ORDINANCE NO. 37**2 YEARS DIPLOMA COURSE IN RADIOTHERAPY TECHNICIAN (DRT)****GENERAL RULE**

These general rules are subject to alterations from time to time (as per the concerned council rules/ Govt. of India, MP State).

Title of the Degree — Diploma in Radiotherapy Technician (DRT).

Name of Faculty — Faculty of Paramedical and Allied Health Sciences

1.0 AIMS AND OBJECTIVES**1.1 AIMS**

1.1.1 Acquisition of adequate theoretical and the practical knowledge and foundation in the basic Pre-clinical, Paraclinical and clinical medical subjects.

1.1.2 Proficiency in the diagnosis and skills of procedures and techniques with adequate theoretical basis and rationale of allied sciences.

1.1.3 To detect and evaluate the anatomical, physiological, radiological impairments, resulting in dysfunction of various age groups & occupation: as well as epidemiological features in the population & arrive at appropriate diagnosis.

1.1.4 To understand the rationale & basic investigative approach to the medical system and surgical intervention regimens & accordingly plan & implement specific radio therapeutic measures effectively.

1.1.5 To practice Professional Autonomy & Ethical principles with referral as well as first contact clients in conformity with ethical code

1.1.6 To practice Moral and Ethical values and Evidence Based Practices.

1.2 OBJECTIVES

The Objective of the course which is complementary to medicine shall be to allow the students

1.2.1 To acquire adequate theoretical & practical knowledge in the basic medical subjects.

1.2.2 To impart Diagnostic procedures with adequate theoretical & practical base.

1.2.3 To enable the student to acquire skills in the evaluation & diagnosis of the physical problems presented by the patients.

1.2.4 To build up a learning process that shall include living experience, problem oriented approach, case studies & community health care activities.

1.2.5 To impart competency in medical measure of specific choice towards Preventive, Curative, Symptomatic & Restorative or Rehabilitative goals in a variety of health care settings.

1.2.6 To develop professional autonomy through independent physical diagnosis and prescription as a technician for all paramedical related referrals and/ or primary clients.

1.2.7 To endorse moral and ethical codes as per international standards and to emphasis on the conduct of professional practice for patient's welfare as the primary responsibility.

1.2.8 To develop confidence in clinical, teaching and administrative assignments and continue to seek further knowledge in the fields of paramedical.

1.2.9 To introduce the students to the fundamentals of paramedical diploma courses.

1.2.10 to teach every aspect of National policies on health and devote himself/ herself to its practical implementation

2.0 Each academic year shall consist of 240 teaching days.

2.1 The Student admitted in Diploma course shall have to complete the course within the maximum permissible duration of 4 years, from the date of admission.

3.0 ACADEMIC QUALIFICATION & SELECTION CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

3.1 Admission to the First year in Diploma course shall be 10+2 system of education in science group or equivalent examination with Chemistry, Physics & Biology, as main subjects conducted by recognized Board/Council/ University with minimum of 50% marks. However for SC/ST/OBC candidate the percentage will be relaxed to 40%

3.2 The candidate should have completed minimum of 17 years of age on/before 31st December of the concerned academic session.

3.3 Selection Criteria: The admission in Diploma- First Year shall be based on the merit of the qualifying examination.

Or

Common Entrance Test (CET), conducted by the University/ any designated agency.

3.4 On admission, every candidate shall have to get fitness certificate from Chirayu Hospital, for physical fitness

4.0 COMMENCEMENT OF COURSE

The course shall be commencing from the month of November of every academic year.

5.0 REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE ASSESSMENT OF ACADEMIC GROWTH OF THE STUDENT

For the assessment of students, the concerned council rules/ Govt. of India, MP State shall be adopted as it is. It shall be done on the basis of Two Sessional Examination (conducted during the year) and one University Examination (conducted at the end of the academic year). The medium of Instruction and Examination shall be English/Hindi throughout the course of the study.

5.1 Attendance

5.1.1 Candidates appearing as regular student for any annual examination are required to attend 75% of the total lecturer's delivered and of the practical classes held separately in each subject of the course of the study.

5.1.2 The total lecture and practical shall be conducted as per scheme and syllabus given in subsequent section.

5.2 Sessional Examinations - Two Sessional Examination shall be conducted for each subject, separately for theory and practical.

5.3 Internal Assessment - The internal assessment for each subject (in Theory and Practical of each academic year shall carry 100 marks.

5.4 University Examination; Theory & Practical

5.4.1 Written Examination

a. The Main Examination shall be held on yearly basis for all the Two years respectively.

b. There shall be 2 University Examination in a year:

Main examination in May/June and Supplementary Examination (1st examination) in October/ November. The succeeding examination shall be held within 6 months.

5.5 Appointment of the Examiners/ Question Paper Setters. The appointment of examiner for the University Examination shall be based on following criteria;

5.5.1 For Theory paper setting and valuation there shall be two examiners for each subject, one Internal Examiner and one External Examiner shall be required. Both the examiners shall be Assistant Professor with: 3 years teaching experience in the concerned subject.

5.5.2 For the Practical examinations there shall be two examiners for each subject, one External Examiner and one Internal Examiner, with minimum qualification and experience of an Assistant Professor with 3 years teaching experience in the concerned subject.

5.5.3 The External Examiner shall be the subject expert from outside the University having Masters/ Post Graduate qualification- in the concerned, subject with minimum 3 years-teaching experience.

5.5.4 The Faculty of the Subject/ Head of the Department with minimum 3 years of teaching experience shall be the Internal Cum-convener examiner for the examinations.

5.6 Criteria for Passing In each subject head (Theory and Practical);

5.6.1 In all the University examinations, the candidates shall have to obtain 50% marks separately in Theory plus Viva Voce plus Internal Assessment and Practical as Internal Assessment examination.

5.6.2 Each theory paper and practical will be treated as separate subject/ head for the passing.

5.6.3 The student shall carry over two subjects from one year to the following year and must pass in the fail subject before appearing in the next year examination. The student shall carry two subjects from first year to second year, second year to third year and must pass in the fail subjects before appearing the next year examination.

5.7 Division and Merit List

5.7.1 The Division shall be awarded after Annual University Examination in each academic year and shall be based on the aggregate marks obtained by the candidates at his/ her successful attempt in annual University Examination.

There shall be Divisions as follows:

Distinction	: 75% and above of grand total marks in First attempt.
First Division	: >60% and <75% of grand total marks in First attempt.
Second Division	: >50% and <60% of grand total marks in First attempt.
Distinction in Individual subject	: >75% marks in individual subject shall be indicated exclusively in the mark sheet provided in First attempt.

5.7.2 The merit shall be declared by the University after the final year University examination, on the basis of the aggregate marks of all academic years in University examination. The merit list shall include the first ten candidates securing at least First Division and passing all the appeared subjects in annual examination in first attempt.

6.0 REVALUATION / RE-TOTALING

6.1 Student may apply for Re-evaluation and/or Re totalling of the answer sheet of the appeared subjects; post result for any doubt in the marks obtained on the following criteria:

6.1.1 Student may go for all the appeared subjects of that session for Re-evaluation as well as Re-totalling simultaneously, with in stipulated time, as prescribed by the University.

7.0 CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION

7.1 The admission of a student at any stage of study shall be cancelled by the Vice Chancellor based, on recommendation of Head of the Institution, if:

7.1.1 He/She is not found qualified as per MP Paramedical Council norms / University and guidelines or the eligibility criteria prescribed by the university.

7.1.2 He/ she is found to have produced false/ forged documents or found to have used unfair means to secure admission.

7.1.3 He/She is found involved in serious breach of discipline in the Institution or in the University campus.

ORDINANCE NO. 38**MASTER OF PHYSIOTHERAPY (MPT)****2 YEAR POST GRADUATION COURSE IN SPORTS/ ORTHOPAEDICS/ NEUROLOGY/
CARDIOTHORACIC/ OBSTETRICS & GYNAECOLOGY/ ONCOLOGY/ GERIATRICS****GENERAL RULE**

These general rules are subject to alterations from time to time (as per the concerned council rules/ Govt. of India, MP State).

Title of the Degree — Diploma in Radiotherapy Technician (DRT).

Name of Faculty — Faculty of Paramedical and Allied Health Sciences.

1.0 AIMS

- 1.1 Acquisition of adequate theoretical and the practical knowledge and foundation in the basic Pre-clinical, Para clinical and clinical medical subjects.
- 1.2 Proficiency in the diagnosis and skills of basic physiotherapy procedures and techniques with adequate theoretical basis and rationale of allied sciences.
- 1.3 To detect and evaluate the anatomical, Patho-physiological impairments, resulting in dysfunction of various age groups & occupation; as well as epidemiological features in the population & arrive at appropriate diagnosis.
- 1.4 To understand the rationale & basic investigative approach to the medical system and surgical intervention regimens & accordingly plan & implement specific Physiotherapists measures effectively.
- 1.5 To practice Professional Autonomy & Ethical principles with referral as well as first contact clients in conformity with ethical code for Physiotherapists.
- 1.6 To practice Moral and Ethical values and Evidence Based Practices with regard to Physiotherapy.

2.0 OBJECTIVES

The objective of the course which is complementary to medicine shall be to allow the students.

- 2.1 To acquire adequate theoretical & practical knowledge in the basic medical subjects.
- 2.2 To impart Electrotherapy & Therapeutic Exercise procedures with adequate theoretical & practical base.
- 2.3 To enable the student to acquire skills in the evaluation & diagnosis of the Physical problems presented by the patients



- 2.4 To build up a learning process that shall include living experience, problem oriented approach, case studies & community health care activities.
- 2.5 To impart competency in Physiotherapeutic measure of specific choice towards Preventive, Curative, Symptomatic & Restorative or Rehabilitative goals in a variety of health care settings.
- **2.6 To develop professional autonomy through independent physical diagnosis and prescription as a physiotherapist for all physiotherapy related referrals and/ or primary clients.
- 2.7 To endorse physiotherapeutic moral and ethical codes as per international standards and to emphasis on the conduct of professional practice for patient's welfare as the primary responsibility.
- 2.8 To develop confidence in clinical, teaching and administrative assignments and continue to seek further knowledge in the fields of physiotherapy.
- 2.9 To introduces the students to the fundamentals of Biostatistics & Physiotherapy Research activities.
- 2.10 To teach every aspect of National policies on health and devote himself/ herself to its practical implementation

3.0 NOMENCLATURE

The branches of study for 2 years shall be

1. Orthopedics
2. Sports
3. Neurology
4. Cardiothoracic
5. Obstetrics & Gynecology
6. Oncology
7. Geriatrics and any other branch of study with approval of board of management of university.

4.0 This ordinance shall apply to the programme and courses leading to the award of postgraduate degrees of Master of Physiotherapy In Sports/Orthopaedics/Neurology/Cardiothoracic/Obstetrics & Gynaecology/Oncology/ Geriatrics as per the norms of Madhya Pradesh Allied and Healthcare Council.

5.0 COURSE OUTLINE

The Master's Degree in Physiotherapy is a two year program consisting of classroom teaching, self-academic activities and clinical posting. In the first year theoretical basis of physiotherapy is refreshed along with research methodology and biostatistics. The students are rotated in all areas of clinical expertise during this period. They are required to choose their study for dissertation and submit a synopsis. During the second year the students will be posted in their area of specialty. They are required to complete and submit their dissertation. The learning program includes seminars, journal reviews, case presentations, case discursions and classroom teaching. Some of the clinical postings are provided at other reputed centers in the country in order to offer a wider spectrum of experience. The students are encouraged to attend conference, workshop to enhance their knowledge during the course of study. University examinations are held at the end of second year.

6.0 ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

Master of Physiotherapy course shall be open to those who have passed 10+2 (Physics, Chemistry, English & Biology) and full time Bachelor of Physiotherapy B.Sc. (PT) or BPT degree from institutions/ any recognized university where the mode of study is a full time regular program, with minimum 3½ years or 4 ½ years duration from this university or any other university in India or abroad as equivalent with not less than 50% of marks in aggregate and have completed 6 months of compulsory rotating internship in Physiotherapy .

In case of SC/ST/OBC students the relaxation of the eligibility percentage for the admission will be as per the Madhya Pradesh state Government rules.

Admission to the course will be as per the performance of the student in the entrance examination; however the student should have minimum 50% aggregate in BPT for appearing in the entrance exam.

7.0 GOALS OF COURSE:

- A. Impartation of education with research basis in order to validate techniques & technology in practice to physiotherapy.
- B. Formation of base of the professional practice by referral as well as first contact mode using evidence based practice.
- C. Preparation of a postgraduate student towards his/her professional autonomy at par with global standards
- D. Acquainting a student with concept of quality care at the institutional as well as the community levels.
- E. Inculcation of appropriate professional relationship in multidisciplinary set up, patient management and co partnership basis.
- F. Preparation of students to address problems related to health education and community physiotherapy.
- G. Practicing the concept of protection of rights of the community during referral as well as first contact practice.
- H. Incorporation of concept of management in physiotherapy.
- I. Experience in clinical training and undergraduate teaching partly.

8.0 DURATION OF COURSE

The duration of the certified study for the Master of physiotherapy shall be full time regular course and its duration shall extend over a period of two continuous academic Years' on a full time basis for the award of the degree. *The student for the award of the MPT degree shall have to qualify in all papers prescribed for the MPT course within a period of FOUR years from the date he/she joined the course.*

9.0 MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION :-

English/Hindi will be the medium of instruction for the subjects of study and for the examination of the MPT course.

10.0 METHODS OF TRAINING:-

The training of postgraduate for MPT degree shall be on a full time pattern with graded responsibilities in the management and treatment of patients entrusted to his / her care. The participation of all the students in all facets of educational process is essential. Every candidate should take part in seminars, group discussions, clinical rounds, care demonstrations, clinics, journal review meetings & CME. Every candidate should be required to participate in the teaching and training programs of undergraduate students. Training should include involvement in laboratory experimental work and research studies.

11.0 MONITORING PROCESS OF STUDIES (INTERNAL MONITORING)

It is essential to monitor the learning progress of each candidate through continuous appraisal and regular assessment. It not only helps teachers to evaluate students, but also students to evaluate themselves. The monitoring is done by the staff of the department based on participation of students in various teaching / learning activities. It may be structured and assessment be done using checklists that assess various aspects.

Work diary: Every candidate shall maintain a work diary and record his/her participation in the training programmes conducted by the department such as journal reviews, seminars etc.

Special mention may be made of the presentations by the candidate as well as details of clinical of laboratory procedures, if any conducted by the candidate. The work diary shall be scrutinized and certified by the Head of the Department and Head of the Institution and presented in the university examination.

Periodic tests: The College may conduct periodic tests. The test may include written theory papers, practical, viva voce and clinical in the pattern of university examination. Records and marks obtained in such tests will be maintained by the Head of Department and sent to the University, when called for.

12.0 ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENT FOR EXAMINATION

A candidate is required to attend a minimum of 75% of training and of the total classes conducted during each academic year of the MPT course. Provided further, leave of any kind shall not be counted as part of academic term without prejudice to minimum 75% of training period every year. Any student who fails to complete the course in this manner shall not be permitted to appear the University Examinations. A candidate who does not satisfy the requirement of attendance even in one subject or more will not be permitted to appear for University Examination. He / She will be required to make up the deficit in attendance to become eligible to take subsequent examination.

13.0 CONDONATION OF ATTENDANCE

Dean/ Principal of the college are empowered to condone 10% of attendance on valid grounds. Monthly attendance of students has to be sent to the university every month from the respective affiliated colleges.

14.0 ADMISSION TO UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION OF MPT COURSE

The candidate admitted in an academic year will be registered to take up their University examination after completion of two academic years.

Subject of first year MPT College/ Institutional examinations; **Basic Medical Sciences & Principles of Physiotherapy Practice, Biomechanics & Kinesiology, Research Methodology & Biostatistics and Educational Methodology** will be common subjects for all the students.

Subjects in second year University Examinations will be as per the elective specialization (Sports / Orthopaedics / Neurology / Cardiothoracic/ Obstetrics & Gynecology) except **Exercise Physiology & Nutrition, Physical Diagnosis & Rehabilitation** which will be common subjects to all the students.

* Advanced Physiotherapeutic would be additional elective subject as per specialization.

15.0 COMMENCEMENT OF THE EXAMINATION

There shall be two university examinations: Main and Supplementary examination as per university notification every year academic year for MPT Final year candidates only. For MPT course (which is of two years duration), the University examination will be held at the end of **second year only**. However, at the end of first academic year, Internal examination will be conducted at the college level itself and the result has to be sent to the University as per the scheduled notification. (These marks will be included in the Final Transcripts), and the students are eligible to appear their final year examination at MPMSU, subject to passing in first year internal examination conducted at college / institution level.

16.0 WORKING DAYS IN AN ACADEMIC CALENDAR / ADMISSIONS:

The admissions of students into various programs should be completed by 30th November. There shall be 240 minimum teaching days in one academic year.

17.0 DISSERTATION

Every candidate pursuing MPT degree course is required to carry out work on a selected research Project under the guidance of a recognized postgraduate teacher. The results of such a work shall be submitted in the form of dissertation.

The dissertation is aimed to train a graduate student in research methods and techniques. It includes identification of a problem, formulation of a hypothesis search and review of literature getting acquainted with recent advances, designing of a research study, collection of data, critical analysis, and comparison of results and drawing conclusions.

Every candidate shall submit to the Registrar of university in the prescribed Performa a synopsis containing particulars of proposed dissertation work within 4 months from the date of commencement of the course or before the dates notified by the university. The synopsis shall be sent through the proper channel. Such synopsis will be reviewed and the university will register the dissertation topic. All the synopses of

Dissertation have to be approved by the Institutional Ethical Committee.

No change in the dissertation topic or guide shall be made without prior approval of the university. Guide will be only a facilitator, advisor of the concept and hold responsible in correctly directing the candidate in the methodology and not responsible for the outcome and results.

The dissertation should be written under the following headings.

1. Introduction
2. Aims or objectives of study
3. Review of literature
4. Material and methods
5. Results
6. Discussion
7. Conclusion
8. References
9. Appendices

The written text of dissertation shall not be less than 50 pages and shall not exceed 100 pages excluding references, tables, questionnaires and other annexure. It should be neatly typed in double line spacing on one side of paper (A4 size, 8.27" x 11.69" and bound properly. Spiral binding should be avoided. The guide, head of the department and head of the institution shall certify the dissertation.

Four copies of dissertation thus prepared shall be submitted to the Registrar (Evaluation), three months before final examination on or before the dates notified by the university.

The examiners appointed by the university shall value the dissertation. **Approval of dissertation work is an essential precondition for a candidate to appear in the university examination.** The dissertation shall be valued by the evaluator (Examiners) apart from the guide out of which one is external outside the institution zone of university/ from other college of the same university. Evaluator acceptance other than the guide will be considered as a precondition for eligibility to take.

