Ordinance No. 17

(BACHELOR OF PHARMACY (B. Pharm) – 4 Year degree)

1. Short Title and Commencement

These regulations shall be called as "The Regulations for the B. Pharm. Degree Program (CBCS)". The regulations framed are subject to modifications from time to time by Pharmacy Council of India (PCI). The first degree in Pharmacy of four-year (eight semester) program and shall be designated as BACHELOR OF PHARMACY (B. Pharm).

2. Minimum qualification for admission

2.1 First year B. Pharm:

2.1.1. Candidate shall have passed 10+2 examination conducted by the respective state/central government authorities recognized as equivalent to 10+2 examination by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) with English as one of the subjects and Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics (P.C.M) and or Biology (P.C.B / P.C.M.B.) as optional subjects individually. Any other qualification approved by the Pharmacy Council of India as equivalent to any of the above examinations.

2.1.2. Provided that a student should have completed 17 years of age on the date of admission or should complete the age of 17 years on or before 31st December of the year of admission to the program.

2.2. B. Pharm lateral entry (to third semester):

2.2.1. A pass in D. Pharm. course from an institution approved by the Pharmacy Council of India under section 12 of the Pharmacy Act.

3. Duration of the program

The course of study for B.Pharm. shall be of eight semesters (four academic years) for regular students and six semesters (three academic years) for lateral entry students. The curricula and syllabi for the program shall be prescribed from time to time by Pharmacy Council of India, New Delhi.

The maximum duration for the Program shall be Six years.

4. Medium of instruction and examinations

Medium of instruction and examination shall be in English.

5. Attendance and progress

A candidate is required to put in at least 80% attendance in individual courses considering theory and practical separately. The candidate shall complete the prescribed course satisfactorily to be eligible to appear for the respective examinations.

6. Program/Course credit structure

The course of study of B. Pharm. shall be as per the recommendation of the Board of Studies of the concerned School with the approval of Academic Council of the University and as per the regulations of Pharmacy Council of India.

The courses of study for B. Pharm shall include Semester wise Theory & Practical as recommended by PCI from time to time.

7. Grading of performances**7.1. Letter grades and grade points allocations:**

Based on the performances, each student shall be awarded a final letter grade at the end of the semester for each course. The letter grades and their corresponding grade points are given in Table.

A learner who remains absent for any end semester examination shall be assigned a letter grade of AB and a corresponding grade point of zero. He/she should reappear for the said evaluation/examination in due course.

7.2 The Semester grade point average (SGPA)

The performance of a student in a semester is indicated by a number called 'Semester Grade Point Average' (SGPA). The SGPA is the weighted average of the grade points obtained in all the courses by the student during the semester.

For example, if a student takes five courses (Theory/Practical) in a semester

with credits C1, C2, C3, C4 and C5 and the student's grade points in these courses are G1, G2, G3, G4 and G5, respectively, and then students' SGPA is equal to:

$$\text{SGPA} = \frac{C_1G_1 + C_2G_2 + C_3G_3 + C_4G_4 + C_5G_5}{C_1 + C_2 + C_3 + C_4 + C_5}$$

The SGPA is calculated to two decimal points.

7.3. Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)

The CGPA is calculated with the SGPA of all the VIII semesters to two decimal points and is indicated in final grade report card/final transcript showing the grades of all VIII semesters and their courses. The CGPA shall reflect the failed status in case of F grade(s), till the course(s) is/are passed. When the course(s) is/are passed by obtaining a pass grade on subsequent examination(s) the CGPA shall only reflect the new grade and not the fail grades earned earlier. The CGPA is calculated as:

$$\text{CGPA} = \frac{C_1S_1 + C_2S_2 + C_3S_3 + C_4S_4 + C_5S_5 + C_6S_6 + C_7S_7 + C_8S_8}{C_1 + C_2 + C_3 + C_4 + C_5 + C_6 + C_7 + C_8}$$

where C₁, C₂, C₃,.... is the total number of credits for semester I,II,III,.... and S₁,S₂, S₃,.... is the SGPA of semester I,II,III,.... .

7.4. Declaration of class

The class shall be awarded based on CGPA as follows:

First Class with Distinction = CGPA of 7.50 and above

First Class = CGPA of 6.00 to 7.49

Second Class = CGPA of 5.00 to 5.99

8. Duration for completion of the program of study

The duration for the completion of the program shall be fixed as double the actual duration of the program and the student must pass within the said period, otherwise they have to get fresh Registration.

9. Revaluation / Re-totaling of answer papers

There is no provision for revaluation of the answer papers in any examination. However, the candidates can apply for re-totaling by paying prescribed fee.

10. General

- In matters not covered under this ordinance, general rules of the university shall be applicable, otherwise, the state government / UGC / Statutory body directions shall be applicable.
- In matters of admission, attendance, and examination and in all other matters not provided in this ordinance, the courses shall be governed by the provisions of the relevant ordinances of the same in the university so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance.
- If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of these regulations, the Vice- Chancellor may by order make such provisions not inconsistent with the Act, Statutes, Ordinances or other Regulations, as appears to be necessary or expedient to remove the difficulty.
- If Pharmacy Council of India (PCI) notifies any changes in future in its regulations in this regard, the same will be incorporated in the existing ordinance with the approval of Vice-Chancellor on the recommendation of the Academic Council.

