mistake is discovered as a result of re-checking as above, the Head of Academic Computing shall rectify the result.

Q. <u>PROCESS FOR HANDLING UNFAIR MEANS CASES IN EXAMINATIONS</u>

- (I) The Superintendent of an examination centre shall take action against an examinee who is found using or attempting to use unfair means in the examination hall or within the premises of the examination centre during the hours of examination, in the following manner:-
 - (a) The examinee shall be called upon to surrender all the objectionable materials found in his or her possession including

the answer book and a memorandum shall be prepared with date and time.

- (b) The statement of the examinee and the invigilator shall be recorded.
- (c) All the materials collected and the entire evidence along with a statement of the examinee and the answer book duly initialed shall be sent to the examiner by the Registrar/Controller of examination by name, in a separate confidential sealed registered packet marked "Unfair Means" along with the observations of the Superintendent.
- (d) The material so collected from the examinee along with the answer booklet will be sent to the examiner by the Registrar/ Controller of examination for assessing and to report if the examinee has actually used unfair means in view of the material collected.
- (e) The cases of the use of unfair means at the examination as reported by the Centre Superintendent along with the report of the Examiner shall be examined by a Committee to be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor every year.

Whenever a case of adoption of unfair means in an Examination is brought to the notice of the Controller of Examinations by an invigilator (through the Centre Superintendent) or by a Block Superintendent, the Controller of Examinations shall take cognizance of the matter. The Controller of Examinations shall on every such occasion enquire into the matter and bring all incidents of unfair means in writing with relevant documents, wherever possible, to the Examination Disciplinary Committee constituted by the Vice Chancellor.

The constitution of the Examination Disciplinary Committee shall be as follows:

- (i) Dean/Director/Head of a Constituent School / Deptt./ or their nominee Chairman.
- (ii) Course Coordinator (Faculty Incharge) Member.
- (iii) Controller of Examinations or his nominee Member Secretary

(II) AWARD OF PUNISHMENT IN UNFAIR MEANS CASES IN ACCORDANCE WITH NATURE OF UNFAIRMEANS

In accordance with nature of Unfair Means Cases, the Examination Disciplinary Committee may take further action and award punishment accordingly as under:-

Nature of Unfair Means Cases

- A. (a) When incriminating material has been found in the possession of the examinee which was unrelated or related to the question paper but not copied and the student hands over the material when challenged and accepts the fault in writing, if directed to do so.
- (b) When a student tries to copy from other Student's answer book, talks to other students, tries to exchange answer books/question papers/calculators, tries to pass on information in any form and does accepts the fault in writing, when challenged.
- B. (a) When incriminating material related to the question paper has been found in the possession of an examinee he/she copied it in part or full or when the examinee refused to be searched, if so desired by the Center Superintendent / Invigilator.
- (b) When a student tries to copy from other students' answer books, talks to other students, tries to exchange answer books/question papers/calculators, or tries to pass on information in any form and does not accept the fault when challenged and/or enter into arguments with the invigilator(s).
- C. (a) When incriminating material has been found in the possession of

Punishment to be awarded

A. Examination in that subject shall be cancelled. In the event of the unfair-means being adopted in an End-Semester Examination the student(s) may be allowed to clear the subject by appearing in the Make Up Examination.

In the event of the unfair-means being adopted in a Make Up Examination the student shall be declared failed in the Examination.

Committee may impose fine.

B. Examination in the subject as also in all other subjects of the semester shall be cancelled and the student shall be declared failed in all the subjects of the Semester.

In The event of the unfair-means being adopted in an End-Semester Examination the student may be allowed to clear the semester by appearing at special Examination in all the subjects.

However, in the event of the unfairmeans being adopted in Make Up Examination

Committee may impose fine.

C. Examination in all papers of the Semester shall be cancelled and the

an examinee who was found guilty of using unfair means on an earlier occasion; or

- (b) When incriminating material has been found in the possession of an examinee the examinee having been caught for use of unfair means on earlier occasion of the same End-Semester/Special Examination; or,
- (c) When the incriminating material comprises answer book/additional answer sheet stolen earlier and/or when the examinee tries to destroy the material, and/or when the examinee tries to tear the answer book, and/or instigate/disturb others in the Examination hall to support his cause.
- D. When use of unfair-means has been attempted or where incriminating material has been found in the possession of the examinee, and the examinee has misbehaved with the faculty or staff on Examination supervision duty.

student shall be declared failed in the Examination. In addition the student shall be rusticated for a period of One year. In the event of the unfair-means being adopted in an End-Semester Examination the student shall not be allowed to appear in the Special Examination.

Committee may impose fine.

D. Examination in all papers of the semester shall be cancelled and the student shall be expelled from the University.

Committee may impose fine.

In case of ambiguity in any of the clauses above, the decision of the Vice Chancellor shall be final and binding on the student.

For any exigency on Medical Grounds and/or natural calamity, a student can make an appeal to the Vice Chancellor whose decision shall be final and binding on the student.

STATUTE NO. 5A

APPOINTMENT, TERMS AND CONDITIONS AND POWERS OF THE PRO-CHANCELLOR

- 1. The Governing body may appoint a Pro-Chancellor on recommendation of the Chancellor. The Governing Body shall determine qualification, functions, powers and removal of Pro-Chancellor.
- 2. The Pro-Chancellor shall assist the Chancellor in discharge the functions of the office of Chancellor.
- The Pro-Chancellor can represent the Chancellor in the University or outside on due authorization by the Chancellor.
- 4. Governing body may remove the Pro-Chancellor on recommendation of Chancellor in case of his office and role is detrimental to the interest of the University. However the Governing body shall follow the principles of natural justice while doing so.
- 5. Governing body may define and assign any other role to Pro-Chancellor as it deems fit.

STATUTE NO. 6A

APPOINTMENT, TERMS AND CONDITIONS AND POWERS OF THE PRO- VICE CHANCELLOR

- 1. The Governing body may appoint a Pro- Vice Chancellor on recommendation of the Vice Chancellor. The Governing Body shall determine qualification, functions, powers and removal of Pro-Vice Chancellor.
- 2. The Pro-Vice Chancellor shall assist the Vice Chancellor in discharge the functions of the office of Vice Chancellor.
- The Pro-Vice Chancellor can represent the Vice Chancellor in the University or outside on due authorization by the Vice Chancellor.
- 4. Governing body may remove the Pro-Vice Chancellor on recommendation of Vice Chancellor in case of his office and role is detrimental to the interest of the University. However the Governing body shall follow the principles of natural justice while doing so.
- 5. Governing body may define and assign any other role to Pro-Vice Chancellor as it deems fit.