18.0 GUIDE

The academic qualification and teaching experience required for recognition by this university is as per the criteria for recognition of MPT teachers for guides.

Criteria for recognition of MPT teacher / guide

1. M.Sc. (PT) /MPT with five years teaching experience working on a full time position at a Recognized institution.

2. The age of guide / teacher shall not exceed 65 years.
3. The guide student ratio should be 1:5

*** Change of Guide

In the event of registered guide leaving the college for any reason or in the event of death of guide, guide may be changed with prior permission from the university.

19.0 For other provision which is not covered in this curriculum & syllabus will be applicable as per the university ordinance.

21.0 Passing Marks of Examination:

The passing marks of examination would be 50% for each subject and also in total marks obtained. The candidate has to pass in theory and practical examination separately. For theory paper the internal assessment marks, viva-voce and theory examination marks will be counted.

The candidate should pass separately in two heads i.e in Theory (Theory plus Viva voce) and also in Practical (with 50% marks).

The candidate has to pass separately in each subject in internal assessment examination (with 50% marks) in order to be eligible to appear in university examinations.

The grace marks shall be allowed according to the general ordinance relating to "Award of Grace Marks".

Regarding Grace Marks it was decided that total weightage of grace marks would be 5 (five), and that grace marks can be split between the subjects. There will not be any grace marks for the Practical examination.

Grace marks will not be added to total marks of the candidate. In Supplementary examination also similar pattern of grace marks will be followed.

22.0 After completion of two academic years of studies he shall not have any privileges of a regular student.

23.0 Successful candidate who obtain 60% or more of the aggregate marks in Part-I and Part- II examination taken together shall be placed in the first division and those who obtain 50% or more but less than 60% shall be placed in the second division.

24.0 A successful candidate of the M.P.T. Part-I and Part- II examination shall be awarded degree in following nomenclature:

M.P.T in Sports Physiotherapy

The reservation and relaxation for SC/ST / Other categories shall be as per the rules of state Govt., whichever is applicable.

Eligibility for Admission to NRI / Other Privileged Candidates:

Non-resident Indian and other privileged candidate shall be eligible for admission to these courses in accordance with the directives of Govt. of India and / or State Government.

For foreign students any other equivalent qualification to be approved by the concerned authority may be allowed.

Admission Procedure:

Admission shall be made on the basis of merit of National Eligibility cum entrance test (NEET) through counselling process by organized by State Govt. or authorized agency in the State. Fees shall have to be remitted by the student in the beginning of every academic year on duly notified date. Candidates failing to deposit the fee in time shall be liable for penalty, as prescribed by the University. Fee structure laid down in the Admission Bulletin of the specific year will remain Session throughout the study in all academic.

Intake

The intake for the course shall be decided by the University from time to time, taking care of the norms of the concerned Regulatory Body.

Academic cycle / year

Academic year for the course of BAMS is of three professional years out of which each professional years is of Eighteen months.

Medium of Instructions and Examination:

The medium of instructions and examination shall be English, Hindi, or Sanskrit.

Examination:

- (a) (i) The First Professional examination shall ordinarily be held and completed by the end of First professional session;
- (ii) The student who failed in one or two subjects of First Professional shall be allowed to keep terms of the Second Professional session and to appear in Second Professional examination;
- (iii) The student who failed in more than two subjects shall not be allowed to keep term in Second Professional session and the subsequent supplementary examination of First Professional shall be held at every six months.
- (b) (i) The Second Professional examination shall ordinarily be held and completed by the end of Second Professional session;
- (ii) the student who failed in one or two subjects of Second Professional shall be allowed to keep the term of the Third (Final) Professional session;
- (iii) The student who failed in more than two subjects shall not be allowed to keep term in third (Final) Professional session and the subsequent supplementary examinations of Second Professional shall be held every six months.
- (c) (i) The Third (Final) Professional examination shall ordinarily be held and completed by the end of Third (Final) Professional session.
- (ii) Before appearing for Third (Final) Professional examination the students shall have to pass all the subjects of first and second professional and
- (iii) Shall qualify nine electives.
- (iv) The subsequent supplementary examination of Third (Final) professional will be held at every six months.
- (d) There shall be no separate class for odd batch students (those students who could not keep the Term) and the student has to attend the class along with regular batch or with

- junior batch as applicable.
- (e) To become eligible for joining the Compulsory Rotatory Internship programme, all three professional examinations shall be passed and qualified in nine electives within a period of maximum ten years from the date of admission.
- (f) The theory examination shall have twenty per cent. Marks for Multiple Choice Questions (MCQ), forty per cent. Marks for Short Answer Questions (SAQ) and forty per cent. Marks for Long Explanatory Answer Questions (LAQ) and these questions shall cover the entire syllabus of the subject.
- (g) The minimum marks required for passing the examinations shall be fifty per cent in theory component and fifty per cent in practical component (that include practical, clinical, viva-voce, internal assessment and electives wherever applicable) separately in each subject.
- (h) **Evaluation of Electives.** - Electives shall be evaluated in terms of attendance and assessment and on the basis of evaluation, the student shall be awarded credits as well as grades as under: -
- (i) one credit shall be awarded for attending minimum five hours of a modular programme and a student can earn maximum five credits for each elective;
- (ii) Assessment shall be conducted at the end of each module and average of five modular assessments shall be considered for grading i.e., up to 25 per cent. Bronze; 26-50 percent. Silver; 51-75 percent. Gold; 76 percent. And above Platinum.
- (iii) The structure of elective shall be as per the following table namely:

- (iv) (a) Student shall have to qualify (obtaining any grade) minimum of three elective subjects for each professional session.
- (b) List of elective subjects shall be made available under three sets (A, B and C) for each professional session i.e., sets FA, FB and FC for first professional B.A.M.S.; sets SA, SB and SC for second professional B.A.M.S.; sets TA, TB and TC for third professional B.A.M.S.
- (c) Students may opt any one elective as per their choice from each set specified for respective professional B.A.M.S.
- (d) Weight age of two marks for each credit and a maximum of ten marks shall be awarded for each elective.
- (e) These elective marks shall be added to the viva-voce marks of respective subjects' as specified in these regulations.
- (f) Apart from three mandatory electives for each profession, students have freedom to choose and qualify as many numbers of additional electives as per their interest.
- (g) Marks weight age shall be only for three electives per professional session i.e., one elective subject from each set of respective professional session.
- (h) A separate online certificate shall be generated for each elective mentioning credit earned and grades obtained.
- (v) The examination branch of the institution shall compile the marks of electives obtained by students as specified above and submit to university through the Head of the Institution so that the university shall add the same in viva-voce of respective subjects as shown in *Tables 6, 8, & 10*
- (i) (i) A candidate obtaining sixty-five per cent. and above marks shall be awarded first class in the subject and seventy-five percent and above marks shall be awarded distinction in the subject.
- (ii) The award of class and distinction shall not be applicable for supplementary examinations.
- (i) (i) Each student shall be required to maintain minimum seventy-five percent attendance in each subject in theory (i.e., lecture hours) practical and clinical (i.e., non-lecture hours) separately for appearing in examination.
- (iii) Where the institute maintains physical attendance register, it shall be recorded in cumulative numbering method as per *Annexure-iv* and attend of the course/term/part of the course, after obtaining each student signature the same is to be certified by respective Head of the Department and approved by Head of the Institute.
- (iv) The approved attendance shall be forwarded to university.
- (k) If a student fails to appear in regular examination for cognitive reasons, he may appear in supplementary examination as regular student and his non-appearance in regular examination shall not be treated as an attempt.
- (l) Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations, -
 - (i) Clause 11(e) shall be applicable to the student who admitted under Indian

Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Regulations, 1986, except electives and as per section 3 of SCHEDULE I (as amended vide notification no. 24-14/2016 (U.G. Regulation) Regulations, 2016) with 4 professionals.

- (ii) Student who got admitted under Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Regulations, 1986, the maximum number of chances and maximum period of years to pass respective professional examination as laid down under the clauses 6(1)(c), 2(d), 3(c), 4(d), and 4(e) of SCHEDULE I (as amended vide notification no. 24-14/2016 (U.G. Regulation) Regulations, 2016) shall not be applicable.

Assessment. -

Assessment of students shall be in the form of Formative and Summative Assessments as under-

- (a) **Formative Assessment.** - Students shall be assessed periodically to assess their performance in the class, determine the understanding of programme material and their learning outcome in the following manner, namely: -
- (i) Periodical Assessment shall be carried out at the end of teaching of a topic or module or a particular portion of syllabus and the evaluation methods as per the following table may be adopted as suits to the content, namely:

- (ii) (a) internal evaluation shall be conducted by the College and Institute at the end of six months (First Term Test) for thirty per cent. of the syllabus and at twelve months (Second Term Test) for forty percent new part of the syllabus. (b) The remaining thirty per cent. of syllabus shall be completed in the last six months (Third Term) before university examination;

- (iii) there shall be minimum three periodical assessments for each subject before First Term Test (ordinarily at 6th month of respective professional B.A.M.S.) minimum of three periodical assessment before Second Term Test (ordinarily at 12th month of respective professional B.A.M.S.) and minimum of three periodical assessments before final university examinations (Summative Assessment) of respective professional B.A.M.S.
- (iv) the scheme and calculation of assessment shall be as per the following tables, namely: -

- (b) **Summative Assessment.** -(i) Final university examinations conducted at the end of each professional B.A.M.S. shall be the Summative Assessment.
(ii) There shall be double valuation system and shall be no provision for revaluation.
(iii) There shall be two examiner (one internal and one external) for university practical/clinical/viva-voice examinations.
(iv) While declaring the results of Summative Assessment, Internal Assessment component and Elective marks shall be considered as per the distribution of marks pattern provided in *Tables 6, 8, & 10*.

Migration of student during the study - (1) The students may be allowed to take the migration to continue their study to another college after passing the First Professional examination, but failed student's transfer and mid-term migration shall not be allowed.
(2) For migration, the students shall have to obtain the mutual consent of both colleges and universities and it shall be against the vacant seat.

Compulsory Rotatory Internship - (a) (i) The duration of Compulsory Rotatory Internship including Internship Orientation Programme shall be one year and ordinarily commence on first working day of April for regular batch students and first working day of October for supplementary batch students.

(ii) The student shall be eligible to join the Compulsory Internship programme after passing all the subjects from First to Third (Final) Professional examination including nine electives and after getting Provisional Degree Certificate from respective universities and Provisional Registration Certificates from respective State Board or Council for Compulsory Rotatory Internship.

(c) Stipend: During internship, to the interns belonging to Central Government, State Government and Union territory institution, the stipend shall be paid at par with

other medical systems under respective government and there shall not be any discrepancy between medical systems.

(ii) Migration during Internship. - (i) Migration of internship shall be with the consent of both the colleges and university; in the case where migration is between the colleges of two different universities.

If migration is only between colleges of the same university, the consent of both the colleges shall be required.

(iii) Migration shall be accepted by the university on the production of the character certificate issued by the institute or college and the application forwarded by the college and university with a 'No Objection Certificate' as the case maybe.

(d) Orientation Programme - (i) The interns shall mandatorily attend an orientation programme regarding internship and it shall be the responsibility of the teaching institution to conduct the orientation before the commencement of the internship.

(ii) The orientation shall be conducted with an intention to make the intern to acquire the requisite knowledge about the Rules and Regulations of the Medical Practice and Profession, Medical Ethics, Medico-Legal Aspects, Medical Records, Medical Insurance, Medical Certification, Communication Skills, Conduct and Etiquette, National and State Health Care Programme.

(iii) The orientation workshop shall be organised at the beginning of internship and a e-log book shall be maintained by each intern, in which the intern shall enter date-wise details of activities undertaken by him during orientation.

(iv) The period of orientation shall be seven days.

(v) The manual for conducting the orientation as prescribed from time to time by the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine shall be followed.

(e) Activities during Internship. - (i) The daily working hours of intern shall be not less than eight hours; the intern shall maintain e-log book containing all the activities undertaken by intern during internship.

(ii) Normally one-year internship shall be as under-

(A) Option I.-Divided into clinical training of six months in the Ayurveda hospital attached to the college and six-months in a Primary Health Centre or Community Health Centre or Rural Hospital or District Hospital or Civil Hospital or any Government Hospital of Modern Medicine or Ayurveda Medicine or NABH (National Accreditation Board for Hospitals) accredited private hospital of Ayurveda. Only OPD-based clinics having NABH accreditation shall not be eligible for internship.

(B) Option II-All twelve-months in Ayurveda hospitals attached to the college.

(iii) The clinical training of six or twelve months, as the case may be, in the Ayurveda hospital attached to the college or in non-teaching hospitals laid down by the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine shall be conducted as per the following table, namely: -

(iv) (a) The interns shall be posted in any of the following centers where National Health Programme are being implemented and these postings shall be to get oriented and acquaint the knowledge of implementation of National Health Programme in regard to, -

- (A) Primary Health Centre;
- (B) Community Health Centre or Civil Hospital or District Hospital;
- (C) Any recognized or approved hospital of Modern Medicine;
- (D) Any recognized or approved Ayurvedic Hospital or Dispensary;
- (E) In a clinical unit of Central Council for Research in Ayurvedic Sciences;

(b) All the above institutes mentioned in clauses (A) to (E) shall have to be recognized by the concerned University or Government designated authority for taking such a training.

(v) The intern shall undertake the following activities in respective department in the hospital attached to the college, namely: -

- (A) Kayachikitsa-The intern shall be practically trained to acquaint with and to make

- him competent to deal with following, namely:
- (i) all routine works such as case taking, investigations, diagnosis and management of common diseases by Ayurvedic medicine;
 - (ii) routine clinical pathological work such as haemoglobin estimation, complete hemogram, urine analysis, microscopic examination of blood parasites, sputum examination, stool examination, *Mutra Evam Mala Pariksha* by Ayurvedic method, interpretation of laboratory data and clinical findings and arriving at a diagnosis and all pathological and radiological investigations useful for monitoring the deterioration of different disease conditions;
 - (iii) training in routine ward procedures and supervision of patients in respect of their diet, habits and verification of medicine schedule.
- (B) **Panchakarma**- The intern shall be practically trained to acquaint with and to make him competent to deal with following, namely:
- (i) Panchakarma & Upakarma procedures and techniques regarding Purva Karma, Pradhan Karma and Pashchat Karma;
 - (ii) management of procedural complications, counselling of patients for procedures, maintenance of the rapy rooms etc.
- (C) **Shalya Tantra**- The intern shall be practically trained acquaint with and to make him competent to deal with following, namely:
- (i) Clinical examination, Diagnosis and Management of common surgical disorders according to Ayurvedic principles;
 - (ii) Management of certain surgical emergencies such as fractures and dislocations, acute abdomen;
 - (iii) Practical training of aseptic and antiseptics techniques, sterilization;
 - (iv) Intern shall be involved in pre-operative and post-operative managements;
 - (v) Practical use of local anaesthetic techniques and use of anaesthetic drugs;
 - (vi) Radiological procedures, clinical interpretation of X-ray, Intra Venous Pyelogram, Bariummeal, Sonography and Electro Cardio Gram;
 - (vii) surgical procedures and routine ward techniques such as-
 - (a) suturing of fresh injuries;
 - (b) dressing of wounds, burns, ulcers and similar ailments;
 - (c) incision and drainage of abscesses;
 - (d) excision of cysts;
 - (e) venesection;
 - (f) application of Ksharasutrainano -- rectal diseases; and
 - (g) rakthamokshana, Agnikarma, Ksharakarma
- (D) **Shalakya Tantra**-The intern shall be practically trained to acquaint with and to make him competent to deal with following, namely:
- (i) Diagnosis and management of common surgical disorders according to Ayurvedic principles;

- (ii) Intern shall be involved in Pre-operative and Post-operative managements;
 - (iii) Surgical procedures in Ear, Nose, Throat, Dental problems, Ophthalmic problems;
 - (iv) examinations of Eye, Ear, Nose, Throat and Refractive Error with the supportive instruments in Out-Patient Department; and
 - (v) all kriyakalpas, Nasya, Raktamokshan, Karnapuran, Shirodhara, Putpak, Kawal, Gandushat Out-Patient and In patient Department level.
 - (E) **Prasuti Tantra & Stree Roga**- The intern shall be practically trained to acquaint with and to make him competent to deal with following, namely:
 - (i) Antenatal and post-natal problems and their remedies, antenatal and post-natal care;
 - (ii) management of normal and abnormal labours; and
 - (iii) minor and major obstetric surgical procedures including Yoni Purna, Yoni Pichu, Uttarbasti, etc.
 - (iv) All routine works such as case taking, investigations, diagnosis and management of common striroga by Ayurvedic medicine;
 - (v) Screening of common carc in omatous conditions in women.
 - (F) **Kaumarbhritya**: The intern shall be practically trained to acquaint with and to make him competent to deal with following, namely:
 - (i) Care of new born along with immunization programme including Svanaprashana;
 - (ii) Important pediatric problems and their Ayurvedic management;
 - (iii) Panchakarma in children.
 - (G) **Swasthavritta and Yoga**- The intern shall be practically trained to acquaint with and to make him competent to deal with following, namely:
 - (i) Programme of prevention and control of locally prevalent endemic diseases including nutritional disorders, immunisation, management of infectious diseases, etc.;
 - (ii) Family welfare planning programme;
 - (iii) Aahar and Vihar Parikalpana including dinacharya, sadvritta (Lifestyle and diet counseling daily seasonal routines); and
 - (H) the practice of Ashtanga Yoga.
- Atyayikchkitisa (Emergency or Casualty Management)**-The intern shall be practically trained to acquaint with and to make him competent to deal with all emergency conditions and participate actively in casualty section of the hospital in identification of casualty and trauma cases and their first aid treatment and also procedure for referring such cases to the identified hospitals.
- (vi) The intern shall complete online programme on public health as laid down by the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), in addition to the irregular duties.
 - (vii) The internship training in Primary Health Centre or Community Center or Rural

Hospital or District Hospital or Civil Hospital or any Government Hospital of modern medicine or Ayurvedic Hospital or Dispensary- During the six months internship training in Primary Health Centre or Rural Hospital or Community Health Centre or District Hospital or any recognised or approved hospital of Modern Medicine or Ayurvedic Hospital or Dispensary, the interns shall-

- (A) Get acquainted with routine of the Primary Health Centre and maintenance of their records;
- (B) Get acquainted with the diseases more prevalent in rural and remote areas and their management;
- (C) Involve in teaching of healthcare methods to rural population and also various immunization programme,
- (D) get acquainted with the routine working of the medical or non-medical staff of Primary Health Centre and be always in contact with the staff in this period;
- (E) get familiarized with the work of maintaining the relevant register like daily patient register, family planning register, surgical register, etc. and take active participation in different Government health schemes or programme;
- (F) participate actively in different National Health Programme implemented by the State Government.