Ordinance No. 18

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE (AGRICULTURE) – 4 Year degree) B.Sc Hons (Agriculture)

1. Course & Admission

- 1.1. This ordinance shall be applicable to all the candidates admitted to Bachelor of Science Degree course in Agriculture on full-time basis. The Undergraduate course in Agriculture leads to the degree of Bachelor of Science (Agriculture) of the University.
- 1.2. The above course shall be offered as per the Indian Council of Agriculture Research (ICAR) norms.
- 1.3. Admission in this ordinance will be as per the norms of regulatory authority or Council / UGC/ State Govt wherever applicable and general conditions will be as per ordinance No – 3 of the university.
- 1.4. The relaxation in eligibility conditions, age and reservation etc. shall be in accordance with the Rules / Directives of the relevant Regulatory Body mainly ICAR or any other competent Authority of the Govt. of India / State Government as amended from time to time.

2. Duration Of the Program

The above course shall be divided into eight semesters (4-Years). Each semester would be approximately of six months duration including class work, examinations, vacation / preparatory leave / examination / industrial training etc.

The maximum duration of the course shall be of six years.

3. Intake & Fees

The intake and fees for all courses shall be as decided by the Board of Management of the University from time to time subject to the approval of the regulatory body.

4. Academic Year

As per the decision of the Academic Council in accordance with regulatory body, if applicable.

5. Course Structure

The course structure shall be as per the recommendation of the concerned board of studies of the school of the university duly approved by the academic council following the norms of ICAR and its dean committee.

6. Attendance

Candidates appearing as regular students for any semester examinations are required to attend minimum 75% of the lectures delivered and the practical classes held separately in each subject of the course of study: provided that a short fall in attendance up to a maximum of 10% can be condoned by the Vice-Chancellor of the University, for satisfactory reasons.

7. Examination Scheme

7.1 Examination will be conducted as per the Vth Dean committee of ICAR with continuous assessment of students. The passing criteria will be 40% including Internal exams for both theory and practical separately.

7.2 The studies and examination of the course shall be based on marks / marks-cum-credit / credit system as recommended by the concerned Board of Studies as per the Vth Dean Committee of ICAR from time to time.

7.3 Promotion to Next Semester & Failed Candidate

- A candidate shall be declared to have passed in each Paper / Practical / Mini Project and Viva-voce, if he / she secures not less than 40% of marks the continuous assessment and the University examinations (External) put together and provided a minimum of 40% of marks secured in the University examination.
- The student will get one more opportunity for the courses he failed in the first attempt within the same year as supplement exam.
- A candidate may provisionally continue his/her studies in higher semester class after the examinations of the semester he/she appeared are over. However, his/her eligibility shall be evaluated only after the results of semesters are declared at which he/she had appeared.
- If a candidate fails in not more than 50% of the total credits in any semester examination, he / she will be promoted to the next semester.
- For eligibility of admission into 3rd year, a student must have passed in all courses in first year and 50% credits of Second year. The same will be applicable to all subsequent years of study.

7.4 Eligibility for Award of the B.Sc (Hons) Agriculture

As per Vth Dean Committee of ICAR A student shall be declared to be eligible for award of the degree if he has:

- a) Registered and successfully completed all the core courses, optional Courses Practical / Lab classes, including Seminars, Workshops, Presentations, Group Discussion, Field Work/ Training, Industrial Visit, Educational Tour, Science Project Work / Dissertation or Thesis and other Assignments etc. wherever applicable.
- b) Successfully acquired the minimum required credits as specified in the regulation corresponding to the branch of his study within the stipulated time. Wherever applicable.
- c) Earned the specified credits in all the categories of subjects as applicable.
- d) Secured a minimum 40% in aggregate overall. However, the award of the Division / Class shall be as per recommendation of concerned Board of Studies of the University.
- e) Eligibility may change by the recommended by the concerned Board of Studies with approval of Academic council as per the recommendation of ICAR Dean Committee (statutory body) from time to time.

8. General

- In matters not covered under this ordinance, general rules of the university shall be applicable, otherwise, the state government / UGC / Statutory body directions shall be applicable.
- In matters of admission, attendance, and examination and in all other matters not provided in this ordinance, the courses shall be governed by the provisions of the relevant ordinances of the same in the university so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance.
- If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of these regulations, the Vice-Chancellor may by order make such provisions not inconsistent with the Act, Statutes, Ordinances or other Regulations, as appears to be necessary or expedient to remove the difficulty.
- If ICAR or other regulatory body notifies any changes in future in its regulations in this regard, the same will be incorporated in the existing ordinance with the approval of Vice-Chancellor on the recommendation of the Academic Council.

Ordinance No. 19
BACHELOR OF SCIENCE (NURSING) – 4 Year degree)
B.Sc. (NURSING)

1. Course & Admission

- 1.1 This ordinance shall be applicable to all the candidates admitted to Bachelor of Science Degree course in Nursing on full-time basis.
- 1.2 The above course shall be offered as per the norms and regulations of Indian Nursing Council
- 1.3 Admission in this ordinance will be as per the norms of regulatory authority or Council / UGC / State Govt wherever applicable and general conditions will be as per ordinance No – 3 of the university.
- 1.4 The relaxation in eligibility conditions, age and reservation etc. shall be in accordance with the Rules / Directives of the relevant Regulatory Body mainly INC or any other competent Authority of the Govt. of India / State Government as amended from time to time.

2. Duration of the Program

The duration of the program shall be of 4- Years and maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 8 years.

3. Intake & Fees

The intake and fees for all courses shall be as decided by the Board of Management of the University from time to time subject to the approval of the regulatory body.

4. Academic Year

As per the decision of the Academic Council in accordance with regulatory body, if applicable.

5. Course Structure

The bachelor's degree in nursing of four years course shall be designed as per the recommendation of the concerned school Board of Studies adhering to the norms and regulations of Nursing Council of India as amended from time to time by with due approval of Academic Council.

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6. Attendance

Candidates appearing as regular students for any semester examinations are required to attend 75% of the lectures delivered and the practical classes held separately in each subject of the course of study; provided that a short fall in attendance up to a maximum of 10% can be condoned by the Vice-Chancellor of the University, for satisfactory reasons.

7. Examination Scheme

The examination scheme will be as the recommendation of the Board of Studies (BoS) of concerned school adhering to the norms and regulations of Nursing Council of India as amended from time to time with due approval of Academic Council.

7.1 Eligibility for Award of the B.Sc. (Nursing)

A student shall be declared to be eligible for award of degree if he / she has:

- a) Registered and successfully completed all the core courses, optional Courses Practical / Lab classes, including Seminars, Workshops, Presentations, Group Discussion, Field Work / Training, Industrial Visit, Educational Tour. Science Project Work / Dissertation or Thesis and other Assignments etc. wherever applicable.
- b) Successfully acquired the minimum required credits as specified in the regulation corresponding to the branch of study within the stipulated time wherever applicable.
- c) Earned the specified credits in all the categories of subjects as applicable.
- d) Secured a minimum 50% in aggregate overall. However, the award of the Division / Class shall be as per recommendation of Board of Studies of concerned school of the University.
- e) Eligibility may change by the concerned Board of Studies with approval of Academic council as per the recommendation of Indian Nursing Council (statutory body) from time to time.

8. General

- In matters not covered under this ordinance, general rules of the university shall be applicable, otherwise, the state government / UGC / Statutory body directions shall be applicable.



- In matters of admission, attendance, and examination and in all other matters not provided in this ordinance, the courses shall be governed by the provisions of the relevant ordinances of the same in the university so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance.
- If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of these regulations, the Vice- Chancellor may by order make such provisions not inconsistent with the Act, Statutes, Ordinances or other Regulations, as appears to be necessary or expedient to remove the difficulty.
- If Indian Nursing Council (INC) or other regulatory body notifies any changes in future in its regulations in this regard, the same will be incorporated in the existing ordinance with the approval of Vice-Chancellor on the recommendation of the Academic Council.

Ordinance No. 20
BACHELOR OF TECHNOLOGY (AGRICULTURAL ENGINEERING) –
4 Year Degree

1. Course & Admission

- 1.1. This ordinance shall be applicable to all the candidates admitted to Bachelor of Technology in Agricultural Engineering.
- 1.2. The above course shall be offered as per the Indian Council of Agriculture Research (ICAR) norms.
- 1.3. Admission in this ordinance will be as per the norms of regulatory authority or Council / UGC/ State Govt wherever applicable and general conditions will be as per ordinance No – 3 of the university.
- 1.4. The relaxation in eligibility conditions, age and reservation etc. shall be in accordance with the Rules/ Directives of the relevant Regulatory Body mainly ICAR or any other competent Authority of the Govt. of India / State Government as amended from time to time.

1.5 Eligibility (As per ICAR Norms) -

B.Tech. (Agricultural Engineering) - 10+2 / Intermediate with PCM (P- Physics, C Chemistry, M-Mathematics) from a recognized Board/university

2. Duration Of the Program

The above programs shall be of eight semesters (4-Years). The maximum duration of the course shall be of six years.

3. Intake & Fees

The intake and fees for all courses shall be as decided by the Board of Management of the University from time to time subject to the approval of the regulatory body.

4. Academic Year

As per the decision of the Academic Council in accordance with regulatory body, if applicable.

5. Course Structure

The course structure shall be as per the recommendation of the board of studies of the concerned school of the university duly approved by the academic council following the norms of ICAR and its dean committee.

6. Attendance

Candidates appearing as regular students for any semester examinations are required to attend minimum 75% of the lectures delivered and the practical classes held separately in each subject of the course of study: provided that a short fall in attendance up to a maximum of 10% can be condoned by the Vice-Chancellor of the University, for satisfactory reasons.

7. Examination Scheme

7.1 Examination will be conducted as per the Vth Dean committee of ICAR with continuous assessment of students or as per the amendments by ICAR from time to time.

7.2 The studies and examination of the course shall be based on marks / marks-cum-credit / credit system as recommended by the concerned Board of Studies and as per the Dean Committee of ICAR from time to time.