(viii) **Electronic Logbook-** (a) It shall be compulsory for an intern to maintain the record of procedures done/assisted/observed by him on a day-to-day basis in a specified e-logbook and the intern shall maintain a record of work, which is to be verified and certified by the Medical Officer or Head of the Unit or Department under whom he works.

(b) Failure to produce e-logbook, complete in all respects duly certified by the concerned authority to the Dean/Principal/Director at the end of Internship Training Programme, may result in cancellation of his performance in any or all disciplines of Internship Training Programme.

(c) The institution shall retain softcopy of the completed and certified-logbook and is to be made available for verification.

(ii) **Evaluation of Internship-** (A) The evaluation system shall assess the skills of a candidate while performing the minimum number of procedures as enlisted with an objective that successful learning of the procedures will enable the candidates to conduct the same in his actual practice.

(B) The evaluation shall be carried out by respective Head of Department at the end of each posting and the reports shall be submitted to Head of the institute.

(C) On completion of one year of compulsory rotatory internship including online course on Public Health, the Head of the Institute evaluate all the assessment reports in the prescribed Form-I under *Annexure-i*, provided by various Head of the Department at the end of respective posting and if found satisfactory, the intern shall be issued

- f. No clues to the University, Hostels, Libraries. NCC NSS etc. and
- g. No disciplinary action is pending against him.

Attendance Requirement:

4) Course Name — LLM (Full Time)

4.1) Duration – Two years (Four Semesters) - for Regular Course.

4.2) Eligibility for Admission:

Candidate who have passed the duly recognized following examination:-

- i) Candidate must have a LLB degree from a recognized university with minimum 50% aggregate marks (45% for Only SC/ST Category).

Note: Candidate who is appearing or has appeared for any qualifying examination during the current academic session as a regular or a private candidate can also apply for admission on provisional basis, subject to the condition that the candidate must pass the qualifying examination with require percentage of marks or equivalent grade with in time limit specified by Govt. of MP.

 - 3.1) Master of Commerce (MCom) Programme shall be quoted simply Programme hereafter in this ordinance, subject to the recommendation of the respective Board of Studies and as per norms of the concerned Regulatory Authority.
 - 3.2) The Board of Studies is authorized to recommend further additions/ alterations in this Ordinance with the approval of MPPURC and Government of M.P.
 - 3.3) The Degree will include areas of study/subjects/specializations as recommended by the Academic Council and concerned Board of Studies of the University as per the norms of the concerned regulatory authority.

4) Course Name — MCom (Full Time)

- 4.1) Duration -Two years (Four semesters) - for Regular Course.
- 4.2) Eligibility for Admission:

Candidate who have passed the duly recognized following examination:-

- i) For admission in MCom minimum eligibility shall be kept as per Regulatory Bodies norms.
- ii) The university may conduct its own entrance examination/counseling for admission to the course for the eligible candidates.
- iii) The candidate may get direct admission to the program on the basis of merit of qualifying exam.
- iv) Obtained at least 50% marks (45% marks in case of candidates belonging to reserved category)/ or equivalent in the qualifying examination from recognized university.

Note: Candidate who is appearing or has appeared for any qualifying examination during the current academic session as a regular or a private candidate can also apply for admission on provisional basis, subject to the condition that the candidate must pass the qualifying examination with require percentage of marks or equivalent grade with in time limit specified by Govt. of MP.

5) Admission Procedure —

The eligible candidates as specified in clause 4 above, should secure a place in the merit list prepared on the basis of academic credentials or through the University entrance test/examination consisting of Aptitude Test/ Group Discussion/ Personal Interview or through Counselling or the University may also use the score card of various competitive entrance test/ examination results of various Institute/Board/University/other Professional Bodies/ Organizations or any other mode as decided by the UGC/other relevant Regulatory Bodies from time to time.

6) Specialization Distribution—

Admission to a particular stream/ specialization of MCom Course/ Programme shall be decided by the University on the basis of either merit or counseling or personal interview. Details of the process will be announced well in advance.

7) Number of Seats/Intake—

The Intake for each of these courses shall be decided by the University as per guidelines of concerned regulatory body.

8) Course Structure—

The Course structure shall be as per the recommendation of the concerned Board of Studies of the Faculty of the University duly approved by the Academic Council. The directives of the regulatory bodies will be followed.

9) Maximum Duration of Completion of Course—

A candidate has to complete the entire course of MCom Degree ordinarily within a maximum period of Four years (as amended time to time) from the session of first admission. However, for any exceptional case the matter shall be decided by the University as per the provisions of relevant rules and regulations.

10) Commencement—

- i. Each academic year shall comprise of 2 semesters
- ii. Odd semesters (I, and III) shall commence during the period of July- December every year while even semesters (II and IV) shall commence during the period of January - June every year.
- iii. Each semester shall be spread over not less than 90 teaching days.

11) Fee Structure —

- i. All the fees categories including Programme fee and the examination fee shall be determined by the University from time to time, and shall be payable by the students at the beginning of each year/ trimester the fee structure shall be determined in consultation with the Madhya Pradesh Private University Regulatory Commission.
- ii. Registrar shall notify the quantum of fees payable and the schedule of registration before the commencement of the Programme.
- iii. Cancellation and refund of fees will be as per directive of the state govt/regulatory authorities.

External component will be end semester/annual examination consist of questions, practical/cases etc. as per specified in syllabus.
- 15) Eligibility for Degree—Eligibility for Award of the MCom Degree.
A student shall be declared to be eligible for award of the Degree with various specializations if he/she has:
- Registered and successfully completed internal & external component of all subjects of core courses, optional and specialized Courses, Management Lab classes/practices. Including Seminars, Workshops, Presentations, Group Discussion, Field Work, Industrial Visit, Industrial training, Paper presentation & Publications, Project Work, Dissertation/ Thesis and other Assignments etc, whichever applicable.
 - Successfully acquired the minimum required credits as specified in the regulation corresponding to the branch of his/ her study within the stipulated time wherever applicable
 - Earned the specified credits in all the categories of subjects if applicable
 - Secured a minimum 5.0 CGPA in aggregate overall and 4.0 CGPA in each individual paper. However the award of the Division/Class shall be as per recommendation of concerned Board of Studies of the university.
- 16) General instruction -
- The admission to all kinds of MCom Course shall be governed in accordance and provisions with the Rules/Directives of UGC/ relevant Regulatory Body or any other competent Authority of the Govt. of India/ State Government as amended time to time.
 - The relaxation in eligibility conditions, age and reservation etc. shall be in accordance with the Rules/Directives of UGC/relevant Regulatory Body or any other competent Authority of the Govt. of India/ State Government as amended time to time.
 - For matters not covered in this specific ordinance, decision of Vice Chancellor of the university shall be applicable. In other matters, Board of Management of the university shall be competent to take any decision which shall be final.
 - Notwithstanding anything stated in this Ordinance for any unforeseen issues arising and not covered by this Ordinance or in the event of differences of interpretation, the Vice-Chancellor may take a decision after obtaining, if necessary, the opinion/advice of a Committee, consisting of the Head/Dean of the concerned department. The decision of the Vice-Chancellor shall be final.
- 17) All MCom programmes with various specializations (Accounts and Finance, Economics, Investment Management, Banking and Insurance, Taxation, Human Resource, Financial Market, Computer Application, E-Commerce, etc.) at present & in future shall run and be governed by concerned Board of Studies and after approval of Academic Council and Board of Management of the University
- 18) These programmes are offered in regular mode by the Faculty of Commerce/ Chirayu School of Commerce, by the concerned Board of Studies and after approval of Academic Council and Board of Management of the University.

MASTER OF SCIENCE (MSc)

2-YEARS MASTER DEGREE IN SCIENCE

- 1) Title of the Degree — Master of Science (MSc)
- 2) Name of Faculty / School — Faculty of Sciences/ Chirayu School of Sciences.
- 3) Course Applicability —
 - 3.1) Master of Science (MSc) Programme shall be quoted simply Programme hereafter in this ordinance, subject to the recommendation of the respective Board of Studies and as per norms of the concerned Regulatory Authority.
 - 3.2) The Board of Studies is authorized to recommend further additions/ alterations in this Ordinance with the approval of MPPURC and Government of M.P.
 - 3.3) The Degree will include areas of study/subjects/specializations as recommended by the Academic Council and concerned Board of Studies of the University as per the norms of the concerned regulatory authority.
- 4) Course Name — MSc (Full Time)
 - 4.1) Duration - Two years (Four semesters) - for Regular Course
 - 4.2) Eligibility for Admission:

Candidate who have passed the duly recognized following examination:-

 - i) For admission in MSc minimum eligibility shall be kept as per Regulatory Bodies norms
 - ii) The university may conduct its own entrance examination/counseling for admission to the course for the eligible candidates.
 - iii) The candidate may get direct admission to the program on the basis of merit of qualifying exam.
 - iv) Obtained at least 50% marks (45% marks in case of candidates belonging to reserved category)/ or equivalent in the qualifying examination from recognized university

Note: Candidate who is appearing or has appeared for any qualifying examination during the current academic session as a regular or a private candidate can also apply for admission on provisional basis, subject to the condition that the candidate must pass the qualifying examination with require percentage of marks or equivalent grade with in time limit specified by Govt. of MP.

However, all MSC' programmes with various specializations at present & in future shall run and be governed by concerned Board of Studies and after approval of Academic Council and Board of Management of the University
- 18) These programmes are offered in regular mode by the Faculty of Sciences/ Chirayu School of Sciences, by the concerned Board of Studies and after approval of Academic Council and Board of Management of the University.

ORDINANCE NO. 62
MASTER OF SOCIAL WORK (M.S.W.)
2-YEARS MASTER DEGREE PROGRAMME

- 1) **Title of the Degree – Master of Social Work (M.S.W.)**
- 2) **Name of Faculty / School – Faculty of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences/Chirayu School of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences.**
- 3) **Course Applicability –**
 - 3.1) **2 - Years Master of Social Work (M.S.W.) Degree Program** shall be quoted simply 'Program' hereafter in this ordinance, subject to the recommendation of the respective Board of Studies and as per norms of the concerned Regulatory Authority.
 - 3.2) The Board of Studies is authorized to recommend further additions/alterations in this Ordinance with the approval of MPPURC and Government of M.P.
 - 3.3) The Degree will include areas of study / subject / specialization as recommended by the Academic Council and concerned Board of Studies of the University.
- 4) **Eligibility For Admission :**

Candidate who have passed duly recognized following examination:-

 - i) Graduate in relevant subjects (also securing minimum pass marks in these subjects as per the norms of regulatory authority/council) from any recognized University would be mandatory for admission in **Master of Social Work (MSW) program.**
 - Notwithstanding anything contained in the above-mentioned rules, the eligibility criteria will be as decided by the Governing Body and the Academic Council from time to time, in accordance with the concerned Regulatory Authority.
 - Admissions shall be according to the criteria made by the Admission Committee and the concerned Regulatory Authority.

Note: Candidate who is appearing or has appeared for any qualifying examination during the current academic session as a regular or a private candidate can also apply for admission on provisional basis, subject to the condition that the candidate must pass the qualifying examination with require percentage of marks or equivalent grade.

- 5) **Admission Procedure –**
Admissions shall take place on the criteria approved by the Admission Committee and Vice Chancellor.
- 6) **Specialization Distribution–**
Admission to the particular branch of study shall be as decided by the University on the basis of counselling/ personal interview.
- 7) **Number of Seats–**
Number of seats will be decided from time to time by the University Academic Council or as per guidelines of the concerned Regulatory Authority and other statutory bodies as and where applicable.
- 8) **Duration & Commencement –**
i. Scheduled period for the completion of the Program is 2 years.
ii. Maximum duration of Program completion is 4 years.
iii. Each Academic year shall comprise of 2 semesters each.
iv. The Program shall generally commence in July/August every year. Barring exceptional circumstances.
v. Each semester shall be spread over not less than 90 teaching days
vi. Ten day vacation as semester break shall be granted to the students between two semesters.
- 9) **Course Structure –**
Course structure shall be as per the recommendation of the concerned Board of studies of the faculty of the University duly approved by the Academic Council.
- 10) **Fee Structure –**
i. All the fees categories including Program fee and the examination fee shall be determined by the University from time to time and shall be payable by the students at the beginning of each semester/ year.
ii. Registrar shall notify the quantum of fees payable and the schedule of registration before the start of each semester/ years.
iii. Fees, once paid, and if student has started attending the classes, will not be refundable in any case except for the caution money. In some cases of genuine hardship, the Vice-Chancellor may permit an extension in the last date of payment of fees however; all the students shall be required to pay the prescribed fee before the start of examination. In case any student has been allowed to appear in the

examination, the result of such student shall be withheld till all his dues are cleared.

- iv. The fees shall be applicable as per approval of Board of Management from time to time with the approval of MPPIIRC.

11) Medium of Instruction-

Medium of instruction and examinations would be English/Hindi as per the choice filled by the student, in accordance to the guidelines prescribed by regulatory authority.

12) Attendance-

Regular students, to be eligible to appear in the University examination, are required to attend a minimum of 75% theory classes and 75% practical classes, in each semester/year. **Provided that**, in case of illness or because of other reasonable cause it shall be relaxed by the Vice Chancellor as admissible within applicable regulations.

13) Examination-

- i. Examinations will be conducted as per the appropriate Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations made in this respect. The scheme of examination, promotion to subsequent semesters/ years and course of studies shall be as per the recommendations of the concerned Board of Studies with due approval of Academic Council.
- ii. The studies and examination of these courses shall be on the basis of either marks/ marks-cum-credit/ credit system as recommended by the concerned Board of Studies from time to time.

14) Eligibility for Degree-Eligibility for Award of the M.S.W. Degree-

A student shall be declared to be eligible for award of the M.S.W. Degree if he/ she has:

- i. Registered and successfully completed all subjects of core courses, optional and specialized Courses, Lab classes/practices, Including Seminars, Workshops, Presentations, Group Discussion, Field Work, Industrial Visit, Industrial training, Paper presentation & Publications, Project Work, Dissertation/ Thesis and other Assignments etc. whichever applicable.
- ii. Successfully acquired the minimum required marks/ marks-cum-credit/ credit system as specified in the regulation corresponding to the branch of his/her study within the stipulated time, where ever applicable.

- iii. Secured a minimum required marks/ marks-cum-credit/ credit system in aggregate overalls specified in the regulation. However the award of the Division/Class shall be as per recommendation of concerned Board of Studies of the University.
- iv. No dues to the University, Hostels, Libraries, NCC/NSS etc, and
- v. No disciplinary action is pending against him/her.

15) General Instruction-

- i. The admission to the M.S.W. Courses shall be governed in accordance and provisions with the Rules/Directives of UGC/relevant Regulatory Body or any other competent Authority of the Govt. of India/ State Government as amended time to time.
- ii. The relaxation in eligibility conditions, age and reservation etc. shall be in accordance with the Rules/Directives of UGC/relevant Regulatory Body or any other competent Authority of the Govt. of India/ State Government as amended time to time.
- iii. For matters not covered in this specific ordinance, General rules and regulations of the university regarding specific courses shall be applicable. In other matters Board of Management of the university shall be competent to take any decision which shall be final.
- iv. Notwithstanding anything stated in this Ordinance for any unforeseen issues arising and not covered by this Ordinance or in the event of differences of interpretation, the Vice-Chancellor may take a decision after obtaining, if necessary, the opinion/advice of a Committee, consisting of the Principal/Dean of the concerned department. The decision of the Vice-Chancellor shall be final.

- 16) The various specializations in the M.S.W. programmes in the Faculty of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences/ Chirayu School of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences, and other faculties shall include the traditional as well as innovative areas of various spheres of knowledge's linked/ related with Public Health, Rural Development, Anthropology, Public Administration, Social Research, Sociology, Social Science, Law & Management as proposed by the concerned Board of Studies and duly approved by the Academic Council.**
- 17) These programmes are offered by the Faculty of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences/ Chirayu School of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences, recommended by**

the concerned Board of Studies and after approval of Academic Council and Board of Management of the University.

- 18) In future, more branches/ specializations/ courses/ programmes of (M.S.W.) can also be offered, keeping in view of new innovations, thrust areas of Government policies and demand of the industry/ society shall run under this ordinance, on the recommendations of the concerned Board of Studies, from time to time, by the University, in its various faculties/ departments/ centers/ institutes located in University campus.
- 19) The University shall also offer more number of Two Years Master degree programmes with the various specialization titles which, shall run under this ordinance on the recommendation of concerned Board of Studies, of University alone and/or in collaboration with or tie-up with other Educational or Academic Institutes/Organizations/ Universities/ Research Organizations/ Industries and to provide the dissemination of Knowledge to all concerned throughout the World.
- 20) This Ordinance shall be applicable to (M.S.W.) & all others Two Years Master Degree Courses/ Programme in **Social Work & Sociology** and related/allied streams, except those for which the University has separate Ordinances. The courses mentioned in this ordinance shall run under this ordinance.

ORDINANCE NO. 63***Ordinance for three/four years Undergraduate Degree
(Choice Based Credit System, Semester Mode)***

(This ordinance is framed as per the "Guidelines for Multiple Entry and Exit in Academic Programmes offered in Higher Education Institutions" issued by UGC, New Delhi under National Education Policy 2020)

1. The provisions of this Ordinance shall be applicable from the academic session 2024-25.
2. The provisions of this Ordinance shall apply to the three-year/six-semester Bachelor's degree or four-year/eight-semester Bachelor's degree (Honours/Research) undergraduate programmes such as Bachelor of Arts (B.A.), Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.), Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.), Bachelor of Computer Application (B.C.A.), Bachelor of Business Administration (B.B.A.), Bachelor of Home Science (B.H.Sc.), Bachelor of Social Work (BSW), Bachelor of Physical Education and Sports (B.P.E.S.) and other similar Undergraduate programmes notified by the University. All concerned councils and state rules shall be applicable to these programmes and other similar programmes from time to time.
3. The Ordinance shall be applicable to all such programmes being run by the University in its Teaching Departments (UTDs) and its constituent colleges for their students.
4. The University will frame admission rules and guidelines for admission to these programmes in its UTDs/SOS. Admission to the 4th year (Level 8) shall be available only in the institutions offering a 4-year Undergraduate Programme. The State Govt. will frame admission rules and guidelines for admission to these programmes in autonomous colleges. Autonomous colleges with NAAC grade "A" or above can frame their admission guideline completely based on merit subject to the Government's reservation policy.
5. Students who have completed Grade 12 School Leaving Certificate from Board of Secondary Education, Madhya Pradesh, Bhopal, or an equivalent examination from any other board recognised by the State Government/University will be eligible for admission to these undergraduate programmes.
6. The admission shall be made on merit calculated on the basis of criteria notified by the university/state govt., as the case may be, keeping in view the guidelines/norms in this regard issued by the UGC and other statutory bodies concerned and taking into account the reservation policy issued by the Government from time to time.
7. Student enrolment in a programme/course shall be restricted to the seats allotted by the

University/State Government.