7.3 Promotion to Next Semester & Failed Candidate

- A candidate shall be declared to have passed in each Paper / Practical / Mini Project and Viva-voce, if he / she secures not less than 50% of marks the continuous assessment and the University examinations (External) put together and provided a minimum of 50% of marks secured in the University examination.
- The student will get one more opportunity for the courses he failed in the first attempt within the same year as supplement exam.
- A candidate may provisionally continue his/her studies in higher semester class after the examinations of the semester he/she appeared are over. However, his/her eligibility shall be evaluated only after the results of semesters are declared at which he/she had appeared.
- If a candidate fails in not more than 50% of the total credits in any semester examination, he / she will be promoted to the next semester.
- For eligibility of admission into 3rd year, a student must have passed in all courses in first year and 50% credits of Second year. He /She must have cleared all the



credits up to 3rd year including skill development training – I (4 Weeks) (Summer break June – July after 4th semester and skill development training – II (4 Weeks) in summer break (June – July) after 6th semester as per ICAR Vth Dean's Norms, then only he/she is eligible for promotion to 4th Year.

7.4 Eligibility for Award of the B. Tech Degree in Agriculture Engineering

As per Vth Dean Committee of ICAR A student shall be declared to be eligible for award of the degree if he has:

- Registered and successfully completed all the core courses, optional Courses Practical / Lab classes, including Seminars, Workshops, Presentations, Group Discussion, Field Work/ Training, Industrial Visit, Educational Tour. Science Project Work / Dissertation or Thesis and other Assignments etc. wherever applicable.
- Successfully acquired the minimum required credits as specified in the regulation corresponding to the branch of his study within the stipulated time. Wherever applicable.

- Earned the specified credits in all the categories of subjects as applicable.
- Secured a minimum 50% in aggregate overall. However, the award of the Division / Class shall be as per recommendation of concerned Board of Studies of the University.
- Eligibility may change by the recommended by the concerned Board of Studies with approval of Academic council as per the recommendation of ICAR Dean Committee (statutory body) from time to time.

8. General

- In matters not covered under this ordinance, general rules of the university shall be applicable, otherwise, the state government / UGC / Statutory body directions shall be applicable.
- In matters of admission, attendance, and examination and in all other matters not provided in this ordinance, the courses shall be governed by the provisions of the relevant ordinances of the same in the university so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance.
- If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of these regulations, the Vice- Chancellor may by order make such provisions not inconsistent with the Act, Statutes, Ordinances or other Regulations, as appears to be necessary or expedient to remove the difficulty.
- If ICAR or other regulatory body notifies any changes in future in its regulations in this regard, the same will be incorporated in the existing ordinance with the approval of Vice-Chancellor on the recommendation of the Academic Council.

Ordinance No. 21
BACHELOR OF LAW (LLB Hons / Plain) – 3 Year Degree

1. Course & Admission

- 1.1 The ordinance shall be applicable to candidates for Bachelor of Law (LLB) Hons / Plain Degree, in accordance with the norms laid down by Bar Council of India (BCI).
- 1.2 For admission in Law, in the qualifying examination the candidates shall have obtained 50% marks at Bachelor level. The admission will be on merit basis and other qualification as decided by university. For SC & ST the minimum percentage for admission will be 45%. To determine the merit for admission of such candidates who have secured equal marks in the qualifying examination, the percentage of marks secured by the candidate at the intermediate or equivalent examination will be determining factor of merit for admission.
- 1.3 A candidate who after having passed the final examination for the bachelor's degree in Arts, Science, Commerce, Agriculture, Engineering, Medicine or Veterinary & Animal Husbandry of the University or degree of any other University recognized by the University as equivalent thereof shall be admitted to the program.
- 1.4 Admission to this program shall be as per the norms of regulatory authority (BCI) / UGC / State Govt wherever applicable and general conditions will be as per ordinance No – 3 of the university.

2. Duration Of the Program

The duration of program shall be of six semesters (3-Years). The maximum duration will be 6 years.

3. Intake & Fees

The intake and fees for all courses shall be as decided by the Board of Management of the University from time to time subject to the approval of the regulatory body.

4. Academic Year

As per the decision of the Academic Council in accordance with regulatory body, if applicable.

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5. Course Structure

The course structure of LLB shall be as per the recommendation of the Board of studies of the concerned school of the University / UGC/ strictly following the rules of BCI and its amendments as suggested from time to time and duly approved by the Academic Council.

6. Attendance

Candidates appearing as regular students for any semester examinations are required to attend 75% of the lectures delivered. Provided that, In case of illness or because of other reasonable cause it shall be relaxed by Vice-Chancellor as up to 10% admissible within applicable regulations.

7. Examination Scheme

The evaluation of students in a course shall have two components unless specifically stated otherwise in Syllabi and Scheme:

- (i) Continuous evaluation by the teacher(s) of the course.
- (ii) Evaluation through a Semester end examination.

The guidelines for distribution of weightage for various components of evaluation shall be as below:

- (i) Continuous evaluation by teacher(s) - 50%
- (ii) Semester end examination - 50%

For any other component of a program not covered by the above, the weightage shall be prescribed by the Board of Studies, with the approval of the Vice-Chancellor.

Total marks for each course shall be based on continuous assessments and semester end examinations. It is necessary to have uniform pattern of 50: 50 for Internal assessment and Semester End theory examinations respectively same for Internal assessment and Semester End practical examinations.

7.1 The examination pattern shall be CBCS with continuous assessment of students. The passing criteria will be 40% subjected to securing 40% in the end semester examination.

7.2 The studies and examination of the course shall be based on marks/ marks cum-credit / credit system as recommended by the Board of Studies from time to time.

7.3 Each student shall have to appear in the examination of theory/practical and continuous comprehensive examination system (CCE)/internal assessment. The internal assessment will be held in the manner prescribed from time to time by the regulatory council.

7.4 Promotion to Next Semester & Failed Candidate

- A candidate shall be declared to have passed in each Paper / Practical / Mini Project and Viva-voce, if he / she secures not less than 40% of marks the continuous assessment and the University examinations (External) put together and provided a minimum of 40% of marks secured in the University examination.
- The student will get one more opportunity for the courses he failed in the first attempt within the same year as supplement exam.
- A candidate may provisionally continue his/her studies in higher semester class after the examinations of the semester he/she appeared are over. However, his/her eligibility shall be evaluated only after the results of semesters are declared at which he/she had appeared.
- If a candidate fails in not more than 50% of the total credits in any semester examination, he / she will be promoted to the next semester.
- For eligibility of admission into 3rd year, a student must have passed in all courses in first year and 50% credits of Second year. The same will be applicable to all subsequent years of study.

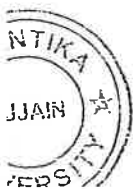

The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal places and reported

in the transcripts.

Illustration of SGPA and CGPA. The CGPA grade shall be awarded only after successfully passing all the courses required for the award of degree.

The successful candidates as per CGPA higher than or equal to the minimum CGPA specified in the Syllabi and Scheme of Teaching and Examination for the award of the degree, shall be awarded the degree and shall be placed in Class as below:

- CGPA from 4.00 – 4.99 shall be placed in the Pass Class.
- CGPA from 5.00 – 6.49 shall be placed in the Second Class.
- CGPA from 6.50 – 8.49 shall be placed in the First Class.
- CGPA from 8.50 and above shall be placed in the Exemplary Performance.

8. General

- The admission to all kinds & mode of LLB program shall be governed in accordance and provisions of the Rules/ Directives of UGC/BCI relevant regulatory body as applicable or amended from time to time.

- If BCI or other regulatory body notifies any changes in future in its regulations in this regard, the same will be incorporated in the existing ordinance with the approval of Vice-Chancellor on the recommendation of the Academic Council.

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Ordinance No. 22

MASTER OF PHARMACY (M. Pharm) – 2 Year Degree

The following ordinance has been made as per PCI (Pharmacy council of India) Education Regulation 2014 for the program / Course: - M.Pharm. and can be modified from time to time as per the recommendation of Pharmacy council of India.

1. Short Title and Commencement

These regulations shall be called as "The Regulations for the Master of Pharmacy (M. Pharm.) Degree Program - Credit Based Semester System (CBSS)". The regulations framed are subject to modifications from time to time by the authorities of the university as suggested or recommended by the statutory authority.

2. Minimum qualification for admission

A candidate seeking admission should have passed the B. Pharm Degree examination of an Indian university established by law in India from an institution approved by Pharmacy Council of India and has scored not less than 55 % of the minimum marks (aggregate of 4 years of B.Pharm.)

Every student, selected for admission to post graduate pharmacy program in any PCI approved institution should have obtained registration with the State Pharmacy Council or should obtain the same within one month from the date of his/ her admission, failing which the admission of the candidate shall be cancelled.

Note: It is mandatory to submit a migration certificate obtained from the respective university where the candidate had passed his/her qualifying degree (B.Pharm.)

3. Duration of the program

The program of study for M. Pharm shall be of four semesters (two academic years). The curricula and syllabi for the program shall be prescribed by Pharmacy Council of India, New Delhi from time to time.

4. Medium of instruction and examinations

Medium of instruction and examination shall be in English.

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5. Attendance and progress

A candidate is required to put in at least 80% attendance in individual courses considering theory and practical separately. The candidate shall complete the prescribed course satisfactorily to be eligible to appear for the respective examinations.

6. Program/Course credit structure

The course of study of B. Pharm. shall be as per the recommendation of the Board of Studies of the concerned School with the approval of Academic Council of the University as per the regulation of Pharmacy Council of India.

7. Grading of performances**7.1. Letter grades and grade points allocations:**

Based on the performances, each student shall be awarded a final letter grade at the end of the semester for each course. The letter grades and their corresponding grade points are given in Table.

A learner who remains absent for any end semester examination shall be assigned a letter grade of AB and a corresponding grade point of zero. He/she should reappear for the said evaluation/examination in due course.

7.2 The Semester grade point average (SGPA)

The performance of a student in a semester is indicated by a number called 'Semester Grade Point Average' (SGPA). The SGPA is the weighted average of the grade points obtained in all the courses by the student during the semester. For example, if a student takes five courses (Theory/Practical) in a semester with credits C₁, C₂, C₃ and C₄ and the student's grade points in these courses are G₁, G₂, G₃ and G₄, respectively, and then students' SGPA is equal to:



SGPA =

$$C_1G_1 + C_2G_2 + C_3G_3 + C_4G_4$$

$$C_1 + C_2 + C_3 + C_4$$

The SGPA is calculated to two decimal points.