8. The in-take capacity shall be determined in advance by the University/autonomous college following the guidelines/norms in this regard issued by the State Government/UGC and other statutory the University may earmark a maximum of 10% of the seats sanctioned for the previous year of the programme for lateral entrants in the *second/third/fourth year* depending upon the academic and physical facilities available. Students who have completed the first/second/third year of the same programme in any other institution are permitted to re- enter into the programme after a break in studies.
9. To enable multiple entry and exit points in the academic programmes, qualifications such as Certificate, Diploma, and Degree are organized in a series of levels in an ascending order from level 5 to level 8. Level 5 represents Certificate and level 8 represents Bachelor Degree (Honours/Research) qualification (Table 1). The four-year undergraduate programme shall comprise courses under the following subjects/categories:
 - i) Disciplinary/interdisciplinary Major (Core Course) (56 credits)
 - ii) Disciplinary/interdisciplinary Minor (26 credits)
 - iii) Generic Elective (18 credits)
 - iv) Skill Enhancement Courses/Vocational Courses (12 credits)
 - v) Ability Enhancement Courses/Foundation courses (24 credits)
 - vi) Field projects/internship/apprenticeship/community engagement and service/research project (24 credits)

NB for BBA/BCA/B.H.Sc. and like programmes, a group/subject shall be chosen as Major/ Minor/Generic Elective.

Qualification and Credit Requirements are given in Table. 1. The *entry and exit* options for students, who enter the undergraduate programme, are as follows:

1st Year (First & Second Semester- Level 5)

Entry 1: The entry requirement for Level 5 is successful completion of Class 12 from M.P. Board of Secondary Education, Bhopal, or an equivalent examination from any other board recognised by the State Government/University. A programme of study leading to entry into the first year of the Bachelor's degree is open to those who have met the admission requirements.

Exit 1: If a student pass all the courses of Level 5 and earns requisite number of credits, the student will become entitled to an *Undergraduate certificate in the faculty of her/his Major Subject*. If she/he wants to exit, can exit the programme with *Undergraduate certificate* in hand.

2nd Year (Third & Fourth Semester –Level 6)

Entry 2. The entry requirement for *Level 6 is the successful completion of Level 5*. A programme of study leading to the second year of the Bachelor's degree is open to those who have met the admission requirements.

Exit 2: If a student passes all the courses of Level 5&6 and earns requisite number of credits, the student becomes entitled to an *Undergraduate Diploma in the faculty of her/his Major Subject*. If she/he wants to exit, can exit the programme with *Undergraduate Diploma* in hand. A diploma requires 80 credits with 40 credits in each of the two levels.

3rd Year (Fifth and Sixth Semester – Level 7)

Entry 3. The entry requirement for *Level 7 is successful completion of Level 5&6*. A programme of study leading to the Bachelor's degree is open to those who have met the admission requirements.

Exit 3: If the student passes all the courses of Level 5 to 7 i.e., first to six semesters and earns the requisite number of credits, the student becomes entitled to the *Undergraduate Degree in the faculty of her/his Major Subject*. A Bachelor's degree requires 120 credits from level 5 to 7, with 40 credits at level 5, 40 credits at level 6, and 40 credits at level 7.

4th Year (Seventh and Eight Semester --Level 8)

Entry 4. An individual seeking admission to a *Bachelor's degree (Honours/Research) (Level 8)* in a specified field of learning would have completed all requirements of the relevant *three-year bachelor degree (Level 7)*. After completing the requirements of a three-year Bachelor's degree, candidates who meet a minimum CGPA of 7.5 shall be allowed to continue studies in the fourth year of the undergraduate programme to pursue and complete the Bachelor's (Honours/ Research) degree.

Exit 4: If the student passes all the courses of level 5 to 8 and earns the requisite credits, the student becomes entitled to an *Undergraduate Degree (Honours/Research) in the faculty of her/his Major Subject*. A Bachelor's degree (Honours/Research) requires a total of 160 credits from level 5 to 8, with 40 credits at level 5, 40 credits at level 6, 40 credits at level 7, and 40 credits at level 8.

The University will award the credits. The credit can be calculated as follows:

- One hour of theory or one hour of tutorial or two hours of laboratory work per week for duration of 15 weeks resulting in the award of one credit;
- Credits for internship shall be *one credit per week* of training, subject to a *maximum of 12 credits in a year*.

10. The minimum duration of the *undergraduate degree programme* shall be of three academic years/six semesters, whereas that of *undergraduate degree leading to Honours/Research* shall be of four academic years/eight semesters.

- A student who leaves the course anytime in the middle of the programme will retain the credits earned so far, which will be restored/transferred as and when she/he enters the programme again.
- The maximum duration for completing the Undergraduate Degree and Undergraduate Degree (Honours/Research) programme for regular students shall be of 6 and 8 years, respectively; there shall be no such bar for non-collegiate (private) students.

11. TYPES OF COURSES

Each of the subject/categories (i) to (v) as specified in clause 10 shall comprise of courses. Courses are the basic units of education and/or training. Types of courses shall be as follows:

(i)

11.1. Core Course: Such courses, which shall compulsorily be studied by the student as a core requirement of the programme are known as core courses.

11.2. Elective Course:

Generally a course, which the student can choose from a pool of courses, which is specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure of some other discipline/subject/domain to nurture the candidate's proficiency or skill is called an Elective Course.

11.2.1 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course:

Elective courses offered from the main discipline/subject of study are referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).

11.2.2 Dissertation/Project:

An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a student studies such course independently with advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project. It is considered a special course involving the application of knowledge in solving/analyzing/exploring a real-life situation /difficult problem for a bachelor degree with honours/research. A Project/Dissertation work would be of credits, as decided by the competent body. The student will do this work under the guidance of a faculty member.

11.2.3 Generic Elective (GE) Course:

An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject with an intention to seek exposure of other fields is called a Generic Elective course.

11.3 Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):

The Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) are of two types:

- Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) or foundation courses
- Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) or Vocational Courses.

"AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement, such as;

- Environmental Education

- English/Hindi Communication is mandatory for all disciplines.

SEC courses are value-based/skill-based and may also be designed to focus on enhancement of skills pertaining to the Major Subject. They are aimed to provide hands-on training, competencies, skills, etc.

- 11.4** The syllabus for a specific programme will be decided by the concerned Board of Studies of the University/Autonomous college/Central Board of Studies (CBS) constituted as per Clause 34A of the MP University Act, 1973. The allowed deviation from the CBS prescribed syllabus for BOS of University/autonomous colleges will be 20% at the maximum.

12. STRUCTURE FOR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME: ANNUAL SYSTEM/ SEMESTER SYSTEM

12.1. First Year (FIRST AND SECOND SEMESTER-Level 5):

A student shall be declared to have successfully completed the Level 5, if he/she acquires 12 credits in core courses of the major subject, 6 credits in core course of the minor subject, 6 credits in Elective/generic elective, 4 credits in SEC/Vocational Course, and 8 credits in Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC)/Foundation course, and 4 credits in Field Projects/ Internship/apprenticeship/community engagement and services.

The student can choose his/her major, minor subjects and the generic/ elective subject if he/she fulfils the pre-requisites prescribed by the concerned Board of Studies. A student passing Grade 12 with science can take admission in Level 5 with major and minor subjects from science/arts/commerce faculty; a student passing grade 12 with commerce faculty can take major and minor subjects from commerce/arts faculty, whereas a student passing grade 12th with arts faculty can choose major and minor subjects from arts faculty only. Major and Minor subjects shall belong to the same faculty (which will be called as the Main faculty), whereas generic elective subjects can be chosen from any faculty. However, allotment of choices will be subject to the provisions of admission guidelines.

12.2. Second Year (Third and Fourth semester-Level 6):

A student shall be declared to have successfully completed Level 6, if he/she acquires 12 credits in core courses of the major subject, 6 credits in core course of the minor subject, 6 credits in generic elective and 4 credits in SEC/Vocational Course, 8 credits in AEC/Foundation course, and 4 credits in

Field Projects/ internship/apprenticeship/community engagement and services.

The student shall be given a single chance at the entry of level 6 to interchange the major and minor subjects. However, in such cases, it will be the students' responsibility to earn additional credits to fulfil the minimum requirement of credits prescribed for the major course. Only after fulfilment of such credits he/she will be entitled to earn an Undergraduate Diploma or an Undergraduate Degree.

12.3. Third Year (Fifth and Sixth Semester -Level 7):

A student shall be declared to have successfully completed Level 7, if he/she acquires 12 credits in discipline specific elective courses of the major subject, 6 credits in core course of the minor subject, 6 credits in Elective/generic elective, 4 credits in SEC/Vocational Course, 8 credits in AEC/Foundation course, 4 credits in Field Projects/internship/apprenticeship/community engagement and services, preferably related to major and/or minor subjects.

12.4. Fourth Year (Seventh and Eight Semester- Level 8):

(a) Bachelor with Honours:

A student shall be declared to have successfully completed the Level 8 for Bachelor with Honours degree, if he/she acquires 20 credits in discipline specific elective courses of the Major subject, 4 credits course in Research Methodology, 4 credits in dissertation, and 12 credits in field project/internship/apprenticeship related to the major subject.

(b) Bachelor with Research:

A student shall be declared to have successfully completed the Level 8 for Bachelor with Research degree, if he/she acquires 20 credits in Major, 4 credits in Minor, 4 credits course in Research Methodology, 4 credits in Minor subject, and 12 credits in the research project and disciplinary/interdisciplinary Undergraduate thesis related to the major subject.

The nomenclature of degrees shall strictly conform to the relevant provisions of the act/regulations/guidelines of the UGC.

12.5. Additional Courses:

In the categories of minor subject, generic elective and skill enhancement courses/vocational courses, a student may earn up to 6 credits per year in the entire tenure of the 3-year undergraduate degree programme from universities/institutions/platforms recognized by central government or the state government for credit transfer.

12.6. (A) A student may change the generic elective subject in each year of the 3-year

undergraduate degree programme.

(B) A Student may change the vocational course in each year or may study the same vocational course in each year of three year undergraduate program.

13. Choice to Select the MOOC Courses:

- a. The UTD/SOS/ Autonomous College can allow up to 40% of the total credits being offered in a particular programme in a semester through the online learning courses provided under SWAYAM platform or any other MOOC platform recognised by the central Government or the state government for credit transfer.
- b. The students will have the choice to opt elective-generic/Skill Enhancement/Ability Enhancement courses from the courses available within the UTD/Autonomous College or in other UTDs of the same universities but from same level of the programmes. An alternate choice will also be available to the students to opt for courses from Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) available at SWAYAM (Study Webs of Active-Learning for Young Aspiring Minds) platform with the permission of the UTD/autonomous college.
- c. The UTDs/ Autonomous College shall offer elective-generic courses in each programme on merit basis across the disciplines. The number of seats in the course will depend on available facilities in the UTD/ Autonomous College.
- d. The students can also opt for a course under DSE of Major subject from Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) available at SWAYAM platform.
- e. The University/ Autonomous College will decide to allow the online courses of SWAYAM if:
 - (i) The courses offered on SWAYAM would supplement the teaching-learning process in the institution.
 - (ii) Every student opting for a course available on SWAYAM platform would be required to register for the course at SWAYAM. The student will pay the stipulated fee to SWAYAM for registering the course, if required.
 - (iii) While allowing the online learning courses offered by SWAYAM, it shall be ensured that the physical facilities like laboratories, computer facilities and library etc essential for pursuing the courses shall be made available free in adequate measure by the UTD/ Autonomous College. The parent institution must designate a course coordinator/facilitator to guide the students throughout the course and facilitate/conduct the lab/practical sessions/examinations.
- f. The requirement of project/dissertation, as notified by the respective UTD/Autonomous College/needs to be undertaken by the candidate for the specified credits. The project may be undertaken in any of the National and State Laboratories/Institutes/ Companies /Industries with the approval of UTD/ Autonomous College.

14. Requirement of attendance will be as per University Ordinance governing the examinations.

In general, attendance of at least seventy-five percent of theory lectures and practicals separately will be required in each course to sit in the semester end examination.

For special reasons such as prolonged illness deficiency in the percentage of attendance not exceeding fifteen percent of the total number of lectures delivered and practical/sessional held in each course may be condoned by the Vice Chancellor/Principal of autonomous colleges.

15. Examination & Evaluation:

15.1. Generally, each course will correspond to an examination paper comprising of external and internal evaluations. The semester end theory examinations for Major, Minor, Generic and DSE will be 3 hours while vocational (SEC) and Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) will be 2 hours duration. The credit structure for theory/practical/tutorial, internal, external examinations and total marks for an examination are shown in the Table 3 in clause 16.14.

15.2. (A) For Annual System:

The question paper of the external examination should preferably contain long answer, short answer and objective type questions. Where the Internal assessment is for 40 Marks, the continuous evaluation of the student will be conducted at four times (one in each quarter of the academic session) by conducting three tests of 10 marks each. of these, three must be written tests and the fourth may be written test/Quiz/Seminar/Assignment for theoretical courses. Marks obtained in best three tests out of four will be awarded to the student. Each student shall have to appear in at least three tests and End Examination; failing which, the student will be awarded Ab Grade in that course. In case of Laboratory/Field/Project work based courses, appropriate distribution of marks for Practical Record/Project Report, Practical year-end exam, viva, if any will be decided by the UTD/Autonomous College. In case of internal assessment, the college/UTD/University shall distribute and design their assessment so that at least two tests are conducted in a semester.

15.3. UTD/Autonomous colleges may design their mode of internal assessment with due approval from the respective academic council in view of the "Evaluation Reforms in Higher Educational Institutions, 2019" published by the UGC.

15.4. Total marks obtained in Semester-End Examination and continuous evaluation will be considered for awarding the grade in the course as explained in 15.5.

15.5. The grading will be made on 10-point scale as described below:

15.6. In case statutory bodies of the programme issue the guidelines regarding the minimum passing percentage of marks, then grading will be done in the following manner:

If the marks obtained by the student in a course are less than the minimum cut-off percentage of marks, then F grade will be awarded. Otherwise, the grades will be awarded as per above-mentioned table.

15.7. If a student obtains F or Ab grade in any course(s), he/she will be treated as having failed in the course(s). He/she has to reappear in the examinations of that course(s) as and when conducted by the University/UTD/Autonomous college. Marks obtained earlier in continuous assessment may be carried forward and added to the marks obtained in repeat semester-end examination to decide the grade in the repeat course(s).

15.8. (a) For Annual System: The student will be promoted to the next semester if he/she secures at least half of the total credits (viz. 20 credits out of 40 credits in annual system) in a year. In case the student secures less than half of the total credits in any year, then the student will be declared fail in that year and he/she will be asked to repeat the entire semester and that year will be treated as zero year. In such cases the student will not be promoted to the next semester.

If a student passes in all the courses offered in any year, then the student will be declared pass in that year. If a student secures at least half of the total credits in a year and fails in some courses offered in that year then he/she will be provisionally promoted to the next semester with supplementary in those courses in which he/she fails.

If the student fails to pass all the courses in the next supplementary examination, he/she will be second chance to pass the failed courses. If the student does not successfully complete the concerned year even after the aforesaid second chance, she/he shall be treated as fail in that year and will be asked to repeat the entire year as ex student and the credit earned by the student for the subject or group of subjects he/she has passed in respective year will be restored and carried over in next year. Students shall not be admitted in third year unless he/she has fully passed the first year. If the 4th year of

undergraduate programme is not offered in the present college, admissions in another college within the same University shall be allowed. Student can get the admission in 4-th year of the undergraduate programme if he/she has scored 7.5 CGPA in 3 year undergraduate programme.

(b) For Semester System: The student will be promoted to the next semester if he/she secures at least half of the total credits (viz. 10 credits out of 20 credits in semester system) in a semester in case the student secures less than half of the total credits in any semester, then the student will be declared fail in that semester and he/she will be asked to repeat the entire semester and that semester will be treated as zero semester in such cases the student will not be promoted to the next semester.

If a student passes in all the courses offered in any semester, then the student will be declared pass in that semester if a student secures at least half of the total credits in a semester and fails in some courses offered in that semester then he/she will be provisionally promoted to the next semester with ATKT (Allowed To keep term) in those courses in which he/she fails.

If the student fails to pass all the courses in the next ATKT examination the provisional promotion will be given and he/she will be given second chance to pass the failed courses suppose the student does not successfully complete the concerned semester even after the aforesaid second chance in that case, she/he shall be treated as fail in that semester and will be asked to repeat the semester. Credit earned by the student in the subject or the group of subject in respective semester will be restored and carried over in the next semester. Student shall not be admitted in fifth and six semesters.

If the 4th year of undergraduate programme is not offered in the present autonomous college, admissions in another autonomous college/UTD within the same University shall be allowed in cases of provisional promotions to the 4th year of the undergraduate programme.

If the student fails to pass all the courses in the next supplementary examination, he/she will be given second chance to pass the failed courses if the student does not successfully complete the concerned year even after the aforesaid second chance, she/he shall be treated as fail in that year and will be asked to repeat the entire year as ex student and the credit earned by the student for the subject or group of subjects he/she has passed in respective year will be restored and carried over in next year. Student shall not be admitted in third year unless he/she has fully passed the first year.

If the 4th year (fifth and six semesters) of undergraduate programme is not offered in the

present college, admissions in another college within the same university shall be allowed. Student can get the admission in 4-th year (fifth and six semesters) of the undergraduate programme if he/she has scored 7.5 CGPA in 3 year undergraduate programme.

- 15.9. Repetition of a theory/practical course is allowed only to those candidates who get F or Ab grade in the course or has failed in the semester. The student has to pay the prescribed fee for repeating the course as per norms.
- 15.10. On account of valid reasons, a student may withdraw from a year/semester. In such a case, that year/semester will be treated as zero year/semester.
- 15.11. In case of zero year/semester, the student will not be promoted to the next year/semester till he/she clears that year/semester. The University may allow such a student to re-register in that year/semester in the coming year. The student has to annual fee again in such case and may not be eligible for scholarships. If the student withdraws within one month from starting the academic year, then annual fee will not be charged again.
- 15.12. The provision for revaluation of answer book in annual/semester system will be available as per the existing rules of the University.
- 15.13. The theoretical and practical courses can be repeated whenever offered or conducted by the University/UTD; but within the maximum duration of the programme. He/she can avail multiple repeat attempts to pass the course.
- 15.14. Applicable to UTDs in the same universities: The UTD, where students from other UTDs are registered for choice based elective course(s), will send the Grade to the concerned UTD where the student is enrolled. The result will be declared by the UTD where the student has taken admission.

16. Evaluation and Certification of MOOCs and Vocational courses:

The guidelines of the government/University/SWAYAM portal/UGC shall be followed for evaluation and certification of MOOCs, Vocational courses, Field-Projects/Internship/Apprenticeship/Community engagement & service/Research Project.

17. Calculation of SGPA /AGPA/CGPA:

- 17.1.** (a) Semester Grade Point Average (AGPA) is a measure of performance of the student in a year. It is the ratio of total credit points secured by in various courses registered in that and the total course credits taken during that semester, i.e.

where Y_i is the i -th year, C_i is the number of credits of the i -th course in the year and G_i is the grade point scored by the student in the course.

- 17.2.** The Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) is a measure of performance of the student in a year. It is ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses registered in that year and the total course credits taken during that year i. e

where Y_i is the i -th year, C_i is the number of credits of the i -th course in the year (y) and G_i is the grade point scored by the student in the course.

- 17.3.** (a) The calculation of AGPA and CGPA in annual system: The annual Grade Point Average (AGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) will be calculated as weighted average of credit points secured by the student, except the credits of additional courses, if any the AGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off up to 2 decimal places and reported in the grade sheet

The calculation of AGPA and CGPA in annual system will be done as per follows.

The 3-years (6 semester) and 4-years (8 semester) undergraduate degrees should also indicate the Division obtained as per follows:

19. The student will be examined by the University as per the prevailing syllabus and scheme of examination.
20. The candidate shall be awarded a certificate/diploma/degree when he/she successfully earns the minimum required credits for the certificate/diploma/degree.
21. A Grade Card shall be issued to all the students after every semester based on the grades earned. The course details (code, title, number of credits, grade secured) along with SGPA of every semester and CGPA earned till that Academic Year will be displayed in the grade card.
22. Grade sheets for the colleges/UTD autonomous college will be prepared based on model Annexure Y-1 to Y-4 for annual system and Annexure S-1 to S-4 for semester system.
23. National Grace Marks
 - (a) Notional Grace Marks up to 5 can be condoned to the best of the advantage of the student for passing the examinations. The deficiency can be condoned in the maximum of two subject (theory and practical of the same subject shall be considered as two separate subjects).
 - (b) On the behalf of Vice-Chancellor, a notional grace of 0.01 in CGPA will be granted to a candidate, who at the end of the course is missing distinction/first division by 0.01 CGPA. However, this benefit shall not be granted to a candidate who have availed the advantages under above clause.
24. Credit Transfer:
 - 24.1. The credit transfer shall be implemented as per the policy of the University framed in accordance with the guidelines issued by the UGC from time to time.
 - 24.2. The member institutions of the Academic Bank of Credit established vide University Grants Commission (Establishment and Operation of Academic Bank of Credits in Higher Education) Regulations, 2021 shall accept and transfer the credits as per the provisions of this regulation as amended from time to time.
 - 24.3. Except for the cases of provisional promotions, the universities established by M.P. University Act, 1973 shall facilitate credit transfer of students between them. However, the student may be required to fulfill some eligibility criteria, drawing parity for a course, framed by the University in which the student seeks admission.
25. If any question arises relating to the interpretation of the provisions of this ordinance, it shall be referred to State Govt. whose decision thereon shall be applicable.
26. The guidelines, related to this programme, issued by the statutory bodies e.g., UGC/AICTE/BCU/NCTE/PCI/RCI issued from time to time will be adopted for implementation.
27. In matters not covered under this Ordinance, general rules of the University shall be applicable; otherwise, the state government's directions shall be applicable.
28. If UGC notifies any change in future in its Regulations in this regard. In that case, the same will be incorporated in the existing Ordinance on the recommendation of Higher Education and approval by the honourable Kuladhipati.

ORDINANCE NO. 64**M.Psy (CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY)****2-YEARS MASTER DEGREE IN CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY****GENERAL RULE**

These general rules are subject to alterations from time to time (as per the concerned council rules/ Govt. of India, MP State).

- 1) Title of the Degree — M.Psy (Clinical Psychology)
- 2) Name of Faculty: — Faculty of Paramedical and Allied Health Sciences.
- 3) Course Applicability —
 - 3.1) M.Psy (Clinical Psychology) Programme shall be quoted simply Programme hereafter in this ordinance, subject to the recommendation of the respective Board of Studies and as per norms of the concerned Regulatory Authority.
 - 3.2) The Board of Studies is authorized to recommend further additions/ alterations in this Ordinance with the approval of MPPURC and Government of M.P.
 - 3.3) The Degree will include areas of study/subjects/specializations as recommended by the Academic Council and concerned Board of Studies of the University as per the norms of the concerned regulatory authority.

4) Course Name --- M.Psy (Clinical Psychology) (Full Time)

4.1) Duration -Two years (Four semesters) - for Regular Course.

4.2) Eligibility for Admission:

Candidate who have passed the duly recognized following examination:-

- i) For Direct Admission/Lateral Entry admission in M.Psy (Clinical Psychology) minimum eligibility shall be kept as per RCI/Regulatory Bodies norms.
- ii) The university may conduct its own entrance examination/counseling for admission to the course for the eligible candidates.
- iii) The candidate may get direct admission to the program on the basis of merit of qualifying exam.
- iv) Obtained at least 60% marks (or as per Govt. of MP in case of candidates belonging to reserved category)/ or equivalent in the qualifying examination from recognized university.

Note: Candidate who is appearing or has appeared for any qualifying examination during the current academic session as a regular or a private candidate can also apply for admission on provisional basis, subject to the condition that the candidate must pass the qualifying examination with require percentage of marks or equivalent grade with in time limit specified by Govt. of MP.

5) Admission Procedure ---

The eligible candidates as specified in clause 4 above, should secure a place in the merit list prepared on the basis of academic credentials or through the University entrance test/examination consisting of Aptitude Test/ Group Discussion/ Personal Interview or through Counselling or the University may also use the score card of various competitive entrance test/ examination results of various Institute/Board/University/other Professional Bodies/ Organizations or any other mode as decided by the RCI/UGC/other relevant Regulatory Bodies from time to time.

- 6) **Specialization Distribution—**
Admission to a particular stream/ specialization of M.Psy (Clinical Psychology) Course/ Programme shall be decided by the University on the basis of either merit or counseling or personal interview. Details of the process will be announced well in advance.
- 7) **Number of Seats/Intake—**
The Intake for each of these courses shall be decided by the University as per guidelines of concerned regulatory body.
- 8) **Course Structure—**
The Course structure shall be as per the recommendation of the concerned Board of Studies of the Faculty of the University duly approved by the Academic Council. The directives of the RCI/ regulatory bodies will be followed.
- 9) **Maximum Duration of Completion of Course—**
A candidate has to complete the entire course of M.Psy (Clinical Psychology) Degree ordinarily within a maximum period (as specified/amended by the RCI/Regulatory Body time to time) from the session of first admission. However, for any exceptional case the matter shall be decided by the University as per the provisions of relevant rules and regulations.
- 10) **Commencement—**
Each academic year shall comprise of 1 year.
- 11) **Fee Structure —**
 - i. All the fees categories including Programme fee and the examination fee shall be determined by the University from time to time, and shall be payable by the students at the beginning of each year/ trimester the fee structure shall be determined in consultation with the Madhya Pradesh Private University Regulatory Commission.
 - ii. Registrar shall notify the quantum of fees payable and the schedule of registration before the commencement of the Programme.
 - iii. Cancellation and refund of fees will be as per directive of the state govt./regulatory authorities.
- 12) **Medium of Instruction—**
The medium of instruction and examination shall be English/Hindi.
- 13) **Attendance—**
 - i. Regular students, to be eligible to appear in the University examination, are required to attend a minimum of 80% classes, in each semester Provided that in case of illness or because of other reasonable cause it shall be relaxed by the Head/Dean/Vice Chancellor as admissible within applicable regulations.
 - ii. During dissertation phases (if applicable), the candidate must carry out a sufficient amount of dissertation work to the satisfaction of the committee approved by the Dean/Head, which shall evaluate the dissertation work as per the standard norms.
- 14) **Examination--**
 - i. Examination will be conducted as per Ordinance No. 05 and as per the suggestions of the respective Board of Studies and recommendations of Board of Examination
- 15) **Eligibility for Degree—Eligibility for Award of the M.Psy (Clinical Psychology) Degree.**
A student shall be declared to be eligible for award of the Degree with various specializations if he/

she has:

- i. Successfully acquired the minimum required credits as specified in the regulation corresponding to the branch of his/ her study within the stipulated time, wherever applicable.
- ii. Earned the specified credits in all the categories of subjects if applicable.
- iii. Secured a minimum 5.0 CGPA (50% marks) in aggregate overall. However the award of the Division/Class shall be as per recommendation of concerned Board of Studies of the university.

16) General instruction -

- i. The admission to all kinds of M.Psy (Clinical Psychology) Course shall be governed in accordance and provisions with the Rules/Directives of RCI/relevant Regulatory Body or any other competent Authority of the Govt. of India/ State Government as amended time to time.
 - ii. The relaxation in eligibility conditions, age and reservation etc. shall be in accordance with the Rules/Directives of UGC/relevant Regulatory Body or any other competent Authority of the Govt. of India/ State Government as amended time to time.
 - iii. For matters not covered in this specific ordinance, decision of Vice Chancellor of the university shall be applicable. In other matters, Board of Management of the university shall be competent to take any decision which shall be final.
 - iv. Notwithstanding anything stated in this Ordinance for any unforeseen issues arising and not covered by this Ordinance or in the event of differences of interpretation, the Vice-Chancellor may take a decision after obtaining, if necessary, the opinion/advice of a Committee, consisting of the Head/Dean of the concerned department. The decision of the Vice-Chancellor shall be final.
- 17) All M.Psy (Clinical Psychology) programmes with various specializations at present & in future shall run and be governed by concerned Board of Studies and after approval of Academic Council and Board of Management of the University.
- 18) These programmes are offered in regular mode by the Faculty of Paramedical and Allied Health Sciences, by the concerned Board of Studies and after approval of Academic Council and Board of Management of the University.

AVANTIKA UNIVERSITY, UJJAIN**Ordinance No 26****Ordinance for Bachelor of Technology 4-year Degree course****(Under NEP 2020)**

1.0 The first degree in Technology of a four-year (eight semester) course, hereinafter called 4-YDC, shall be designated as **BACHELOR OF TECHNOLOGY**, in respective Branches of Engineering and Technology.

1.1 The studies and examinations of Bachelor of Technology Program (Approved by respective Regulatory Body as applicable) shall be based on Choice based Credit system, but semester wise and final evaluation shall be by credit-based grading system.

1.2 This Ordinance shall also be applicable to 4-Year Part—time B.Tech. Program, which are approved by respective Regulatory Body as applicable

2.0 ADMISSIONS

2.1 The minimum qualification for admission into Bachelor of Technology Program shall be as per the prevalent norms of the State Government of Madhya Pradesh / AICTE / UGC for the Program of Bachelor of Technology.

2.2 The minimum qualification for direct admission to second year Bachelor of Technology Program termed as Lateral Entry shall be as per the prevalent norms of the University / Government of Madhya Pradesh / AICTE / UGC.

2.3 Admission to Bachelor of Technology Program shall be governed by the rules and regulations of the university / and or as per the norms of regulatory authority of the university. The relaxation in eligibility conditions, age and reservation etc. shall be in accordance with the Rules/ Directives of the relevant Regulatory Body, AICTE, UGC or any other competent Authority / State Government as amended from time to time.

2.4 The Admission Policy, eligibility & Selection Procedure, as above, may be reviewed and amended as per the norms and guidelines of UGC, from time to time subject to the approval of the Academic Council.

2.5 The university may create up to 25% supernumerary seats for international students, over and above of their total sanctioned enrolment. The decision regarding 25% supernumerary seats has to be carried out as per specific guidelines / regulations issued by the regulatory bodies.

2.6 The 25% of the supernumerary seats for international students will not include the international students under exchange programs or / and through Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between institutions or between Government of India and other countries.

3 STRUCTURE OF BACHELOR OF TECHNOLOGY (B.Tech.) PROGRAM

3.1 The total credits for the award of B.Tech. degree in any branch shall be a minimum of 160 and maximum credit limit 200 and / or as per the amendment recommended by the regulatory body.

3.2 The medium of instruction and examination shall normally be English throughout the course of studies. However any other language may be opted as per the requirement of the course, which would be recommended by Board of Studies, duly approved by Academic Council of the University.

3.3 Minimum credits required to earn B.Tech. Degree in particular branch shall be decided by the concerned Board of studies (BoS) duly approved by Academic Council of the University.

3.4 The subjects to be studied in different semesters of Bachelor of Technology Program shall be as per the Schemes and Syllabus, recommended by Board of Studies duly approved by Academic Council of the University.

3.5 A student shall be permitted to earn additional credits in self-learning mode through Massive Open Online Course (MOOCs). If a candidate earns 20 more credits than the minimum credits prescribed by the respective board of studies (of that program/course) for the award of Degree, then he/she shall be eligible of Degree with Honors or additional Minor Engineering, in the same program.

3.6 A list containing permitted courses for MOOCs along with their credits shall be prescribed by the respective BoS and shall be notified by the University from time to time. The BoS may recommend MOOC courses per semester to the extent of UGC guidelines.

3.7 Credit transfer through student exchange program shall be permitted as per the recommendations of the Board of Studies, duly approved by the Academic Council of the University

3.8 There shall be a University Examination for each course. These examinations will be designated as follows:

- (a) During First Year First Semester B.Tech., Exam and Second Semester B.Tech., Exam
- (b) During Second Year Third semester B.Tech. Exam and Fourth semester B.Tech. Exam
- (c) During Third Year Fifth semester B.Tech. Exam and Sixth semester B.Tech. Exam
- (d) During fourth Year Seventh semester B.Tech. Exam and Eighth semester B.Tech. Exam

3.8 The semester examination will generally be held as per the Academic Calander of the University.

3.9 Student appearing as regular students for any semester examination are required to attend minimum of 75 percent of the Academic Activities, provided that a short fall in attendance upto 10% and a further 5% can be condoned by the Vice-Chancellor of the University, for satisfactory reasons.

3.10 The performance of a student in a course shall be assessed through a series of Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) Components and Course End Assessment (CEA) as per the requirements and nature of the individual courses. The CCE may consist of closed book or open book examination, quizzes, portfolio generation, assignments, problem solving, programming, prototyping, field work, projects, and any other innovative assessment practices followed by faculty. The CEA will be in the form of a jury and / or written Examination to evaluate the candidate based on the work done in the semester

4 PROMOTION TO HIGHER SEMESTER AND YEAR

A candidate who has been admitted in the Bachelor of Technology Course will be promoted to the higher year/semester in accordance with the following rules.

4.1 A candidate shall be declared to have passed in each course / Paper / Practical / Mini Project / Project / Capstone/ Jury and Viva-voce, if he / she secures minimum passing marks in the continuous

assessment and Jury Examination and the minimum passing marks in composite score comprising of CEA and CCE put together.

4.2 The minimum passing marks in CCE and CEA shall be decided by BoS and approved by the Academic Council of the University.

4.3 A candidate may provisionally continue his/her studies in higher semester class after the examinations of the semester he/she appeared. However, his / her eligibility shall be evaluated only after the results of semesters are declared.

4.4 To pass a particular subject of the course the minimum required grade is D.

4.5 For the award of degree minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) required is 5.0.

4.6 If a candidate has passed all the subjects of an applicable year but has failed to score a minimum CGPA of 5.0, such a candidate shall be permitted to improve requisite grade point by reappearing in the respective subjects, in the ensuing examination as per the guidelines of the university.

5 AWARD OF CREDITS AND GRADES

5.1 Each subject, along with its weightage in terms of units and equivalent credits, shall be recommended by the concerned Board of Studies and shall be approved by the Academic Council. Only approved courses can be offered during any semester.

5.2 A candidate shall be evaluated for his / her academic performance in a subject through continuous comprehensive evaluation (CCE) and course end assessment (CEA) as proposed by the respective Board of Studies and approved Academic Council of the University.

5.3 The distribution of weightage /marks for each component shall be decided by the respective Board of Studies and approved by Academic Council of the University.

5.4 Each student registered for a course shall be awarded a grade based on his/her performance. The grades to be used and their numerical equivalents are as under:

- * **FR** – The 'FR' grade denotes failure in a course due to shortage of attendance, or the student is penalized in examinations. A student who obtains 'FR' grade in any course should necessarily re-register for the course in a subsequent semester and complete the same with a performance grade.
- * **N** – The letter grade 'N' is a placeholder which denotes Not-Complete performance in any course due to absence during CEA, due to some unavoidable circumstances like bereavement in immediate family or major illness. The 'N' gets converted to an appropriate regular letter grade after the student appears for CEA in Supplementary Assessment. In case the student does not avail the Supplementary Assessment, this will be converted to a 'F' grade.

5.5 The Semester Grade Points Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) shall be calculated as under: -

$$CGPA = \frac{[\sum (Course Credits) \times (Grade Point)] \text{ for all courses with letter grades (with grade points) including all 'F' and 'FR' grades (till that semester)}}{[\sum (Course Credits)] \text{ for all courses with letter grades (with grade points) including all 'F' and 'FR' grades (till that semester)}}$$

5.6 The grade sheet at end of each semester shall include SGPA of that semester and CGPA of all the semesters for which candidates have appeared in the examinations and the results of which have been declared. The final examination grade sheet at the end of final semester examination of the course shall also indicate CGPA, equivalent percentage marks and the division awarded, according to the rule as given in clause 7.0 of this ordinance.

5.7 The grade sheet of the eighth semester shall only be issued after the candidate has passed in all the semesters of the course.

6 CONDONATION OF DEFICIENCY

6.1 Deficiency up to five marks can be condoned to the best of the advantage of the student for passing the Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE). Deficiency can be condoned in a maximum of two subjects with a maximum of three marks in any subject.

7 AWARD OF DIVISION

7.1 Division shall be awarded only after completion of the course, based on integrated performance of the candidate in all the four years as per the following details.

$CGPA \geq 8.5$	First Class with Distinction
$8.5 > CGPA \geq 7.0$	First Class
$7.0 > CGPA \geq 6.0$	Second Class
$6.0 > CGPA \geq 5.0$	Pass Classs

7.2 The conversion from grade to an equivalent percentage shall be according to the following formula.

$$\text{Percentage marks scored} = CGPA \text{ obtained} \times 9.5$$

7.3 A candidate who has successfully completed the course as per the provisions of this ordinance and has earned through MOOCs, 20 credits more than the minimum credits prescribed by the respective board of studies (of that program/course) for the award of Degree, as per the provision of clause 3.5 of this ordinance, shall be awarded B. Tech Degree with Honors or additional Minor Engineering, in the same program.