7.3. Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)

The CGPA is calculated with the SGPA of all the IV semesters to two decimal points and is indicated in final grade report card/final transcript showing the grades of all IV semesters and their courses. The CGPA shall reflect the failed status in case of F grade(s), till the course(s) is/are passed. When the course(s) is/are passed by obtaining a pass grade on subsequent examination(s) the CGPA shall only reflect the new grade and not the fail grades earned earlier. The CGPA is calculated as:

$$\text{CGPA} = \frac{C_1S_1 + C_2S_2 + C_3S_3 + C_4S_4}{C_1 + C_2 + C_3 + C_4}$$

where C_1, C_2, C_3, \dots is the total number of credits for semester I, II, III, and S_1, S_2, S_3, \dots is the SGPA of semester I, II, III,

8. Declaration of class

The class shall be awarded based on CGPA as follows:

First Class with Distinction	= CGPA of 7.50 and above
First Class	= CGPA of 6.00 to 7.49
Second Class	= CGPA of 5.00 to 5.99

9. Revaluation / Re-totaling of answer papers

There is no provision for revaluation of the answer papers in any examination. However, the candidates can apply for retotaling by paying prescribed fee.

10. Re-admission after break of study

Candidate who seeks re-admission to the program after break of study must get the approval from the university by paying a condonation fee.

11. General

- In matters not covered under this ordinance, general rules of the university shall be applicable, otherwise, the state government / UGC / PCI directions shall be applicable.
- In matters of admission, attendance, and examination and in all other matters not provided in this ordinance, the courses shall be governed by the provisions of the relevant ordinances of the same in the university so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance.



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- If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of these regulations, the Vice-Chancellor may by order make such provisions not inconsistent with the Act, Statutes, Ordinances or other Regulations, as appears to be necessary or expedient to remove the difficulty.
- If PCI / UGC / other statutory body notifies any changes in future in its regulations in this regard, the same will be incorporated in the existing ordinance with the approval of Vice-Chancellor on the recommendation of the Academic Council.

1. Name of Program

Faculty / School / Teaching department established by the university will offer following 5 – year Integrated and other like / similar programs, admission in this ordinance shall be as per the norms of regulatory authority or Council / UGC / State Govt wherever applicable and for other courses it will be as per ordinance No – 3 of the university.

2. Admission

2.1 Candidate should have passed the 10+2 examination, or any other equivalent examination conducted by State / Central Board of Secondary Education or, any other state Board / University.

2.2 Admission in this ordinance will be as per the norms of regulatory authority or Council / UGC / State Govt wherever applicable and general conditions will be as per ordinance No – 3 of the university provided that the admission criteria will be as per the norms of regulatory body of the concerned course.

3. Duration Of the Program

The above course shall be divided into 10 semesters (5-Years) or will be as per the New Education Policy if the above courses are included in NEP, then the duration will be according to the norms as recommended by the NEP, UGC or State Government as applicable from time to time.

4. Intake & Fees

The intake and fees for all courses shall be as decided by the Board of Management of the University from time to time subject to the approval of the regulatory body.

4. Academic Year

As per the decision of the Academic Council in accordance with regulatory body, if applicable.

5. Eligibility for Degree

- a. If a candidate wants to leave / quit the course after successful completion of three years, he / she will be awarded bachelor's degree in concerned program.
- b. Specializations will be offered according to ordinance No-2 and as per the decision of the Academic Council of the University.
- c. A candidate may provisionally continue to attend next higher year, even if, the result of qualifying year / semester has not been declared. However, subsequently if he / she is not able to clear qualifying semester examination, the candidate cannot claim any right based on his / her provisional admission.
- d. Honours / Research degree will only be awarded if the candidate meets a minimum of 7.5 CGPA in whatever course or as per applicable norms of NEP (National Education Policy) as applicable from time to time and its regulation and amendments will be applicable in this ordinance. The PG degree may also be converted to 1 year if the program comes under NEP.
- e. The maximum duration of the program shall be eight years.

6. Course Structure

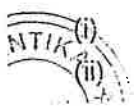
The course structure of the program shall be as per the recommendation of the Board of studies of the concerned school of the University / UGC / strictly following the rules of regulatory body and its amendments as suggested from time to time and duly approved by the Academic Council.

7. Attendance

Candidates appearing as regular students for any semester examinations are required to attend 75% of the lectures delivered and the practical classes held separately in each subject of the course of study, provided that a short fall in attendance up to a maximum of 10% can be condoned by the Vice-Chancellor of the University, for satisfactory reasons.

8. Examination Scheme

The evaluation of students in a course shall have two components unless specifically stated otherwise in Syllabi and Scheme:



(i) Continuous evaluation by the teacher(s) of the course.

(ii) Evaluation through a Semester end examination.

The guidelines for distribution of weightage for various components of evaluation shall be as below:

- (i) Continuous evaluation by teacher(s) - 50%
- (ii) Semester end examination - 50%

For any other component of a program not covered by the above, the weightage shall be prescribed by the Board of Studies, with the approval of the Vice-Chancellor.

Total marks for each course shall be based on continuous assessments and semester end examinations. It is necessary to have uniform pattern of 50: 50 for Internal assessment and Semester End theory examinations respectively same for Internal assessment and Semester End practical examinations.

8.1 The examination pattern shall be CBCS with continuous assessment of students. The passing criteria will be 40% subjected to securing 40% in the end semester examination.

8.2 The studies and examination of the course shall be based on marks/ marks cum-credit / credit system as recommended by the concerned Board of Studies from time to time.

8.3 Each student shall have to appear in the examination of theory / practical and continuous comprehensive examination system (CCE) / internal assessment. The internal assessment will be held in the manner prescribed from time to time by the regulatory council.

8.4 Promotion to Next Semester & Failed Candidate

- A candidate shall be declared to have passed in each Paper / Practical / Mini Project and Viva-voce, if he / she secures not less than 40% of marks the continuous assessment and the University examinations (External) put together and provided a minimum of 40% of marks secured in the University examination.
- The student will get one more opportunity for the courses he failed in the first attempt within the same year as supplement exam.
- A candidate may provisionally continue his/her studies in higher semester class after the examinations of the semester he/she appeared are over. However, his/her eligibility shall be evaluated only after the results of semesters are declared at which he/she had appeared.
- If a candidate fails in not more than 50% of the total credits in any semester examination, he / she will be promoted to the next semester.

Ordinance No. 24
ONE YEAR (TWO SEMESTER) MASTER OF LAWS (LL.M)
FULL TIME PROGRAM

As per UGC Guidelines for Centre for Post Graduate Legal Studies introduction of One Year LL.M. Degree Program, 2012
(Vide D. O. No.5-1/99(CPP-II) dated 18 Jan 2013)

1. The Program & Duration

The LL.M Program shall be conducted and managed by Centre for Post Graduate Legal Studies, Avantika University, School of Law.

The course for the degree of Master of Laws (One year Course) shall be spread over one academic year of 36 weeks duration, consisting of two semesters i.e. semesters 1st and 2nd (Of 18 weeks each).

The course shall be for full time students. There shall be 10 papers (5 Papers in 1st semester & 4 Papers and one dissertation in 2nd semester.

A candidate has to complete the entire course of post graduate degree within a maximum period of three years from the session of first admission.

2. Intake & Fees

The intake and fees for each of these courses shall be decided by the Board of Management of the University from time to time, subject to the approval of the regulatory body.

3. Eligibility

Candidates seeking admission to LL.M. courses must have passed LL.B. course directly or through five years integrated program with minimum 50% marks for all categories from any recognized University or an equivalent body.

4. Admission Procedure

4.1 Admission in LL.M. will be made as follows:

- a) The University will issue admission notifications in newspapers, or on the University's website, notice board of the university and in other publicity media before the start of every academic cycle.
- b) The students will be shortlisted for provisional admission based on their merit of qualifying examination and interview, giving 70% and 30% weightage respectively. During the interview, candidates will be assessed about their

work experience, publications, and statement of purpose. However, person of the same merit who has passed All India Admission Test, should be preferred:

- c) List of candidates provisionally selected for admission / shortlisted based on merit will be displayed on the notice board of the University/ University's website/or the students will be informed directly of their admission after the last date of admission.
- d) The candidates whose results of the qualifying exam are awaited can also apply. Such candidates, however, must produce the previous year mark sheet /School/College certificates, as a proof for required eligibility criteria before the due date failing which, the provisional admission granted will be cancelled.
- e) The application form may be rejected due to any of the following reasons:
 - The candidate does not fulfill the eligibility conditions
 - The prescribed fee is not enclosed.
 - The application form is not signed by the candidate and his/her parent guardian, wherever required.
 - Supporting documents for admission are not enclosed.
- f) Enrollment / Registration number will be assigned to the student by the University after submission and verification of all the necessary documents/fees.

4.2 Admission rules as framed by the University shall be applicable for an admission from time to time and as per ordinance no 3.

5. Course Structure

- 5.1 The course structure/curriculum for One-Year LL.M. shall have the following components:
 - (a) Foundation/Compulsory Papers (3 papers of three credits each)
 - (b) Optional/Specialization Papers (6 papers of two credits each)
 - (c) Dissertation (three credits)
- 5.2 Provided, in case the candidate takes a minimum of four specialization papers from any Group/Cluster only, then that Course can be called after the discipline the candidates select; the candidate can opt for remaining paper/papers of his/her choice in order to complete the number of courses/credits prescribed for the Degree.
- 5.3 Foundation/Compulsory Papers: The Foundation Courses consist of the following three subjects/papers, which should be completed in the first Semester:
 - a) Research Methods and Legal Writing
 - b) Comparative Public Law/Systems of Governance
 - c) Law and Justice in a Globalizing World
- 5.4 Optional/Specialization Papers: The Centre offering specialized LL.M. degree shall offer courses in one or more of the groups of specialization. Each group of

specialization shall consist of several papers from which the students can choose the number required to get the degree of that specialization.

- 5.5 The list of papers/subjects will be decided and designed by the concerned School by its Board of Studies following the regulations of the UGC / statutory body and its amendment from time to time. They will get changed depending on developments in law and the demands of society.
- 5.6 Dissertation The dissertation shall carry a minimum of three and a maximum of five credits as decided by the faculty according to regulations approved by the Academic Council of the University.

6. Examination Scheme

6.1 The studies and examination of the course shall be based on marks/ marks cum-credit / credit system as recommended by the concerned Board of Studies from time to time.

6.2 Each student shall have to appear in the examination in each semester for theory/practical and continuous comprehensive examination system (CCE)/internal assessment. The internal assessment will be held in the manner prescribed from time to time by the regulatory council.

6.3 Promotion to Next Semester & Failed Candidate

- A candidate shall be declared to have passed in each Paper / Practical / Mini Project and Viva-voce, if he / she secures not less than 40% of marks the continuous assessment and the University examinations (External) put together and provided a minimum of 40% of marks secured in the University examination.