8 MULTIPOINT ENTRY AND EXIT CLAUSE

8.1 The Bachelor of Technology degree shall be of four-year duration (Eight Semesters), with multiple entry and exit options within this period.

8.2 The candidate can exit after the successful completion of one academic year (Two semesters), followed by an exit bridge course (s) including job-specific internship/apprenticeship, as recommended by the respective Board of Studies duly approved by Academic Council of the University. Such candidate will be awarded with the Certificate in a discipline, or a field as decided by the respective Board of Studies duly approved by Academic Council of the University, which will be equivalent to appropriate level of National Higher Education Qualification Framework (NHEQF) / National Skills Qualification Framework (NSQF) and unified credit level.

8.3 The candidate can exit after the successful completion of first two academic years (Four Semesters) followed by exit bridge course (s) including job-specific internship/apprenticeship, as recommended by the respective Board of Studies duly approved by Academic Council of the University. Such a candidate will be awarded with Undergraduate Diploma (in the particular discipline), or field as decided by the respective Board of Studies duly approved by Academic Council of the University which will be equivalent to appropriate level of NHEQF/NSQF and unified credit level.

8.4 The candidate can exit after the successful completion of first three academic years (Six Semesters) followed by exit bridge course (s) including job-specific internship/apprenticeship, as recommended by the respective Board of Studies duly approved by Academic Council of the University. Such candidate will be awarded with Bachelor of Vocational Education (B.Voc.) (in the particular discipline) or field as decided by the respective Board of Studies duly approved by Academic Council of the University which will be equivalent to appropriate level of NHEQF/NSQF and unified credit level.

8.5 A candidate shall be awarded with Bachelor of Technology Degree (in the particular discipline) after the successful completion of academic requirements of all the four years (Eight Semesters).

8.6 A candidate shall also be eligible for an award of Bachelor of Technology with Honors or Bachelor of Technology with additional minor engineering as per clause 3.5 of the ordinance.

8.7 A candidate may avail an exit option at the end of any particular academic year and can re-enter the program, as regular candidate within the next five years, at the beginning of any new academic session (i.e. only during odd semesters), provided that he/she has successfully completed all the previous year/s.

8.8 The re-entry of such candidates is subject to the condition that the total number of candidates studying in a particular year, including such re-entering candidates, shall not exceed 20% of the sanctioned intake of the program excluding the supernumerary seats.

8.9 Due to the above clause, if the number of candidates seeking re-entry is more than the seats available then admission for the re-entering candidates shall be based on their CGPA of the qualifying year.

8.10 If a candidate is not able to seek re-entry due to the above clause, then he/she can apply for re-entry during the subsequent academic sessions.

8.11 If a candidate is seeking re-entry in a particular year, after a gap of five years from its previous exit and is not able to get entry due to clause 8.8 of this ordinance, the condition of maximum gap of five years, as stipulated in clause 8.7 above shall not be applicable to such candidates.

9 DURATION OF THE PROGRAM

9.1 There shall be a minimum number of weeks of teaching in every semester as per the guidelines issued by UGC / Regulatory Body as applicable.

9.2 Credit mapping in terms of academic engagement shall be applicable as per the academic regulations of the university.

9.3 A candidate may provisionally continue to attend the next higher year, even if, the result of qualifying year / semester has not been declared. However, subsequently if he/she is not able to clear qualifying semester examination, the candidate cannot claim any right based on his/her provisional admission.

10 PROVISION OF INTERNSHIP DURING FOURTH YEAR.

10.1 A candidate who has been selected for internship and / or placed in a company which is offering an in job internship to the candidate during any or all the semesters of the fourth year, can be permitted to attend the internship, provided that the candidate shall earn credits equal to the credit of that semester through equivalent MOOCs courses on the SWAYAM portal or any other platform as approved by the competent body of the University and the weightage to the project work/ industrial internship carried out during fourth year shall be considered equivalent to the credits assigned for project, however, such candidates shall be required to submit the thesis / report in the University

10.2 The Major Project shall be pertaining to his/her internship; for such project work, student shall be required to take one Guide from the University and another from the organization where he/she is undergoing the internship.

10.3 The decision about the equivalent courses shall be taken by the respective Board of Studies.

10.4 The additional credits earned under the provision of clause 3.5 shall not be counted for this purpose.

11 MERIT LIST

Only after the declaration of the result of eighth (final) semester examination, Branch wise merit list of candidates in order of merit, in all the four years shall be declared by the University. The merit list shall include the candidates who have secured at least first division. However, while counting the candidates in order of their merit, if more than one candidate has scored the same CGPA then all such candidates shall be included in the merit list.

12 TRANSCRIPT

The transcript issued to a student after completion of the program shall contain the consolidated record of all the courses taken semester wise by the student, credits and grades obtained, SGPA of each semester and the final CGPA.

13 GENERAL

13.1 In matters not covered under this ordinance, general rules of the university shall be applicable, otherwise, the state government / UGC / Statutory body directions shall be applicable.

13.2 In matters of admission, attendance, and examination and in all other matters not provided in this ordinance, the courses shall be governed by the provisions of the relevant ordinances of the same in the university so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance.

13.3 If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of these regulations, the Vice Chancellor may by order make such provisions not inconsistent with the Act, Statutes, Ordinances or other Regulations, as appears to be necessary or expedient to remove the difficulty.

13.4 If UGC or other regulatory body notifies any changes in future in its regulations in this regard, the same will be incorporated in the existing ordinance with the approval of Vice Chancellor on the recommendation of the Academic Council.

Ordinance No 27
Ordinance for Bachelor of Design 4-year Degree Program

(Under NEP 2020)

1.0 The first degree in Design of a four-year (eight semester) course, hereinafter called 4-YDC, shall be designated as **BACHELOR OF DESIGN (B.Des)**, in respective branch / specialization.

1.1 The studies and examinations of Bachelor of Design Program (Approved by respective Regulatory Body as applicable) shall be based on Choice based Credit system, but semester wise and final evaluation shall be by credit-based grading system.

1.2 This Ordinance shall be applicable to the 4-Year B.Des Program.

2.0 ADMISSIONS

2.1 The minimum qualification for admission into Bachelor of Design Program shall be as per the prevalent norms of the State Government of Madhya Pradesh / AICTE / UGC.

2.2 The minimum qualification for direct admission to second year Bachelor of Design Program termed as Lateral Entry shall be as per the prevalent norms of the University / Government of Madhya Pradesh / AICTE / UGC.

2.3 Admission to Bachelor of Design Program shall be governed by the rules and regulations of the university / and or as per the norms of regulatory authority of the university. The relaxation in eligibility conditions, age and reservation etc. shall be in accordance with the Rules/ Directives of the relevant Regulatory Body, AICTE, UGC or any other competent Authority / State Government as amended from time to time.

2.4 The Admission Policy, eligibility & Selection Procedure, as above, may be reviewed and amended as per the norms and guidelines of UGC, from time to time subject to the approval of the Academic Council.

2.5 The university may create up to 25% supernumerary seats for international students, over and above of their total sanctioned enrolment. The decision regarding 25% supernumerary seats has to be carried out as per specific guidelines / regulations issued by the regulatory bodies.

2.6 The 25% of the supernumerary seats for international students will not include the international students under exchange programs or / and through Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between institutions or between Government of India and other countries.

3 STRUCTURE OF BACHELOR OF DESIGN (B.Des.) PROGRAM

3.1 The total credits for the award of B.Des degree in any branch / specialization shall be a minimum of 160 and maximum credit limit 200 and / or as per the amendment recommended by the regulatory body.

3.2 The medium of instruction and examination shall normally be English throughout the course of studies. However, any other language may be opted for as per the requirement of the course, which would be recommended by Board of Studies, duly approved by Academic Council of the University.

3.3 The minimum credits required to earn B.Des Degree in particular branch / specialization shall be decided by the concerned Board of studies (BoS) duly approved by Academic Council of the University.

3.4 The subjects to be studied in different semesters of Bachelor of Design Program shall be as per the Schemes and Syllabus, recommended by Board of Studies duly approved by Academic Council of the University.

3.5 A student shall be permitted to earn additional credits in self-learning mode through Massive Open Online Course (MOOCs). If a candidate earns 20 more credits than the minimum credits prescribed by the respective board of studies (of that program/course) for the award of Degree, then he/she shall be eligible for a Degree with Honors or additional Minor specialization.

3.6 A list containing permitted courses for MOOCs along with their credits shall be prescribed by the respective Board of Studies (BoS) and shall be notified by the University from time to time. The BoS may recommend MOOC courses per semester to the extent of UGC guidelines.

3.7 Credit transfer through student exchange program shall be permitted as per the recommendations of the Board of Studies, duly approved by the Academic Council of the University.

3.8 There shall be a University Examination for each course. These examinations will be designated as follows:

(a) During First Year

First Semester B.Des., Exam and Second Semester B.Des., Exam

(b) During Second Year

Third semester B.Des. Exam and Fourth semester B.Des. Exam

(c) During Third Year

Fifth semester B.Des. Exam and Sixth semester B.Des. Exam

(d) During fourth Year

Seventh semester B.Des. Exam and Eighth semester B.Des. Exam

3.8 The semester examination will generally be held as per the Academic Calander of the University.

3.9 Student appearing as regular students for any semester examination are required to attend minimum of 75 percent of the Academic Activities, provided that a short fall in attendance upto 10% and a further 5% can be condoned by the Vice-Chancellor of the University, for satisfactory reasons.

3.10 The performance of a student in a course shall be assessed through a series of Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) Components and Course End Assessment (CEA) as per the requirements and nature of the individual courses. The CCE may consist of closed book or open book examination, quizzes, portfolio generation, assignments, problem solving, programming, prototyping, field work, projects, and any other innovative assessment practices followed by faculty. The CEA will be in the form of a jury and / or written Examination to evaluate the candidate based on the work done in the semester

4 PROMOTION TO HIGHER SEMESTER AND YEAR

A candidate who has been admitted in the Bachelor of Design Program will be promoted to the higher year/semester in accordance with the following rules.

4.1 A candidate shall be declared to have passed in each course / Paper / Practical / Mini Project / Project / Capstone/ Jury and Viva-voce, if he / she secures minimum passing marks in the continuous assessment and Jury Examination and the minimum passing marks in composite score comprising of CEA and CCE put together.

4.2 The minimum passing marks in CCE and CEA shall be decided by BoS and approved by the Academic Council of the University.

4.3 A candidate may provisionally continue his/her studies in higher semester class after the examinations of the semester he/she appeared. However, his / her eligibility shall be evaluated only after the results of semesters are declared.

4.4 To pass a particular subject of the course the minimum required grade is D.

4.5 For the award of degree minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) required is 5.0.

4.6 If a candidate has passed all the subjects of an applicable year but has failed to score a minimum CGPA of 5.0, such a candidate shall be permitted to improve requisite grade point by reappearing in the respective subjects, in the ensuing examination as per the guidelines of the university.

5 AWARD OF CREDITS AND GRADES

5.1 Each subject, along with its weightage in terms of units and equivalent credits, shall be recommended by the concerned Board of Studies and shall be approved by the Academic Council. Only approved courses can be offered during any semester.

5.2 A candidate shall be evaluated for his / her academic performance in a subject through continuous comprehensive evaluation (CCE) and course end assessment (CEA) as proposed by the respective Board of Studies and approved Academic Council of the University.

5.3 The distribution of weightage /marks for each component shall be decided by the respective Board of Studies and approved by Academic Council of the University.

5.4 Each student registered for a course shall be awarded a grade based on his/her performance. The grades to be used and their numerical equivalents are as under:

Ordinance No 28
Ordinance for Master of Design (MDes)
2-year Post Graduate Degree course
(Under NEP 2020)

1.0 The post graduate degree in Design of a two-year (four semester) course, hereinafter called 2-YDC, shall be designated as **MASTER OF DESIGN** in various specializations.

1.1 The studies and examinations of MDes program shall be based on Choice based Credit system, but semester wise and final evaluation shall be by credit-based grading system.

2.0 ADMISSIONS

2.1 Minimum qualification for admission into MDes program shall be as per the prevalent norms of the University / State Government of Madhya Pradesh / AICTE / UGC.

2.2 The admission to MDes program shall be governed by the rules and regulations of the university and / or as per the norms of regulatory bodies.

2.3 The relaxation in eligibility conditions, age and reservation etc. shall be in accordance with the Rules/ Directives of the relevant Regulatory Body, AICTE, UGC or any other competent Authority / State Government as amended from time to time.

2.5 The Admission Policy, eligibility & Selection Procedure, as above, may be reviewed and amended as per the norms and guidelines of UGC, from time to time subject to the approval of the Academic Council.

3.0 EXAMINATIONS

3.1 The MDes Program shall be divided into four semesters. Each Semester would be approximately of six months duration, including vacation/ preparatory leave/ examination/ industrial training etc.

3.2 The subjects to be studied in different semesters of MDes program shall be as per the schemes and syllabi, recommended by the respective Board of Studies and duly approved by the Academic council of the University.

3.3 A student shall be permitted to earn credits in self-learning mode through Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) as per the guidelines of university in accordance with the UGC.

3.4 A list containing permitted courses for MOOCs along with their credits shall be prescribed by the respective Board of studies and notified by the University.

3.5 There shall be a University Examination for each course. These examinations will be designated as follows:

(a) **During First Year**

First Semester MDes Exam and Second Semester MDes Exam

(b) **During Second Year**

Third Semester MDes Exam and Fourth Semester MDes Exam

3.6 The semester examination will generally be held as per the Academic Calander of the University.

3.7 The performance of a student in a course shall be assessed through a series of Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) Components and Course End Assessment (CEA) as per the requirements and nature of the individual courses. The CEA will be in the form of a jury and / or written Examination to evaluate the candidate based on the work done in the semester

4. PROMOTION TO HIGHER SEMESTER AND YEAR

A candidate who has been admitted in the MDes Program will be promoted to the higher year/semester in accordance with the following rules.

4.1 A student shall be declared to have passed in each course / Paper / Practical / Mini Project / Project /Capstone/ Jury and Viva-voce, if he / she secures minimum passing marks in the continuous assessment and Jury Examination and the minimum passing marks in composite score comprising of CEA and CCE put together.

4.2 The minimum passing marks in CCE and CEA shall be decided by BoS and approved by the Academic Council of the University.

4.3 A student may provisionally continue his/her studies in higher semester class after the examinations of the semester he/she appeared. However, his / her eligibility shall be evaluated only after the results of semesters are declared.

4.4 To pass a particular subject of the course the minimum required grade is D.

4.5 For the award of degree minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) required is 5.0.

4.6 If a student has passed all the subjects of an applicable year but has failed to score a minimum CGPA of 5.0, such a student shall be permitted to improve requisite grade point by reappearing in the respective subjects, in the ensuing examination as per the guidelines of the university.

5. AWARD OF CREDITS AND GRADES

5.1 Each subject, along with its weightage in terms of units and equivalent credits, shall be recommended by the concerned Board of Studies and shall be approved by the Academic Council. Only approved courses can be offered during any semester.

5.2 A student shall be evaluated for his / her academic performance in a subject through continuous comprehensive evaluation (CCE) and course end assessment (CEA) as proposed by the respective Board of Studies and duly approved by Academic Council of the University.

5.3 The distribution of weightage /marks for each component shall be decided by the respective Board of Studies and duly approved by Academic Council of the University.

5.4 Each student registered for a course shall be awarded a grade based on his/her performance. The grades to be used and their numerical equivalents are as under:

6 CONDONATION OF DEFICIENCY

6.1 Deficiency up to five marks can be condoned to the best of the advantage of the student for passing the Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE). Deficiency can be condoned in a maximum of two subjects with a maximum of three marks in any subject.

7 AWARD OF DIVISION

7.1 Division shall be awarded only after completion of the course, based on integrated performance of the student in all the four semesters as per the following details.

8.1 A student who has discontinued the course during any semester may, on the recommendation of the Dean / Head of the department, be permitted to take admission to the program at the beginning of the semester concerned in a subsequent year, provided that the duration of course for such readmitted student shall be counted from the date of his/her first admission.

9.0 DURATION OF PROGRAM

9.1 There shall be a minimum number of weeks of teaching in every semester as per the guidelines issued by UGC / Regulatory Body as applicable.

9.2 Credit mapping in terms of academic engagement shall be applicable as per the academic regulations of the university.

9.3 A student may provisionally continue to attend the next higher year, even if, the result of qualifying year / semester has not been declared. However, subsequently if he/she is not able to clear qualifying semester examination, the student cannot claim any right based on his/her provisional admission.

10.0 MERIT LIST

Only after the declaration of the result of fourth (final) semester examination, specialization wise merit list of students in order of merit, in all the four semesters shall be declared by the University. The merit list shall include the students who have secured at least first division. However, while counting the students in order of their merit, if more than one student has scored the same CGPA then all such students shall be included in the merit list.

11.0 ATTENDANCE

Students appearing as regular students for any semester examination are required to attend 75 % of the classes delivered in each subject of the program of study, provided that a short fall in attendance upto 10% and a further 5% can be condoned based on the recommendation of the Dean / Head of department and approved by the Vice-Chancellor of the University for satisfactory reasons.

12.0 MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

The medium of instruction and examination shall normally be English throughout the course of studies. However any other language may be opted as per the requirement of the course, which would be recommended by Board of Studies, duly approved by Academic Council of the University.

13.0 TRANSCRIPT

The transcript issued to a student after completion of the course shall contain the consolidated record of all the courses taken semester wise by the student, credits and grades obtained, SGPA of each semester and the final CGPA.

14.0 GENERAL

14.1 In matters not covered under this ordinance, general rules of the university shall be applicable, otherwise, the state government / UGC / Statutory body directions shall be applicable.

14.2 In matters of admission, attendance, and examination and in all other matters not provided in this ordinance, the courses shall be governed by the provisions of the relevant ordinances of the same in the university so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance.

14.3 If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of these regulations, the Vice Chancellor may by order make such provisions not inconsistent with the Act, Statutes, Ordinances or other Regulations, as appears to be necessary or expedient to remove the difficulty.

14.4 If UGC or other regulatory body notifies any changes in future in its regulations in this regard, the same will be incorporated in the existing ordinance with the approval of Vice Chancellor on the recommendation of the Academic Council.

Ordinance No 29
Ordinance for Master of Technology (MTech)
2-year Post Graduate Degree course

(Under NEP 2020)

1.0 The post graduate degree in Technology of a two-year (four semester) course, hereinafter called 2-YDC, shall be designated as **MASTER OF TECHNOLOGY** in various branches of Engineering and Technology and specializations.

1.1 The studies and examinations of MTech program shall be based on Choice based Credit system, but semester wise and final evaluation shall be by credit-based grading system.