Grade Letter and Grade Points for each paper are allocated after evaluating 100% of all course components (All Papers of Theory and Practical including Co and Extra-curricular activities).

The SGPA is the ratio of sum of the product (credit point) of the number of credits with the grade point scored by a student in all the courses taken by a student and the sum of the number of credits of all the courses undertaken by a student.

- The SGPA is computed using the following formula i.e.

$$SGPA(S_i) = \frac{\sum(C_i \times G_i)}{\sum C_i}$$

Where C_i is the number of credits of the i^{th} course and G_i is the grade points scored by the student in the i^{th} course.

The CGPA is also calculated in the same manner taking into account all the courses undertaken by a student over all the semesters of a program i.e.

$$CGPA = \frac{\sum(C_i \times S_i)}{\sum C_i}$$

Where S_i is the SGPA of the i^{th} semester and C_i is the total number of credits in that semester.

The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal places and reported in the transcripts.

Illustration of SGPA and CGPA. The CGPA grade shall be awarded only after successfully passing all the courses required for the award of degree.

The successful candidates as per CGPA higher than or equal to the minimum CGPA specified in the Syllabi and Scheme of Teaching and Examination for the award of the degree, shall be awarded the degree and shall be placed in Class as below:

- CGPA from 4.00–4.99 shall be placed in the Pass Class.
- CGPA from 5.00–6.49 shall be placed in the Second Class.
- CGPA from 6.50–8.49 shall be placed in the First Class.
- CGPA from 8.50 and above shall be placed in the Exemplary Performance.

7. General

- The admission to all kinds & mode of LLM program shall be governed in accordance and provisions of the Rules/ Directives of UGC/BCI relevant regulatory body as applicable or amended from time to time.
- The relaxation in eligibility conditions, age, and reservation etc. shall be in accordance with the rules of UGC / BCI / Authority of Govt. of India / State Government as applicable or amended from time to time.
- In matters not covered under this ordinance, general rules of the university shall be applicable, otherwise, the state government / UGC / Statutory body directions shall be applicable.

- In matters of admission, attendance, and examination and in all other matters not provided in this ordinance, the courses shall be governed by the provisions of the relevant ordinances of the same in the university so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance.
- If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of these regulations, the Vice-Chancellor may by order make such provisions not inconsistent with the Act, Statutes, Ordinances or other Regulations, as appears to be necessary or expedient to remove the difficulty.
- If BCI or other regulatory body notifies any changes in future in its regulations in this regard, the same will be incorporated in the existing ordinance with the approval of Vice-Chancellor on the recommendation of the Academic Council.
- Course provided by the university school will not contradict with BCI and Regulatory body.

Ordinance No. 25
MASTER OF LAWS (LL.M.) – (2 Year degree)

1. Course & Admission

- 1.1. This ordinance shall be applicable to all the candidates admitted to Master's Degree in Law course on full-time basis.
- 1.2. The above course shall be offered as per the norms and regulations of Bar Council of India
- 1.3. Admission in this ordinance will be as per the norms of regulatory authority or Council / UGC/ State Govt wherever applicable and general conditions will be as per ordinance No – 3 of the university.
- 1.4. The candidates who have obtained(i) the degree of Bachelor of Law (LL.B.) after graduation in any subject or area or discipline or (ii) an Integrated degree such as, BA.LL.B. or BBA.LL.B or B.Sc. LL.B.etc after studying at least a minimum period of five years are only eligible for admission to Master's Degree in law (LL.M.)
- 1.5. The relaxation in eligibility conditions, age and reservation etc. shall be in accordance with the Rules/ Directives of the relevant Regulatory Body BCI or any other competent Authority of the Govt. of India /State Government as amended from time to time.

2. Duration Of the Program

The duration of the program shall be of 2- Years, 4- semesters. Maximum duration will be as per the regulation of UGC / BCI.

3. Intake & Fees

The intake and fees for all courses shall be as decided by the Board of Management of the University from time to time subject to the approval of the regulatory body.

4. Academic Year

As per the decision of the Academic Council in accordance with regulatory body, if applicable.

5. Course Structure

The LLM program shall be of two years and will be designed as per the recommendation of board of studies of the concerned school adhering to the norms and regulations of Bar Council of India and as amended from time to time with due approval of Academic Council.

6. Attendance

Candidates appearing as regular students for any semester examinations are required to attend 75% of the lectures delivered and the practical classes held separately in each subject of the course of study: provided that a short fall in attendance up to a maximum of 10% can be condoned by the Vice-Chancellor of the University, for satisfactory reasons.

7. Examination Scheme

The examination scheme will be as the recommendation of board of studies of the concerned school adhering to the norms and regulations of Bar Council of India and as amended from time to time with due approval of Academic Council.

8. General

- In matters not covered under this ordinance, general rules of the university shall be applicable, otherwise, the state government / UGC / Statutory body directions shall be applicable.
- In matters of admission, attendance, and examination and in all other matters not provided in this ordinance, the courses shall be governed by the provisions of the relevant ordinances of the same in the university so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance.
- If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of these regulations, the Vice-Chancellor may by order make such provisions not inconsistent with the Act, Statutes, Ordinances or other Regulations, as appears to be necessary or expedient to remove the difficulty.