2.0 ADMISSIONS

2.1 Minimum qualification for admission into MTech program shall be as per the prevalent norms of the University / State Government of Madhya Pradesh / AICTE / UGC.

2.2 The admission to MTech program shall be governed by the rules and regulations of the university / and or as per the norms of regulatory bodies.

2.3 The relaxation in eligibility conditions, age and reservation etc. shall be in accordance with the Rules/ Directives of the relevant Regulatory Body, AICTE, UGC or any other competent Authority / State Government as amended from time to time.

2.4 The Admission Policy, eligibility & Selection Procedure, as above, may be reviewed and amended as per the norms and guidelines of UGC, from time to time subject to the approval of the Academic Council.

3.0 EXAMINATIONS

3.1 The MTech Program shall be divided into four semesters. Each Semester would be approximately six months duration, including vacation/ preparatory leave/ examination/ industrial training etc.

7 AWARD OF DIVISION

7.1 Division shall be awarded only after completion of the course, based on cumulative performance of the candidate in all the four semesters as per the following details.

CGPA Score	Divisions
CGPA \geq 8.5	First Class with Distinction
8.5 > CGPA \geq 7.0	First Class
7.0 > CGPA \geq 6.0	Second Class
6.0 > CGPA \geq 5.0	Pass Class

- 7.2 The conversion from grade to an equivalent percentage shall be according to the following formula.

$$\text{Percentage marks scored} = \text{CGPA obtained} \times 9.5$$

8 READMISSION

- 8.1 A candidate who has discontinued the course during any semester may, on the recommendation of the Dean / Head of the department, be permitted to take admission to the program at the beginning of the semester concerned in a subsequent year, provided that the duration of course for such readmitted candidate shall be counted from the date of his/her first admission.

9 DURATION OF PROGRAM

- 9.1 There shall be a minimum number of weeks of teaching in every semester as per the guidelines issued by UGC / Regulatory Body as applicable.
- 9.2 Credit mapping in terms of academic engagement shall be applicable as per the academic regulations of the university.
- 9.3 A candidate may provisionally continue to attend the next higher year, even if, the result of qualifying year / semester has not been declared. However, subsequently if he/she is not able to clear qualifying semester examination, the candidate cannot claim any right based on his/her provisional admission.

10 MERIT LIST

- 10.1 Only after the declaration of the result of fourth (final) semester examination, specialization wise merit list of candidates in order of merit, in all the four semesters shall be declared by the University. The merit list shall include the candidates who have secured at least first division. However, while counting the candidates in order of their merit, if more than one candidate has scored same CGPA then all such candidates shall be included in the merit list.

11 ATTENDANCE

- 11.1 Candidates appearing as regular students for any semester examination are required to attend 75 % of the classes delivered in each subject of the program of study, provided that a short fall in attendance upto 10% and a further 5% can be condoned based on the recommendation of the Dean / Head of department and approved by the Vice-Chancellor of the University for satisfactory reasons.

12 MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

- 12.1 The medium of instruction and examination shall normally be English throughout the course of studies. However any other language may be opted as per the requirement of the course, which would be recommended by Board of Studies, duly approved by Academic Council of the University.

13 TRANSCRIPT

- 13.1 The transcript issued to a student after completion of the course shall contain the consolidated record of all the courses taken semester wise by the student, credits and grades obtained, SGPA of each semester and the final CGPA.

14 GENERAL

- 14.1 In matters not covered under this ordinance, general rules of the university shall be applicable, otherwise, the state government / UGC / Statutory body directions shall be applicable.
- 14.2 In matters of admission, attendance, and examination and in all other matters not provided in this ordinance, the courses shall be governed by the provisions of the relevant ordinances of the same in the university so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance. The provisions of UGC/ AICTE/ Government/ other regulatory body shall be applicable.
- 14.3 If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of these regulations, the Vice Chancellor may by order make such provisions not inconsistent with the Act, Statutes, Ordinances or other Regulations, as appears to be necessary or expedient to remove the difficulty.
- 14.4 If UGC/ AICTE/ State Government or other regulatory body notifies any changes in future in its regulations in this regard, the same will be incorporated in the existing ordinance with the approval of Vice Chancellor on the recommendation of the Academic Council and MPPURC.

Ordinance No 31
Ordinance for Master of Computer Applications (MCA)
2-year Post Graduate Degree course
(Under NEP 2020)

- 1.0 The post graduate degree in Computer Applications of a two-year (four semester) course, hereinafter called 2-YDC, shall be designated as **MASTER OF COMPUTER APPLICATIONS** in various specializations.
- 1.1 The studies and examinations of MCA program shall be based on Choice based Credit system, but semester wise and final evaluation shall be by credit-based grading system.

2.0 ADMISSIONS

- 2.1 Minimum qualification for admission into MCA program shall be as per the prevalent norms of the University / State Government of Madhya Pradesh / AICTE / UGC.
- 2.2 The admission to MCA program shall be governed by the rules and regulations of the university / and or as per the norms of regulatory bodies.
- 2.3 The admission to second year of MCA program shall be permitted to the candidates who have completed 4 year degree program.
- 2.4 The relaxation in eligibility conditions, age and reservation etc. shall be in accordance with the Rules/ Directives of the relevant Regulatory Body, AICTE, UGC or any other competent Authority / State Government as amended from time to time.
- 2.5 The Admission Policy, eligibility & Selection Procedure, as above, may be reviewed and amended as per the norms and guidelines of UGC, from time to time subject to the approval of the Academic Council.

3.0 EXAMINATIONS

- 3.1 The MCA Program shall be divided into four semesters. Each Semester would be approximately of six months duration, including vacation/ preparatory leave/ examination/ industrial training etc.
- 3.2 The subjects to be studied in different semesters of MCA program shall be as per the schemes and syllabi, recommended by the respective Board of Studies and duly approved by the Academic council of the University.
- 3.3 A student shall be permitted to earn credits in self-learning mode through Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) as per the guidelines of university in accordance with the UGC.

- 3.4 A list containing permitted courses for MOOCs along with their credits shall be prescribed by the respective Board of studies and notified by the University.
- 3.5 There shall be a University Examination for each course. These examinations will be designated as follows:
- (a) During First Year
First Semester MCA Exam and Second Semester MCA Exam
- (b) During Second Year Third Semester MCA Exam and Fourth Semester MCA Exam
- 3.6 The semester examination will generally be held as per the Academic Calander of the University.
- 3.7 The performance of a student in a course shall be assessed through a series of Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) Components and Course End Assessment (CEA) as per the requirements and nature of the individual courses. The CCE may consist of closed book or open book examination, quizzes, portfolio generation, assignments, problem solving, programming, prototyping, field work, projects, and any other innovative assessment practices followed by faculty. The CEA will be in the form of a jury and / or written Examination to evaluate the candidate based on the work done in the semester

4. PROMOTION TO HIGHER SEMESTER AND YEAR

A candidate who has been admitted in the MCA Program will be promoted to the higher year/semester in accordance with the following rules.

- 4.1 A candidate shall be declared to have passed in each course / Paper / Practical / Mini Project / Project /Capstone/ Jury and Viva-voce, if he / she secures minimum passing marks in the continuous assessment and Jury Examination and the minimum passing marks in composite score comprising of CEA and CCE put together.
- 4.2 The minimum passing marks in CCE and CEA shall be decided by BoS and approved by the Academic Council of the University.
- 4.3 A candidate may provisionally continue his/her studies in higher semester class after the examinations of the semester he/she appeared. However, his / her eligibility shall be evaluated only after the results of semesters are declared.
- 4.4 To pass a particular subject of the course the minimum required grade is D.
- 4.5 For the award of degree minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) required is 5.0.
- 4.6 If a candidate has passed all the subjects of an applicable year but has failed to score a minimum CGPA of 5.0, such a candidate shall be permitted to improve requisite grade point by reappearing in the respective subjects, in the ensuing examination as per the guidelines of the university.

5. AWARD OF CREDITS AND GRADES

- 5.1 Each subject, along with its weightage in terms of units and equivalent credits, shall be recommended by the concerned Board of Studies and shall be approved by the Academic Council. Only approved courses can be offered during any semester.
- 5.2 A student shall be evaluated for his / her academic performance in a subject through continuous comprehensive evaluation (CCE) and course end assessment (CEA) as proposed by the respective Board of Studies and duly approved by Academic Council of the University.
- 5.3 The distribution of weightage /marks for each component shall be decided by the respective Board of Studies and duly approved by Academic Council of the University.
- 5.4 Each student registered for a course shall be awarded a grade based on his/her performance. The grades to be used and their numerical equivalents are as under:

* **FR** - The 'FR' grade denotes failure in a course due to shortage of attendance, or the student is penalized in examinations. A student who obtains 'FR' grade in any course should necessarily re-register for the course in a subsequent semester and complete the same with a performance grade.

* **N** - The letter grade 'N' is a placeholder which denotes Not-Complete performance in any course due to absence during CEA, due to some unavoidable circumstances like bereavement in immediate family or major illness. The 'N' gets converted to an appropriate regular letter grade after the student appears for CEA in Supplementary Assessment. In case the student does not avail the Supplementary Assessment, this will be converted to a 'F' grade.

- 5.4 The Semester Grade Points Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) shall be calculated as under: -

- 5.4 The grade sheet at end of each semester shall include SGPA of that semester and CGPA of all the semesters for which candidates have appeared in the examinations and the results of which have been declared. The final examination grade sheet at the end of final semester examination of the course shall also indicate CGPA, equivalent percentage marks and the division awarded, according to the rule as given in clause 7.0 of this ordinance.
- 5.5 The grade sheet of the fourth semester shall only be issued after the candidate has passed in all the semesters of the course.

6 CONDONATION OF DEFICIENCY

- 6.1 Deficiency up to five marks can be condoned to the best of the advantage of the student for passing the Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE). Deficiency can be condoned in a maximum of two subjects with a maximum of three marks in any subject.

7 AWARD OF DIVISION

- 7.1 Division shall be awarded only after completion of the course, based on integrated performance of the candidate in all the four semesters as per the following details.

7.1 मूल विनियमों के विनियम 11.1(क)(तीन) तथा 11.1(ख)(दो) में शब्दों “मध्यप्रदेश विद्युत नियामक आयोग (ग्रिड संयोजित शुद्ध मापन) विनियम 2015” के स्थान पर शब्द “मध्यप्रदेश विद्युत नियामक आयोग (ग्रिड पारस्परिक नवीकरणीय ऊर्जा प्रणालियां एवं संबंधित मामलों) विनियम (पुनरीक्षण-द्वितीय), 2024” स्थापित किये जाएं।

7.2 मूल विनियमों के विनियम 11 के उप-खण्ड 11.2(क) में शब्दों “मध्यप्रदेश विद्युत सन्तुलन तथा व्यवस्थापन संहिता, 2015” एवं “मध्यप्रदेश विद्युत ग्रिड संहिता, 2019” के स्थान पर शब्द क्रमशः “मध्यप्रदेश विद्युत सन्तुलन तथा व्यवस्थापन संहिता, 2023” एवं “मध्यप्रदेश विद्युत ग्रिड संहिता (पुनरीक्षण-तृतीय), 2024” स्थापित किये जाएं।

8. मूल विनियमों के विनियम 12 में संशोधन

मूल विनियमों के विनियम 12.4 के पश्चात् क्रमशः निम्न विनियम अर्थात् 12.5, 12.6 तथा 12.7 निम्नानुसार स्थापित किये जाएं, अर्थात् :-

“12.5 विनियम 2 (तेरह) में उल्लेखित समस्त आबंधित इकाइयां (obligated entities) तथा विनियम 14 में उल्लेखित राज्य नवीकरणीय क्रय आबन्धन अनुश्रवण

अभिकरणों (State RPO monitoring agencies) द्वारा इन विनियमों की अधिसूचना तिथि से एक माह के भीतर आयोग के नवीकरणीय क्रय आबन्धन वेब पोर्टल (RPO web Portal) पर स्वयं को पंजीकृत कराना होगा तथा प्रतिमाह नवीकरणीय क्रय आबन्धन अनुपालन (RPO Compliance) को प्रतिवेदित किया जाना प्रारंभ करना होगा। आबन्धित इकाईयों द्वारा नवीकरणीय क्रय आबन्धन अनुपालन (RPO Compliance) को प्रतिवेदित करने तथा राज्य नवीकरणीय क्रय आबन्धन अनुश्रवण अभिकरणों (State Monitoring Agencies) द्वारा इनके अनुश्रवण तथा सत्यापन बाबत विज्ञप्ति (Protocol) की अधिसूचना आयोग द्वारा पृथक से जारी की जाएगी।

12.6 प्रत्येक आबन्धित इकाई (obligated entity) द्वारा नवीकरणीय क्रय आबन्धन अनुपालन संबंधी प्रतिवेदन प्रति वर्ष राज्य नवीकरणीय आबन्धन अनुश्रवण अभिकरणों (State RPO Monitoring Agencies) को 15 मई तक प्रस्तुत करना होगा। प्रतिवेदन के अन्तर्गत प्रत्येक आबन्धित इकाई के 'RPO' अनुपालन की अद्यतन स्थिति को मय समर्थन अभिलेखों (supporting documents) के प्रस्तुत करना होगा।

12.7 राज्य नवीकरणीय क्रय आबन्धन अनुश्रवण अभिकरणों (State RPO Monitoring Agencies) द्वारा प्रस्तुत प्रतिवेदनों का आयोग द्वारा परीक्षण किया जाएगा तथा उसके द्वारा पृथक आदेशों के माध्यम से, या फिर एक सामान्य आदेश (common order) के माध्यम से, जैसा कि उचित समझा जाए, प्रत्येक आबन्धित इकाई (obligated entity) के नवीकरणीय क्रय आबन्धन अनुपालन अद्यतन स्थिति (RPO Compliance Status) की घोषणा (declaration) को पारित किया जाएगा।"

9. मूल विनियमों के विनियम 13 में संशोधन

मूल विनियमों के विनियम 13.1 तथा 13.2 में शब्दों "Central Electricity Regulatory Commission (Terms and Conditions for recognition and issue of Renewal Energy Certificate for Renewal Energy Generation) Regulation 2010" के स्थान पर शब्द "समय-समय पर यथासंशोधित विनियम CERC (Terms and Conditions for recognition and issuance of Renewal Energy Certificate for Renewal Energy Generation) Regulations 2022" स्थापित किये जाएं।

10. मूल विनियमों के विनियम 14 में संशोधन

मूल विनियमों के विनियम 14 के स्थान पर निम्न विनियम 14 स्थापित किया जाए, अर्थात् :-

“14(क) राज्य अभिकरण (State Agency)

- 14.1 राज्य अभिकरण आयोग के दिशा-निर्देशानुसार कार्य करेगा तथा केन्द्रीय अभिकरण (Central Agency) के समय-समय पर यथासंशोधित ऊर्जा प्रमाण-पत्र विनियमों अर्थात् "CERC (Terms and Conditions for recognition and issuance of Renewal Energy Certificate for Renewal Energy Generation) Regulation 2022" के अधीन जारी की गई प्रक्रियाओं तथा नियमों से सुसंगत अपने कर्तव्यों का निर्वहन करेगा।
- 14.2 आयोग, किसी भी समय, किसी सामान्य या विशेष आदेश द्वारा किसी अन्य इकाई को राज्य अभिकरण (State Agency) के रूप में कार्य निष्पादन हेतु नामित कर सकेगा।

(ख) राज्य नवीकरणीय क्रय आबन्धन अनुश्रवण अभिकरण (State RPO Monitoring Agency)

- 14.3 राज्य नवीकरणीय क्रय आबन्धन अनुश्रवण अभिकरण/नवीकरणीय क्रय आबन्धन अनुश्रवण अभिकरण उनके क्षेत्राधिकार के अन्तर्गत कार्यरत आबन्धित इकाईयों (obligated entities) संबंधी नवीकरणीय क्रय आबन्धन अनुपालन (RPO Compliance) के अनुश्रवण तथा प्रतिवेदन प्रस्तुतिकरण हेतु उत्तरदायी होंगे तथा आयोग द्वारा जारी के दिशा-निर्देशों के अनुसार कार्य निष्पादन करेंगे जैसा कि इसे समय-समय पर जारी अलग आदेशों के माध्यम से निर्दिष्ट किया जाए। इस प्रकार नामित राज्य नवीकरणीय क्रय आबन्धन अनुश्रवण अभिकरण/नवीकरणीय क्रय आबन्धन अनुश्रवण अभिकरण को नवीकरणीय क्रय आबन्धन पोर्टल (RPO Portal) की सीमित पहुँच उपलब्ध कराई जावेगी ताकि वे आबन्धित इकाईयों द्वारा नवीकरणीय ऊर्जा/आरईसी के क्रय से सम्बंधित प्रस्तुत की गई जानकारी को प्राप्त कर सकें।
- 14.4 आयोग किसी भी समय किसी सामान्य या विशेष आदेश द्वारा किसी अन्य इकाई को राज्य नवीकरणीय क्रय आबन्धन अनुश्रवण अभिकरण/अभिकरणों के रूप में कार्य निष्पादन हेतु नामित कर सकेगा।

11. मूल विनियमों के विनियम 15 में संशोधन

मूल विनियमों के विनियम 15 के स्थान पर निम्नानुसार विनियम 15 स्थापित किया जाए, अर्थात् :-

“15 चूक का प्रभाव (Effect of Default)

- 15.1 ऐसी दशा में जबकि आबन्धित इकाईयां किसी वित्तीय वर्ष के दौरान इन विनियमों के अधीन प्रावधानित पावर एक्सचेंज से नवीकरणीय ऊर्जा स्रोतों से ऊर्जा क्रय करने के आबन्धन के अधिदेश की पूर्ति न करती हों तथा पावर एक्सचेंज से प्रमाण-पत्रों का क्रय न करती हों, तो

(एक) आयोग आबन्धित इकाई को एक पृथक निधि (seperate fund) में कतिपय राशि जमा करने बाबत निर्दिष्ट कर सकेगा जिसका संधारण ऐसी आबन्धित इकाई द्वारा किया जाएगा जिसका निर्धारण आयोग द्वारा नवीकरणीय ऊर्जा के प्रमाण-पत्रों (RECs) को उक्त सीमा तक नवीकरणीय क्रय आबन्धन में यूनिटों की कमी तथा पिछले 6 माह के दौरान पावर एक्सचेंजों पर नवीकरणीय ऊर्जा प्रमाण-पत्रों (RECs) के औसत मूल्य के आधार पर किया जा सकेगा, तथा जिसका उपयोग जैसा कि आयोग द्वारा निर्दिष्ट किया जावेगा, मुख्यतः नवीकरणीय ऊर्जा प्रमाण-पत्रों के क्रय हेतु तथा नवीकरणीय ऊर्जा स्रोतों के आधार पर विद्युत उत्पादन केन्द्रों से विद्युत ऊर्जा की निकासी हेतु पारेषण अधोसंरचना के विकास हेतु किया जाएगा यदि वांछित नवीकरणीय ऊर्जा प्रमाण-पत्रों के विक्रय पश्चात् उपयोग में न लाई गई राशि पृथक निधि में कायम रहती हो :

परन्तु यह कि आबन्धित इकाइयों को उपरोक्त खण्ड(एक) के अनुसरण में, आयोग की पूर्व अनुमति के बगैर सृजित निधि के उपयोग हेतु प्राधिकृत नहीं किया जाएगा ;

(दो) आबन्धनों को परिपूर्ण किये जाने संबंधी कमी की सीमा के अधीन आयोग राज्य अभिकरण के किसी अधिकारी को पावर एक्सचेंज से निधि की राशि में वांछित प्रमाण-पत्रों की संख्या की अधिप्राप्ति हेतु प्राधिकृत कर सकेगा ;

(तीन) आयोग समन्वयन अभिकरण (nodal agency) को मध्यप्रदेश विद्युत नियामक आयोग (मध्यप्रदेश में अन्तर्राज्यिक खुली पहुंच के लिये निबन्धन तथा शर्तों) विनियम, 2021 के उपबन्धों के अधीन, आबन्धित इकाई की हरित ऊर्जा को छोड़कर, ऊर्जा की राज्यान्तरिक लघु अवधि निर्बाध (खुली) पहुंच के नियन्त्रण हेतु लघु अवधि निर्बाध (खुली) पहुंच (short term open access) हेतु निर्देशित कर सकेगा।

15.2 यदि वितरण अनुज्ञप्तिधारी आयोग द्वारा निर्देशित राशि को संसूचित तिथि से 15 दिवस के भीतर जमा करने में चूक करता हो तो इसे अनुज्ञप्ति की शर्त का उल्लंघन माना जाएगा।

15.3 इसके अतिरिक्त, जहां कोई व्यक्ति जिसके द्वारा, तथापि, इन विनियमों का अनुपालन किया जाना अनिवार्य है, नवीकरणीय ऊर्जा स्रोतों अथवा नवीकरणीय ऊर्जा प्रमाण-पत्रों के माध्यम से वांछित ऊर्जा का प्रतिशत क्रय करने में चूक करता हो तो

उसे अधिनियम की धारा 142 के अधीन अर्थदण्ड का भुगतान करना होगा, जैसा कि आयोग द्वारा इस बारे में निर्णय लिया जाए।

- 15.4 नवीकरणीय ऊर्जा अथवा प्रमाण-पत्रों की अनुपलब्धता के कारण यदि नवीकरणीय क्रय आबन्धन के अनुपालन में यथार्थ कठिनाई उत्पन्न हो तो आबन्धित इकाई (obligate entity) आयोग से अनुपालन आवश्यकता को आगामी वर्ष तक बढ़ाये जाने बाबत सम्पर्क कर सकेगी तथा आयोग प्रकरण-दर-प्रकरण आधार पर मामले में यथोचित दृष्टिकोण अपनाएगा :

परन्तु यह कि अनुपालन आवश्यकता (compliance requirement) को आगामी वर्ष हेतु बढ़ाये जाने बाबत अनुज्ञेय करते समय आयोग यथोचित कर्मनिष्ठापूर्वक कार्यवाही करेगा, संबंधित आबन्धित इकाई को अतिरिक्त नवीकरणीय ऊर्जा अधिप्राप्ति करने या नवीकरणीय ऊर्जा प्रमाण-पत्रों (RECs) की समान राशि की व्यवस्था करने हेतु भी निर्देश दे सकेगा जिसकी गणना नवीकरणीय क्रय आबन्धन (RPO) में किसी कमी (shortfall) बाबत उसके मौद्रिक मूल्य (monetary value) के अनुसार विलंब भुगतान अधिभार (Late Payment Surcharge-LPS) के आधार दर के अनुसार की जाएगी जैसा कि इसे भारत सरकार, विद्युत मन्त्रालय द्वारा विलम्ब भुगतान अधिभार नियम में अधिसूचित किया गया है तथा जैसा कि वह नवीकरणीय क्रय आबन्धन (RPO) हेतु वर्ष के दौरान प्रयोज्य हो जिस हेतु आबन्धित इकाई द्वारा नवीकरणीय क्रय आबन्धन का अनुपालन किया जाना अपेक्षित था :

परन्तु आगे यह और कि जब आयोग द्वारा नवीकरणीय क्रय आबन्धन को आगे बढ़ाये जाने की अनुमति प्रदान की गई हो तो इस विनियम के खण्ड 15.1(तीन) के उपबन्ध प्रकरण में प्रयोज्य न होंगे।”

No. MPERC / 2025/ 423 In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 181 read with Section 61(h) and 86(1)(e) of the Electricity Act 2003, (36 of 2003) and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Madhya Pradesh Electricity Regulatory Commission, hereby makes the following Regulations to amend the Madhya Pradesh Electricity Regulatory Commission (Cogeneration and Generation of Electricity from Renewable Sources of Energy (Revision-II) Regulations 2021[RG-33(II) of 2021], herein after referred to as the “Principal Regulations” namely :-

FOURTH AMENDMENT TO MADHYA PRADESH ELECTRICITY REGULATORY COMMISSION (COGENERATION AND GENERATION OF ELECTRICITY FROM RENEWABLE SOURCES OF ENERGY (REVISION-II) REGULATIONS 2021[ARG-33(II)(iv) of 2025]

1. Short Title and Commencement-

- 1.1. These Regulations shall be called “Madhya Pradesh Electricity Regulatory Commission (Cogeneration and Generation of Electricity from Renewable Sources of Energy (Revision-II) Regulations 2021(Fourth Amendment) [ARG-33(II)(iv) of 2025].
- 1.2. These Regulations shall come into force from the date of their publication in the Madhya Pradesh Gazette.
- 1.3. These Regulations shall extend to the whole of the State of Madhya Pradesh.

2. Amendment to Regulation 2 of the Principal Regulations.

- 2.1 Regulation 2 (xi) of the Principal Regulations is omitted:
- 2.2 Regulation 2(xiv), 2 (xx) and 2 (xxiii) of the Principal Regulations is substituted as under, namely: -

“2 (xiv) ‘Open Access Consumer’ means a person who has availed open access either under CERC (Connectivity and General Network Access to the inter-State Transmission System) Regulations, 2022 (as amended and revised from time to time) or under Madhya Pradesh Electricity Regulatory Commission (Terms and Conditions for Intra-State Open Access in Madhya Pradesh) Regulations, 2021 (Revision-I)(as amended

and revised from time to time) and shall include Short-term Transmission/Distribution Consumers also as defined in any other Regulations specified by CERC/MPERC from time to time;”

“2 (xx) ‘Renewable Purchase Obligation(RPO)’ means a minimum quantum of electricity to be procured under the provisions of Electricity Act 2003 by all the Obligated Entities from generators of renewable energy including co-generation from renewable sources of electricity expressed as percentage of their total annual procurement of electrical energy during the Financial Year as per Regulation 3 of these Regulations;”

“2 (xxiii) ‘State Agency’ means the State Agency to be designated by the Commission through an order to act as the agency for accreditation of eligible entities connected with intra state transmission system for grant of renewable energy certificates and recommending the renewable energy projects in Madhya Pradesh;”

2.3 A new Regulation namely 2 (xxiii) (a) shall be inserted after Regulation 2 (xxiii) and before Regulation 2 (xxiv), as under, namely: -

2 (xxiii) (a) ‘State RPO Monitoring Agency/Agencies’ means The State RPO Monitoring Agency/Agencies to be designated by the Commission through order(s) to act as the nodal agency for monitoring, verification and reporting RPO compliance of each of the obligated entity in their jurisdiction;”

2.4 A new Regulation namely 2 (xx) (a) shall be inserted after Regulation 2 (xx) and before Regulation 2 (xxi), as under, namely: -

2 (xx) (a) ‘RPO Portal’ means a web portal developed by the Commission for reporting of RPO compliance by the Obligated Entities including Distribution Licensees and Indian Railways;”

3. Amendment to Regulations 3 of the Principal Regulations.

Regulation 3.1.9 of the Principal Regulations shall be substituted as under, namely:

“ 3.1.9 Any shortfall remaining in achievement of ‘Other RPO’ category in a particular year can be met with either the excess energy procured from Wind Power Projects (WPPs) commissioned after 31st March 2022 beyond ‘Wind RPO’ for that year and the wind energy procured over and above 7% from WPPs commissioned till 31st March 2022 or with excess energy procured from eligible Hydro Power Projects [including Pumped Storage Projects (PSPs) and Small Hydro Projects (SHPs)], commissioned after 8th March, 2019 beyond ‘HPO’ for that year or partly from both. Further, any shortfall in achievement of Wind RPO in a particular year can be met with excess energy procured from Hydro Power Plants,

which is in excess of 'HPO' for that year and vice versa. Moreover, any excess energy consumption under Other renewable energy category in a particular year, can be utilised to meet the shortfall in RPO compliance of Wind renewable energy or Hydro renewable energy."

4. Amendment to Regulations 5 of the Principal Regulations.

Regulation 5.3 of the Principal Regulations shall be substituted as under, namely:

" The metering shall be installed at Generating Plant site by the Distribution Licensee for measuring parameters required as per Tariff Orders issued from time to time and for energy accounting by SLDC, in accordance with Madhya Pradesh Electricity Balancing and Settlement Code, 2023 , MPERC (Forecasting, Scheduling, DSM and related matters of Wind and Solar Generating Stations) Regulations, 2018, Madhya Pradesh Electricity Grid Code (Revision-III), 2024 and Madhya Pradesh Electricity Distribution Code (Revision-1), 2024 {RG-29(I) of 2024} as amended and revised from time to time."

5. Amendment to Regulations 7 of the Principal Regulations.

In Regulation 7 (a) of the Principal Regulations, for the words "MP Electricity Grid Code, 2019", words "Madhya Pradesh Electricity Grid Code (Revision-III), 2024" shall be substituted.

6. Amendment to Regulations 9 of the Principal Regulations.

In Regulation 9.3 of the Principal Regulations, for the words "MPERC Balancing and Settlement Code, 2015" and "MP Electricity Grid Code, 2019", words "Madhya Pradesh Electricity Balancing and Settlement Code, 2023" and "Madhya Pradesh Electricity Grid Code (Revision-III) 2024" shall be substituted respectively.

7. Amendment to Regulations 11 of the Principal Regulations.

7.1 In Regulation 11.1 (a)(iii) and 11.1 (b) (ii) of the Principal Regulations, for the words "Madhya Pradesh Electricity Regulatory Commission (Grid connected Net Metering) Regulations, 2015", words "Madhya Pradesh Electricity Regulatory Commission (Grid Interactive Renewable Energy Systems Related Matters) Regulations [Revision-II], 2024" shall be substituted.

- 7.2 In Regulation 11.2(a) of the Principal Regulations, for the words “MP Electricity Balancing and Settlement Code, 2015” and “MP Electricity Grid Code, 2019”, words “Madhya Pradesh Electricity Balancing and Settlement Code, 2023” and “Madhya Pradesh Electricity Grid Code (Revision-III), 2024” shall be substituted respectively.

8. Amendment to Regulation 12 of the Principal Regulations.

After Regulation 12.4 of the Principal Regulations, following Regulations namely 12.5, 12.6 and 12.7 shall be inserted respectively as under, namely: -

“12.5 All the Obligated Entities referred to in Regulation 2(xiii) and State RPO Monitoring Agencies referred to in Regulation 14 (B) shall be required to register on RPO Portal of the Commission within a period of 1 month from the date of notification of these Regulations and start reporting RPO compliance every month. A protocol for reporting RPO obligation and compliance by Obligated Entities and monitoring and verification of RPO obligation and compliance by State RPO Monitoring Agencies shall be notified separately by the Commission.”

“12.6 A report on RPO obligation and compliance of each of the Obligated Entities shall be submitted by the State RPO Monitoring Agencies by 15th May of each year. The report shall contain the RPO obligation and compliance status of each obligated entity along with supporting documents.”

“12.7 The Commission shall examine the reports submitted by the State RPO Monitoring Agencies and shall pass a declaration of RPO compliance status of each obligated entity through separate orders or through a common order as it may deem fit.”

9. Amendment to Regulations 13 of the Principal Regulations.

In Regulations 13.1 and 13.2 of the Principal Regulations, for the words “Central Electricity Regulatory Commission (Terms and Conditions for recognition and issue of Renewable Energy Certificate for Renewable Energy Generation) Regulations, 2010”, words “CERC (Terms and conditions for recognition and issuance of Renewable Energy Certificate for Renewable Energy Generation) Regulations, 2022” shall be substituted.

10. Amendment to Regulations 14 of the Principal Regulations.

Regulation 14 of the of the Principal Regulations shall be substituted as under, namely: -

“14. (A) State Agency

- 14.1 The State Agency shall function in accordance with the directions of the Commission and shall act in a manner consistent with the procedures and rules of the Central Agency for discharge of its functions under the CERC (Terms and conditions for recognition and issuance of Renewable Energy Certificate for Renewable Energy Generation) Regulations, 2022 as amended from time to time.
- 14.2 The Commission may, at any time, by general or specific order, designate any other entity to function as State Agency.

(B) State RPO Monitoring Agency

- 14.3 The State RPO Monitoring Agency/ RPO Monitoring Agencies shall be responsible for monitoring and reporting RPO obligation and compliance of obligated entities within their jurisdiction and shall function in accordance with the directions of the Commission as may be specified from time to time through separate orders. The State RPO Monitoring Agency/Agencies so designated shall be provided limited access to RPO portal to get information filed by obligated entities with regard to procurement of Renewable Energy/REC.
- 14.4 The Commission may, at any time, by general or special Order, designate any other entity/entities to function as the State RPO Monitoring Agency/Agencies.”

11. Amendment to Regulations 15 of the Principal Regulations.

Regulation 15 of the of the Principal Regulations shall be substituted as under, namely: -

“15. Effect of Default

- 15.1 In the event the Obligated Entities do not fulfil the mandate of the obligation to purchase energy from Renewable Energy Sources as provided in these Regulations during any Financial Year and also do not purchase the certificates from the Power Exchange, the Commission may:
- (i) direct the Obligated Agency to deposit into a Separate Fund, to be maintained by such Obligated Entity, such amount as the Commission may determine as required for purchase of renewable energy certificates (RECs) to the extent of the estimated obligation on the basis

of the shortfall in units of RPO and the average price of the RECs on power exchanges during preceding 6 months, which shall be utilised as may be directed by the Commission, primarily for purchase of RECs and for development of Transmission Infrastructure for evacuation of power from Generating Stations based on Renewable Energy Sources, if after purchase of required RECs, unutilised amount remains in the separate fund:

Provided that the Obligated Entities shall not be authorised to use the fund created in pursuance of Clause (i) above, without prior approval of the Commission;

- (ii) to the extent of the shortfall in the fulfilment of the obligations, the Commission may empower an officer of the State Agency to procure from Power Exchange the required number of Certificates out of amount in the Fund;
- (iii) may direct the nodal agency for short term open access to regulate intra state short term open access of energy other than green energy of the obligated entity as per provisions OF Madhya Pradesh Electricity Regulatory Commission (Terms and Conditions for Intra-State Open access in Madhya Pradesh) Regulations, 2021.

15.2 The Distribution Licensee shall be considered to be in breach of its Licence conditions if it fails to deposit the amount directed by the Commission within 15 days of the communication of the direction.

15.3 Further, where any person though required to comply with these Regulations fails to purchase the required percentage of power from Renewable Energy Sources or the Renewable Energy Certificates, he shall also be liable for penalty as may be decided by the Commission under Section 142 of the Act.

15.4 In case of genuine difficulty in complying with the RPO on account of non-availability of Renewable power or certificates, the obligated entity can approach the Commission to carry forward the compliance requirement to the next year and the Commission will take the appropriate view in the matter on case-to-case basis;

Provided that the Commission while allowing such carry forward of the compliance requirement to the next year after due diligence, may also direct the concerned obligated entity to procure additional renewable energy or RECs equivalent to the amount computed on the monetary value of RPO shortfall at base rate of late payment surcharge (LPS) as prescribed under Late Payment Surcharge Rules notified by Government of India, Ministry of Power, as may be applicable during the year for which RPO was to be complied with by the obligated entity;

Provided further that when carry forward of the RPO compliance is allowed by the Commission, provisions of Regulation 15.1(iii) of these Regulations shall not be applied."

1.1 ये विनियम "मध्यप्रदेश विद्युत नियामक आयोग (मध्यप्रदेश में अन्तर्राज्यिक खुली पहुंच के लिये निबन्धन तथा शर्तों) (पुनरीक्षण प्रथम) पंचम संशोधन विनियम, 2021 {आरजी-24(1)(v), वर्ष 2025}" कहलायेंगे।

1.2 ये विनियम मध्यप्रदेश शासन के "राजपत्र" में इनकी प्रकाशन तिथि से प्रभावशील होंगे।

1.3 इन विनियमों का विस्तार सम्पूर्ण मध्यप्रदेश राज्य में होगा।

FIFTH AMENDMENT TO MADHYA PRADESH ELECTRICITY REGULATORY COMMISSION (TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR INTRA-STATE OPEN ACCESS IN MADHYA PRADESH) REGULATIONS, 2021 (REVISION-I)

1. Short Title and Commencement-

- 1.1. These Regulations shall be called **Madhya Pradesh Electricity Regulatory Commission (Terms and Conditions for Intra-State Open Access in Madhya Pradesh) Regulations, 2021 (Revision-I) (Fifth Amendment) {ARG-24(1)(v) of 2025}**.
- 1.2. These Regulations shall come into force from the date of their publication in the Madhya Pradesh Gazette.
- 1.3. These Regulations shall extend to the whole of the state of Madhya Pradesh.

2. Amendment to Regulations 3 of the Principal Regulations.

A new proviso, namely, 6th proviso shall be inserted after 5th proviso of the sub clause 3.3 of Regulation 3 of the Principal Regulations as under: -

“Provided also that intra state short term open access of energy other than green energy shall not be allowed for transmission and/ or wheeling of electricity to the premises of an obligated entity as defined in Madhya Pradesh Electricity Regulatory Commission (Cogeneration and Generation of Electricity from Renewable Sources of Energy), (Revision-I), Regulations, 2021 as amended from time to time, if the renewable power purchase obligation for previous financial year has not been complied with by the obligated entity subject to the provisions of Regulation 15 of Madhya Pradesh Electricity Regulatory Commission (Cogeneration and Generation of Electricity from Renewable Sources of Energy), (Revision-I), Regulations, 2021 as amended from time to time.”
